It is hoped that this Seventy-fifth Anniversary *Danian* adequately reveals the many events of the Diamond Jubilee Year.

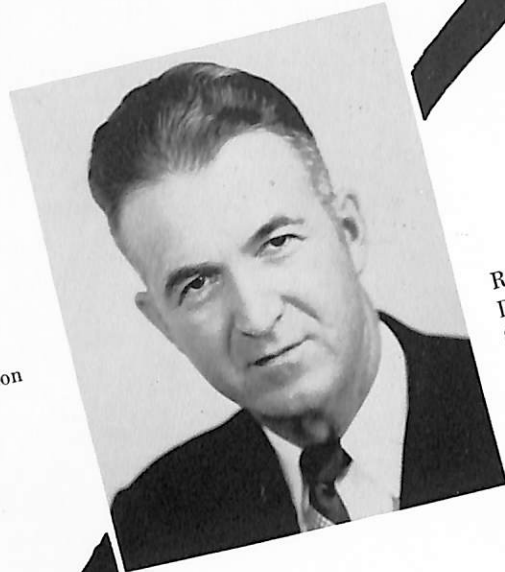

First Game Played on Dana's Field.

1959 marked a milestone in Dana football. For the first time, the Vikings were able to play on a field of their own. This beautiful new field was dedicated and played on for the first time at Homecoming on October 10, 1959.

The 1959 Viking football team, under new head coach Darrell Zimmerman, entered into its second year of competition in the powerful Nebraska College Conference.

With only thirteen returning lettermen to serve as a nucleus, freshmen and transfer students had to fill in the gaps. For the first time in Dana football history, the squad had to be cut for an away game, because of the large number of players. The squad also distinguished itself by having two forward walls equally matched in size and in offensive and defensive prowess.

Although the Vikings were unable to produce a single victory, they did come close several times. Costly mistakes and bad breaks determined many losses. The fighting Vikings received numerous compliments from

opposing coaches, who regarded them as one of the most improved teams in the Conference.

After the season, trophies were presented to four players who had received the highest number of points throughout the season for outstanding offensive and defensive work. Those receiving the honors were Norman Bock, offensive back; Tom Leehy, defensive back; Addison Adkins, offensive lineman; and Emory Anderson, defensive lineman.

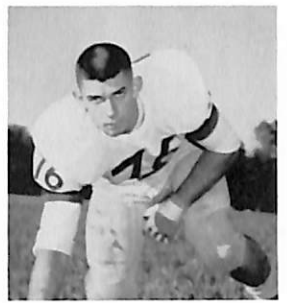

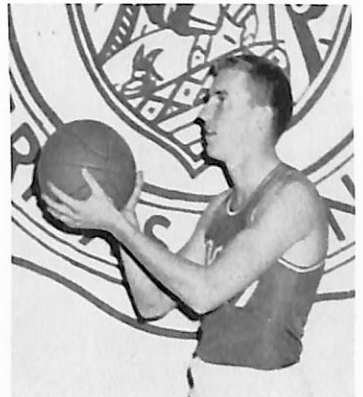

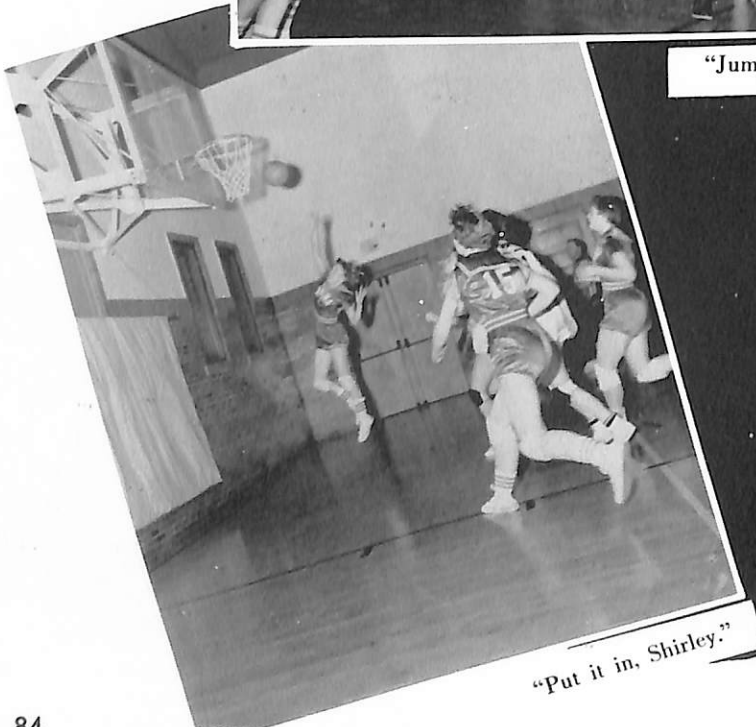

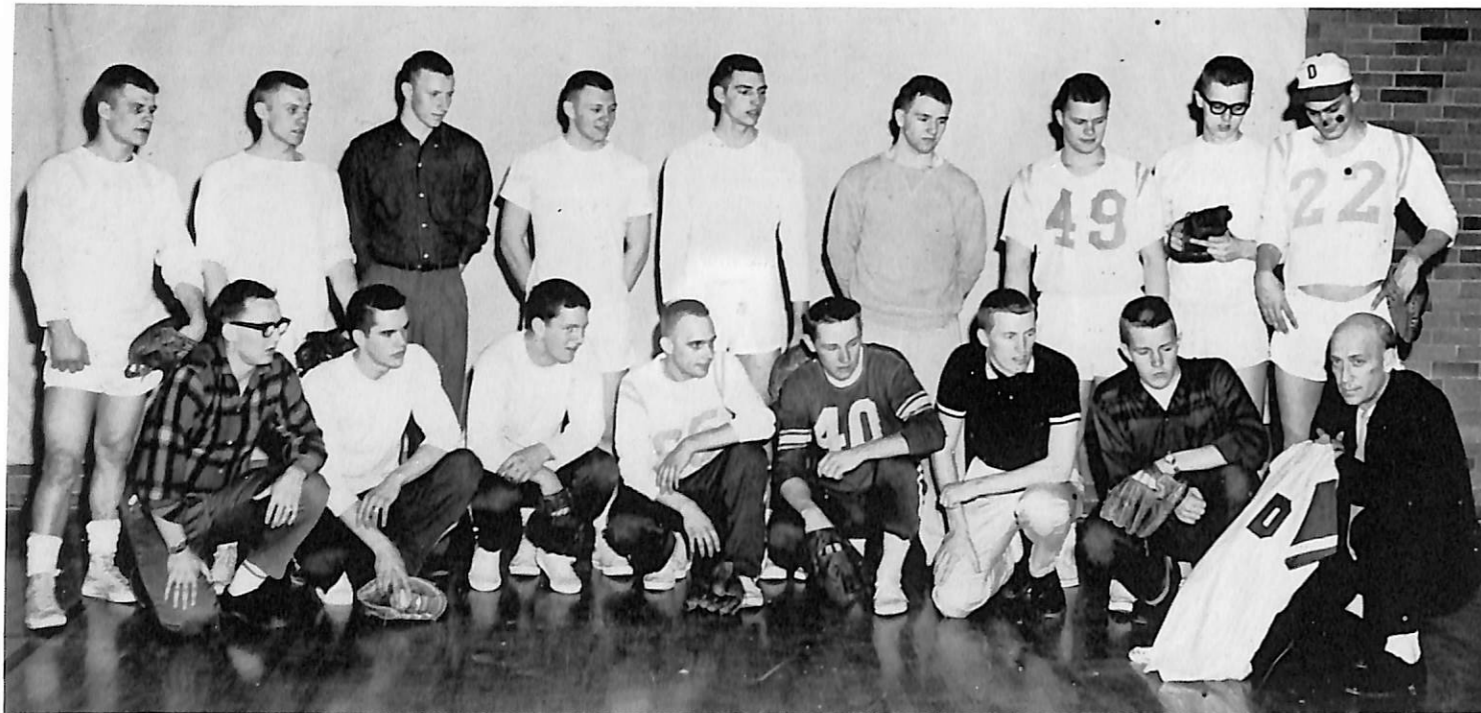
According to early season reports and workouts,

Several good freshmen enlighten the squad, especially in the pitching department; this year we have quantity and quality.

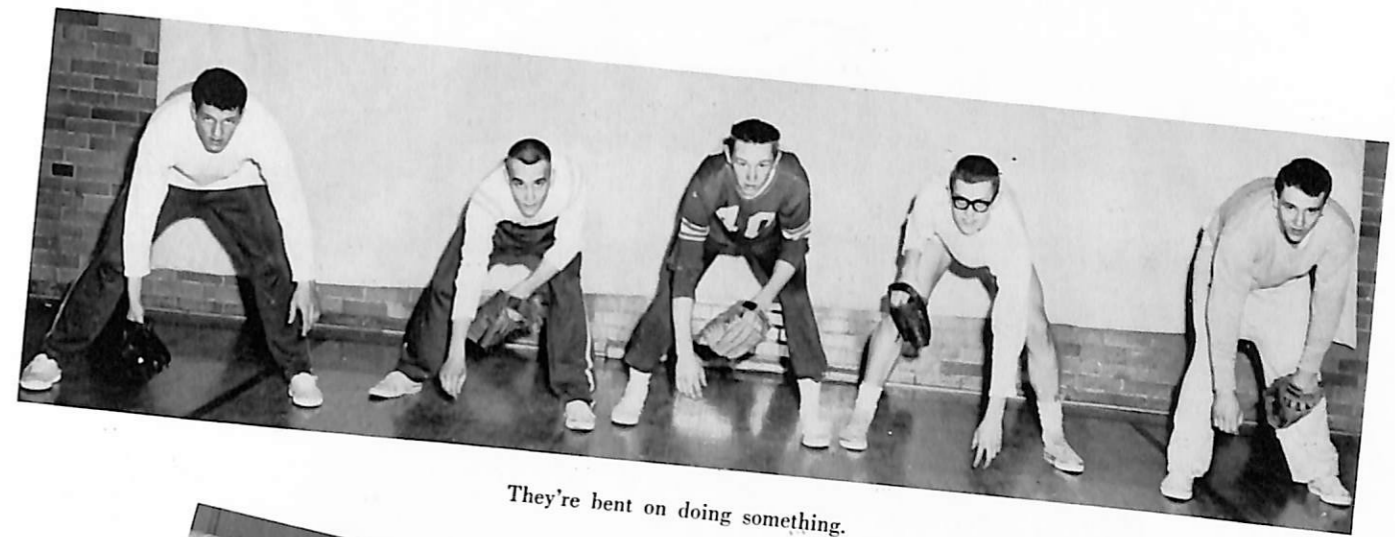
