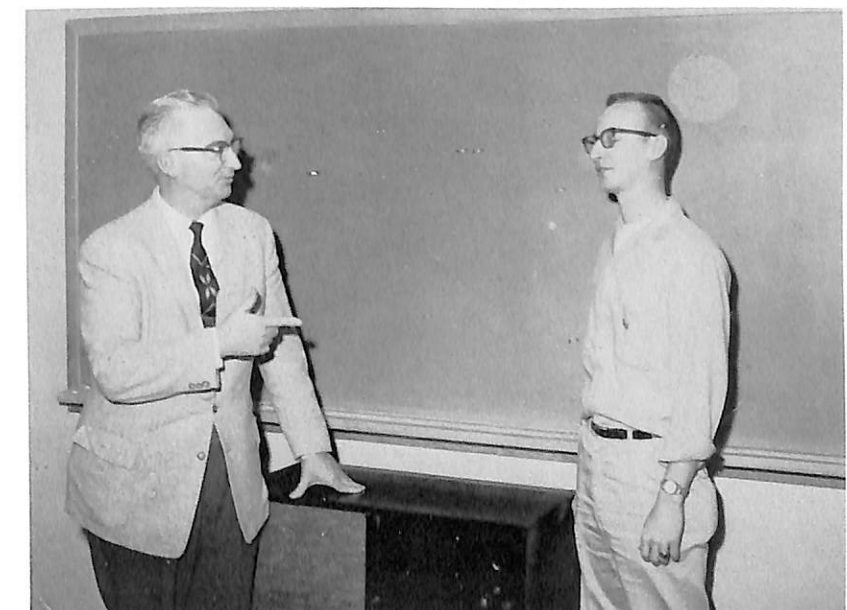

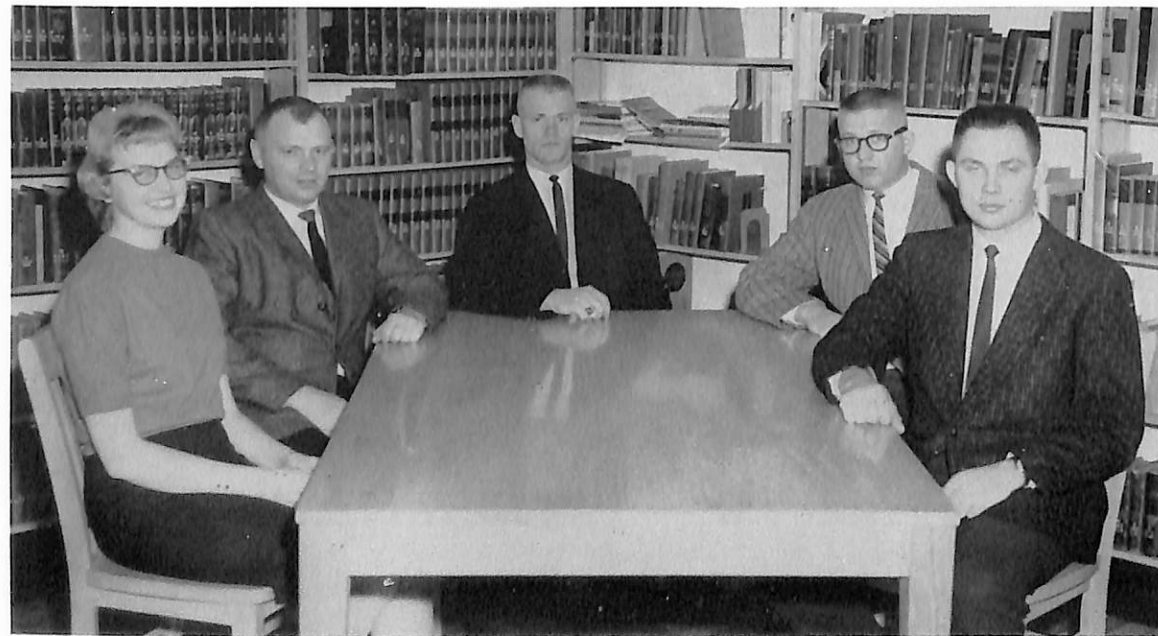

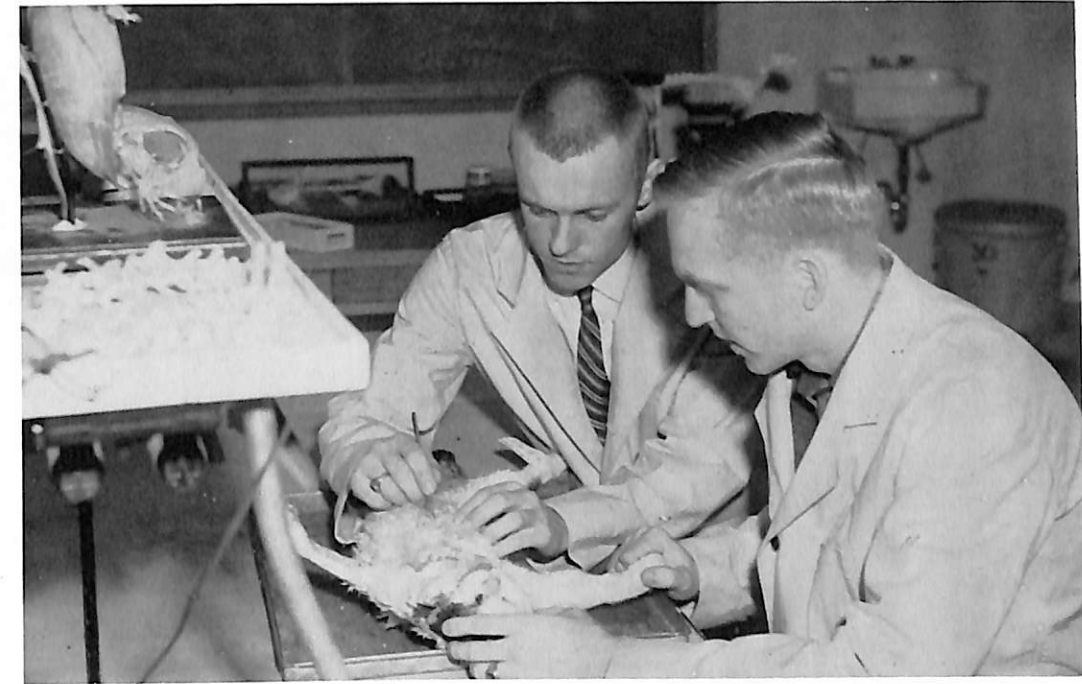

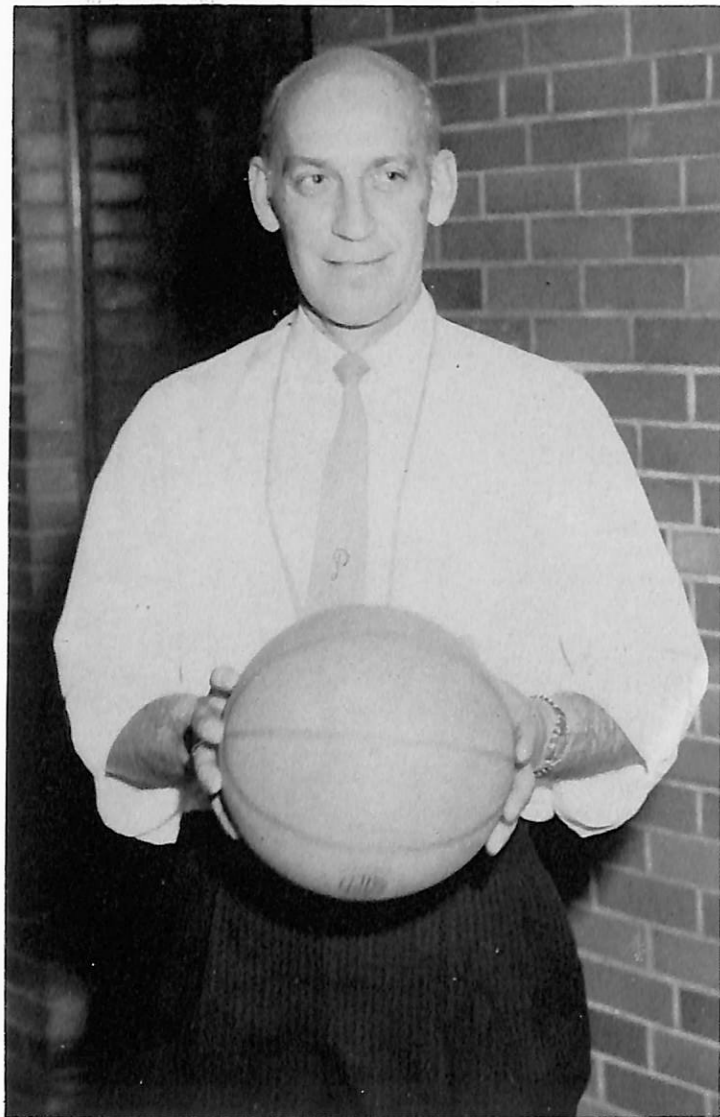
The Tri-State Cross Country Conference Championship was held at Dana College October 28, 1960. Dana brought home the conference trophy with a total of twenty-five points.

Rarely does a man come along of Paul Peterson's caliber, and even less rarely is a school benefited by having a person such as Pete for guidance and counsel.

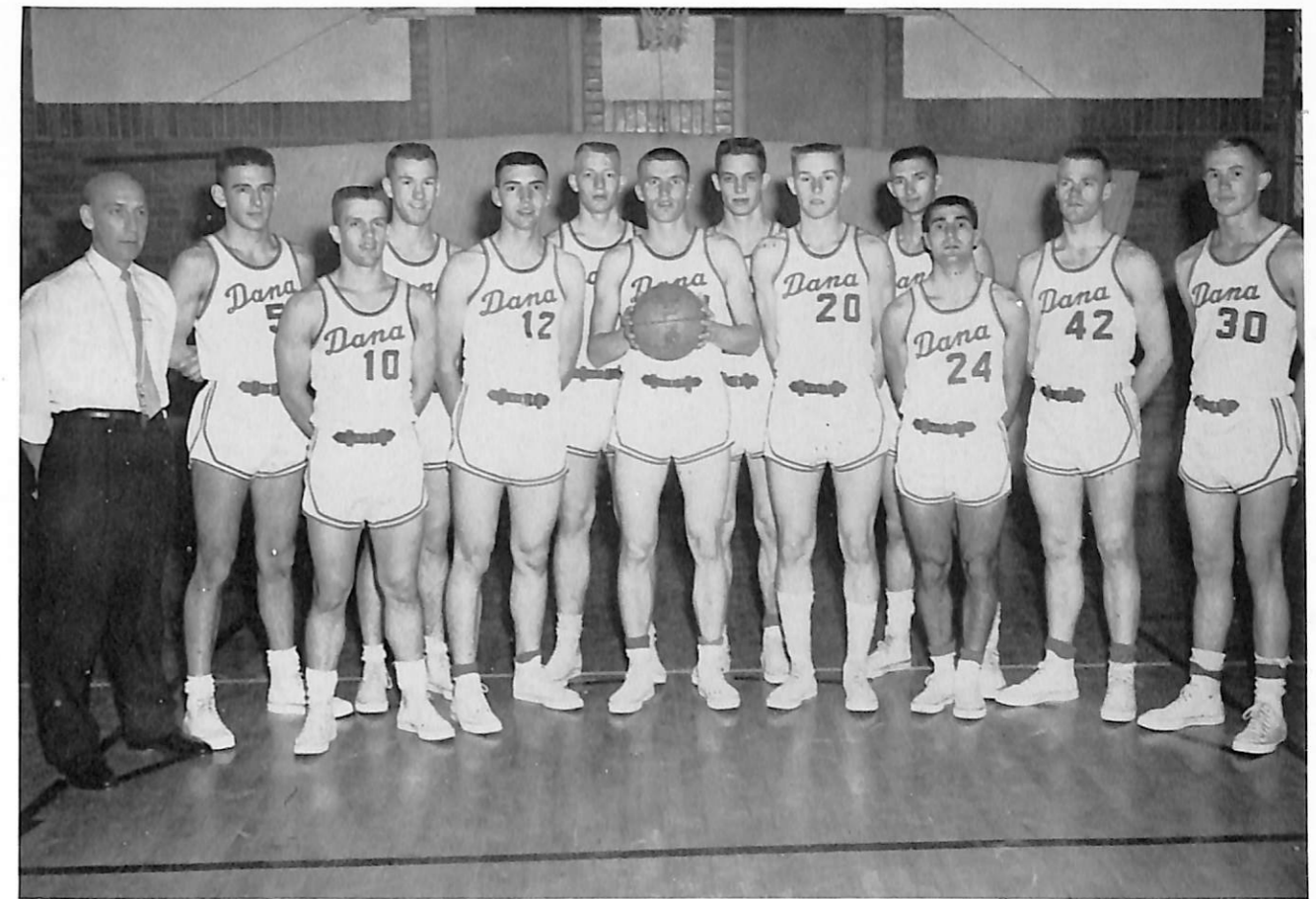

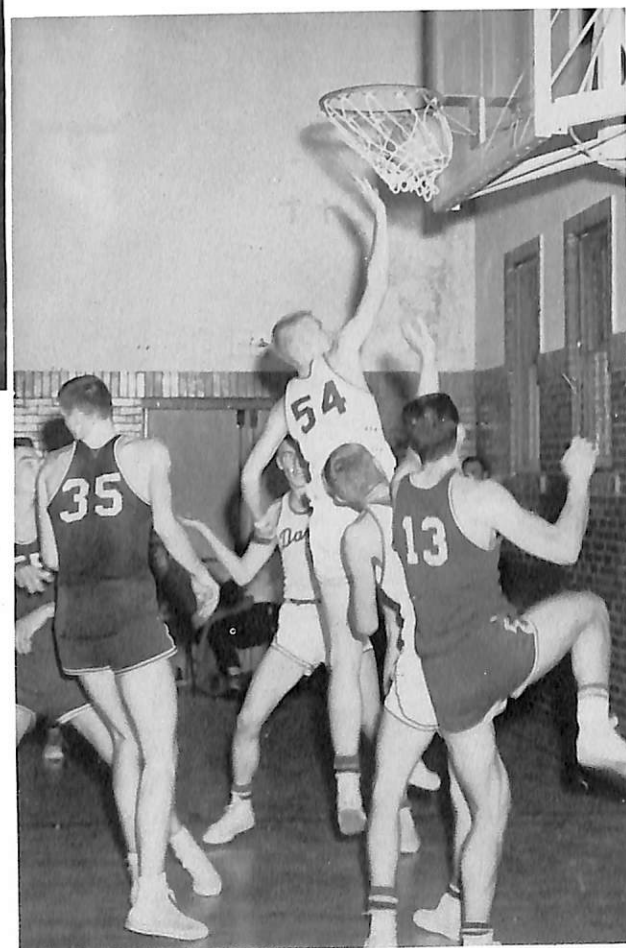

B-TEAM BASKETBALL

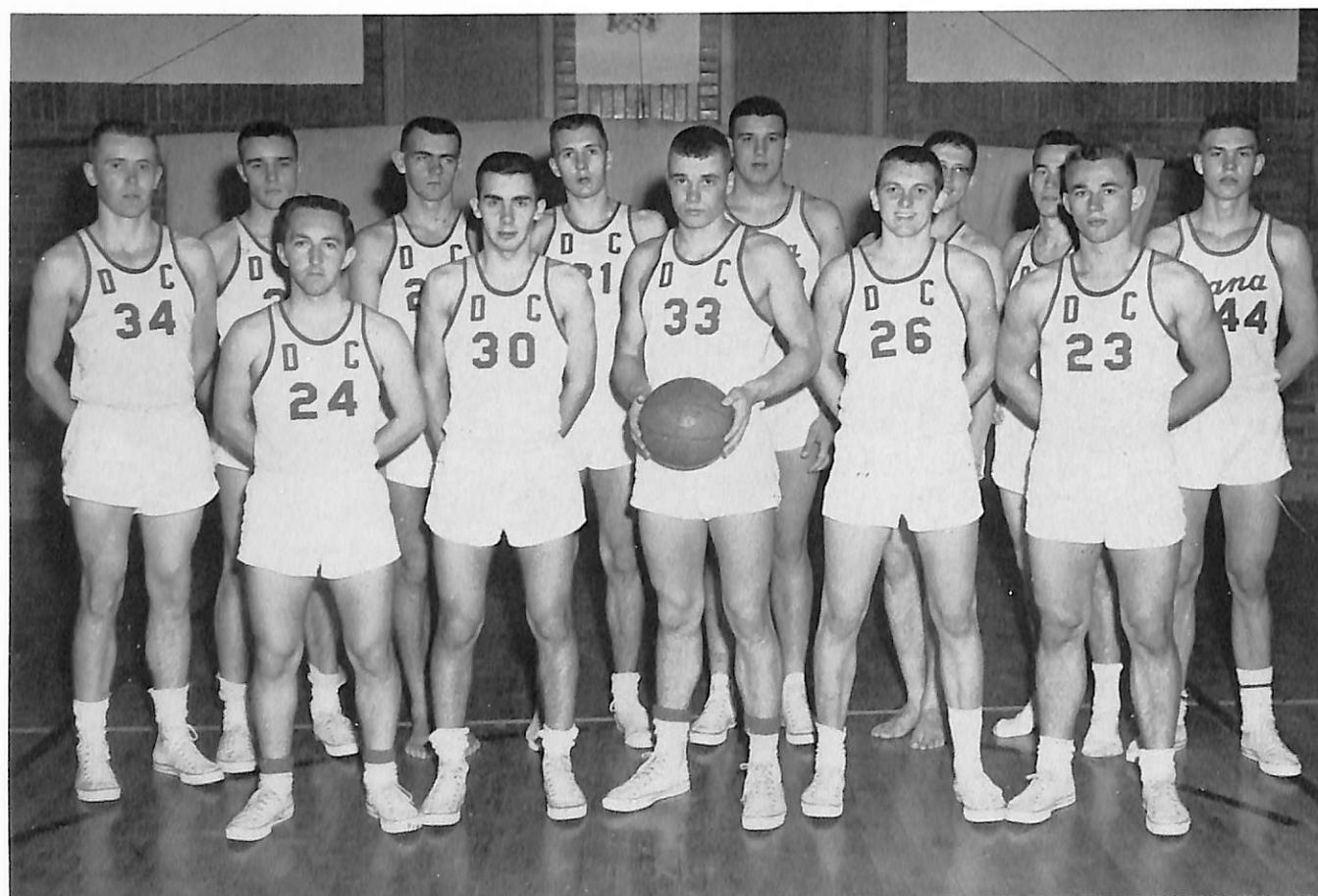
The B-squad of Dana completed one of the most successful seasons in many years. Out of ten games, the Viking five lost only three; two of these by one and two point margins.

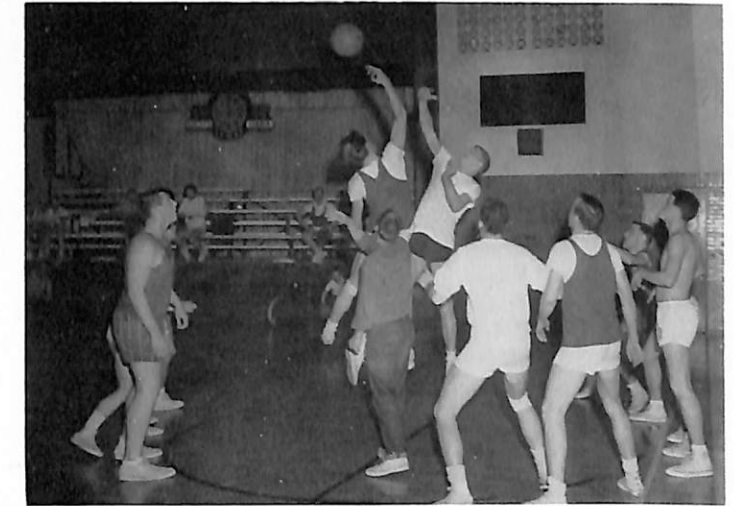

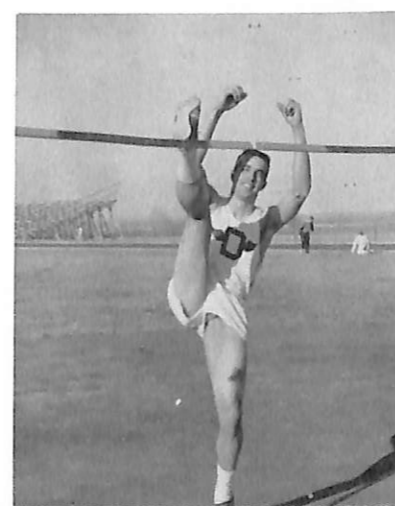

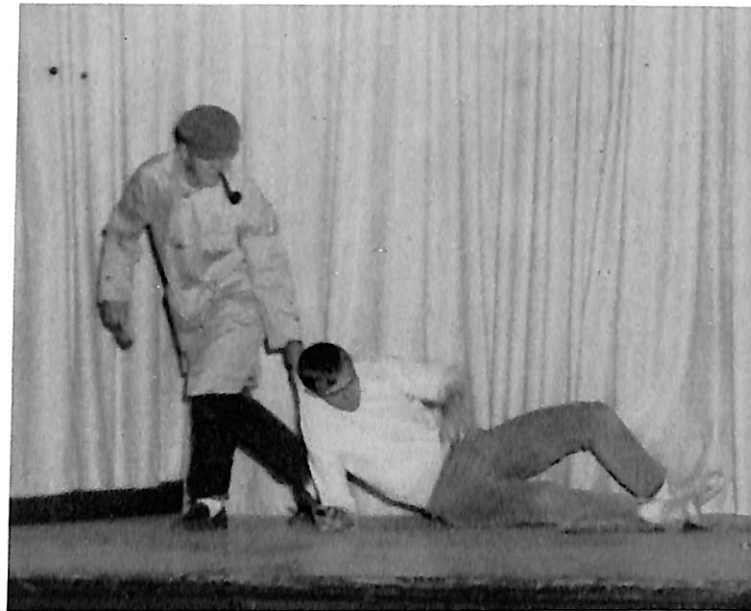
