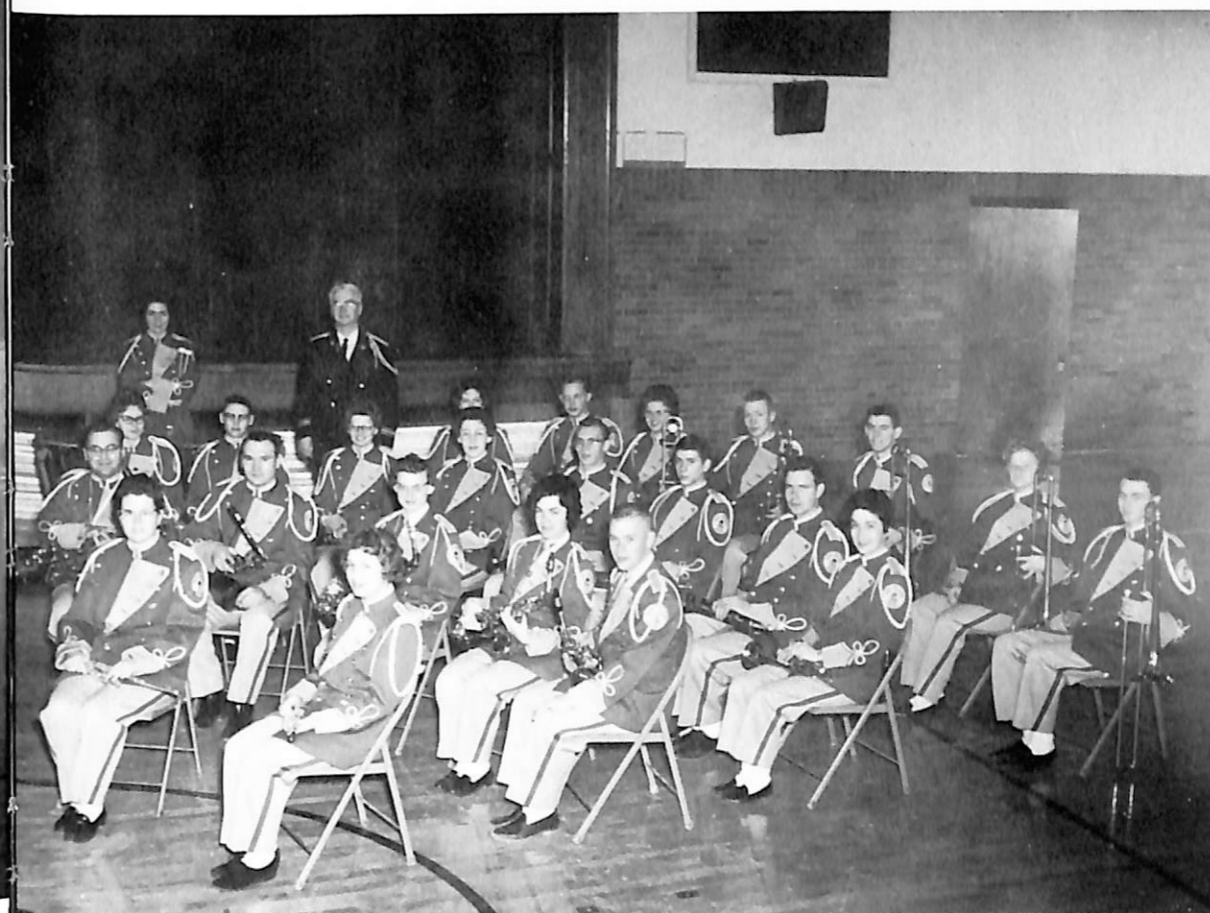


Professor Neve has seen many parts of the United States with the choir. Last summer Professor Neve took the choir to Denmark, where they made over thirty appearances.

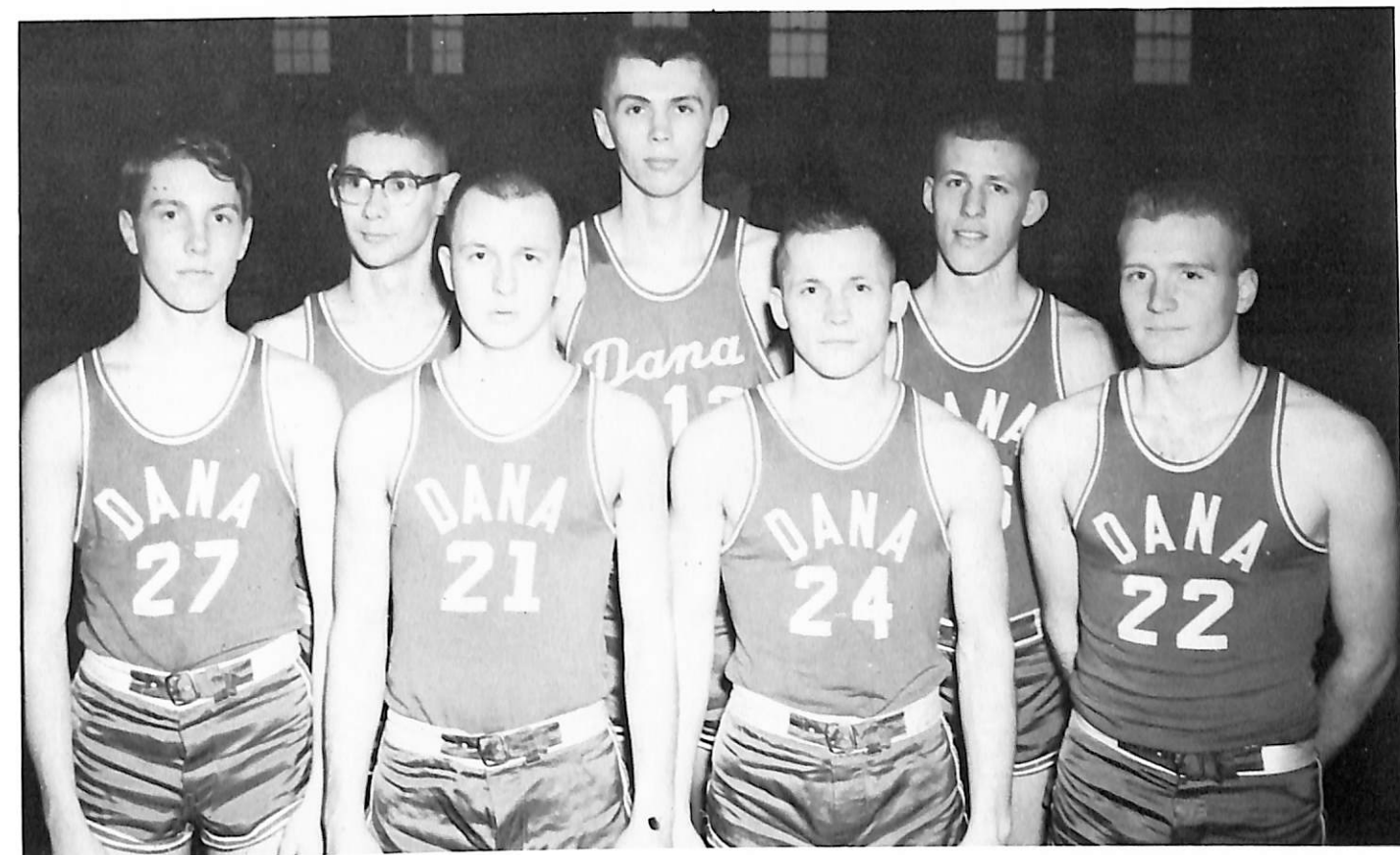

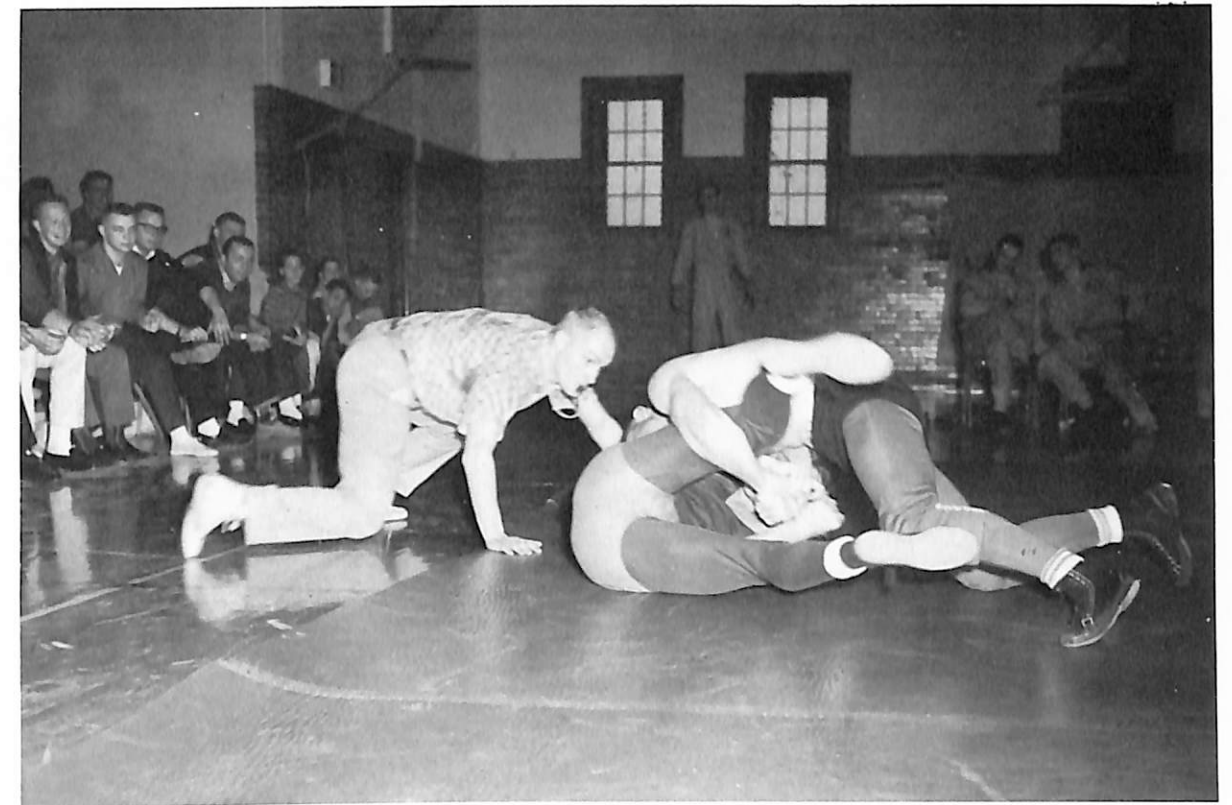

Three wrestlers were undefeated this season: Roger Howland, Herb Knudson, and Lowell Larson.

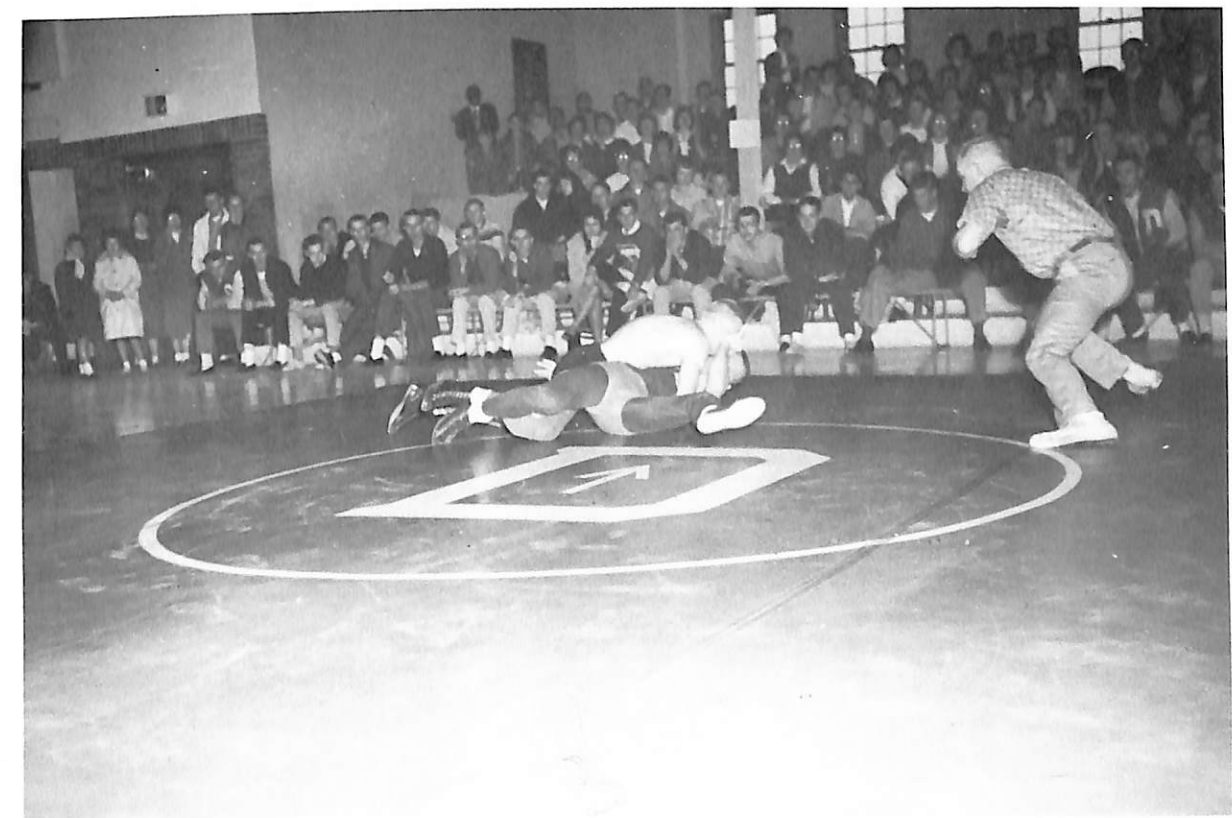

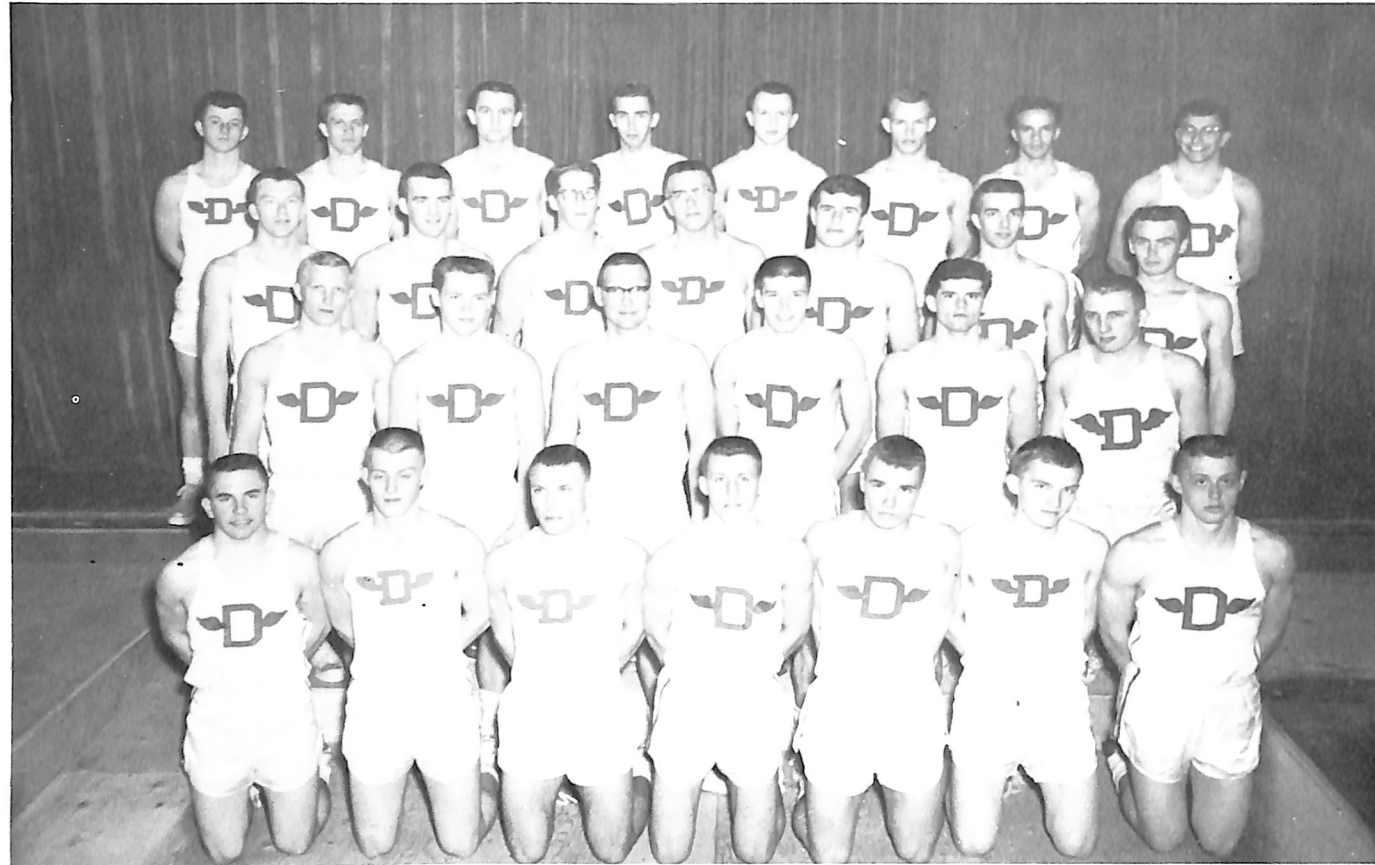

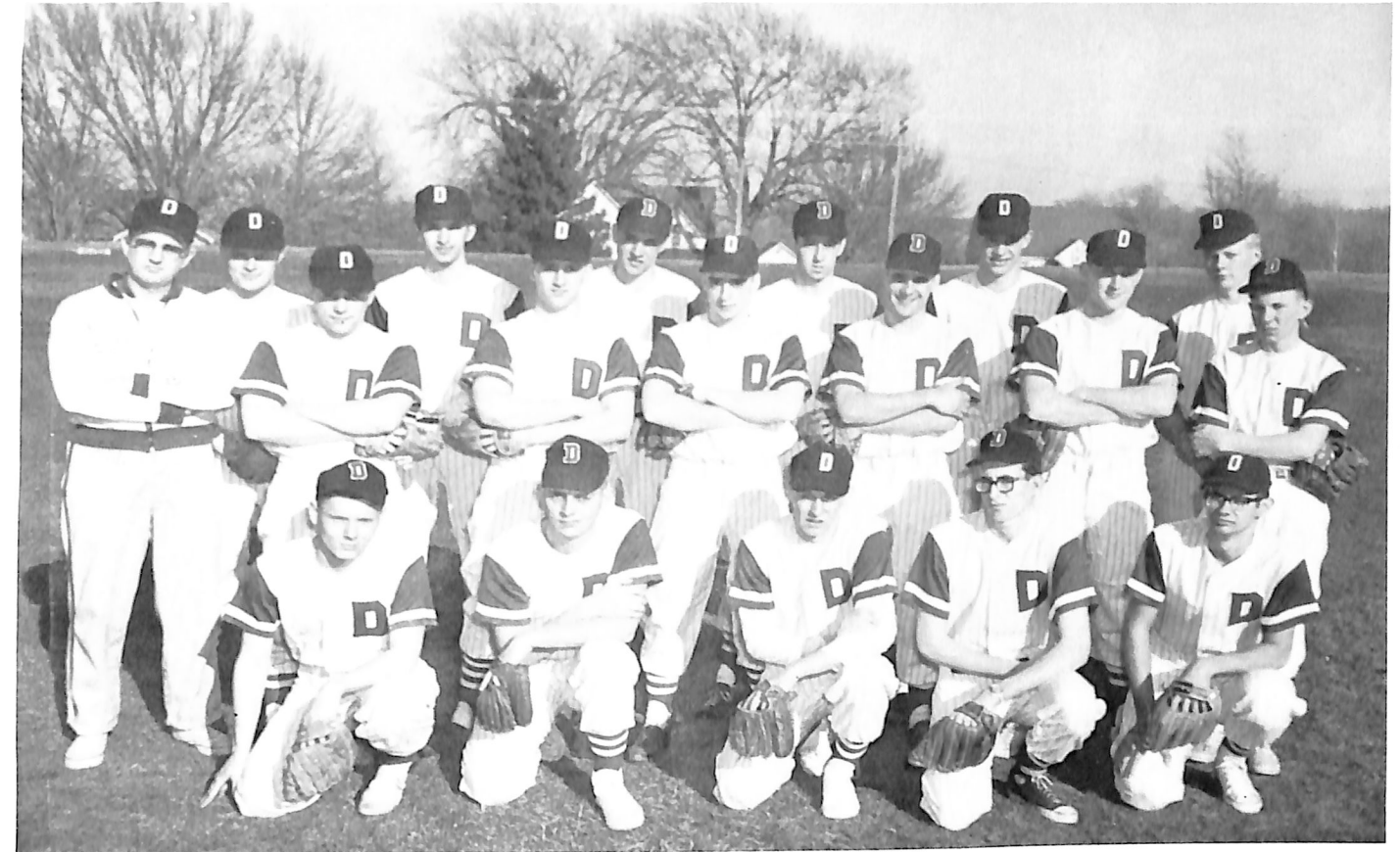

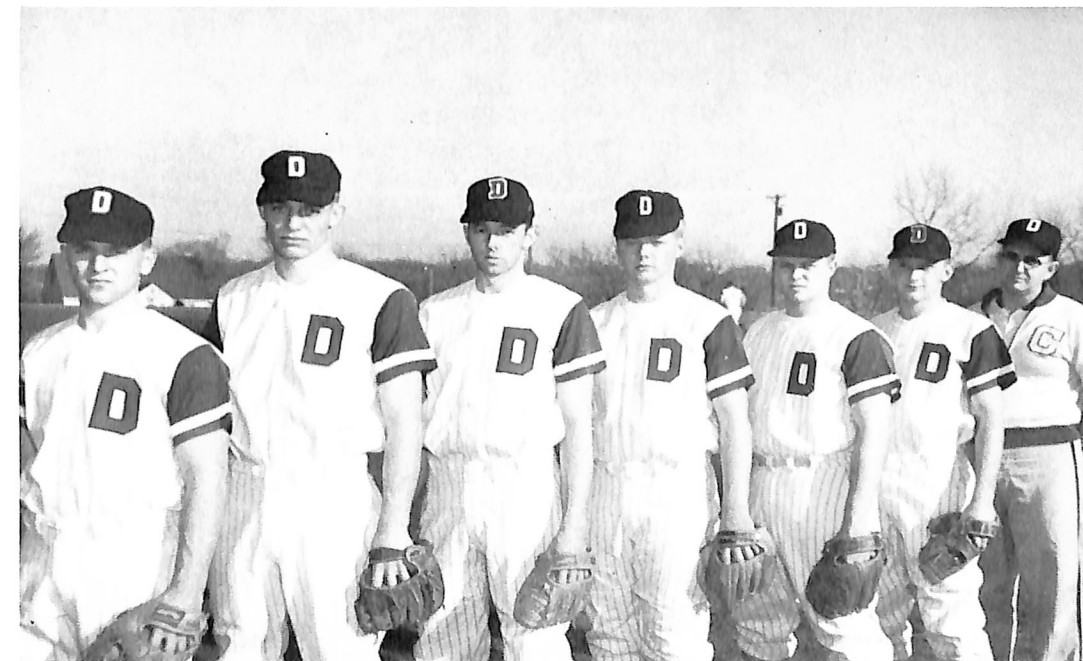

December 9, 1961, will long be remembered by the Tanganyikans as the day in which independence came to their country. It was also a special day for us here at Dana to share in the joy and celebration with Ned Kitomari, Elimweka Mshiu, and John Lawuo of this great event. A very stimulating and interesting evening was presented by the students from Tanganyika and their friends. 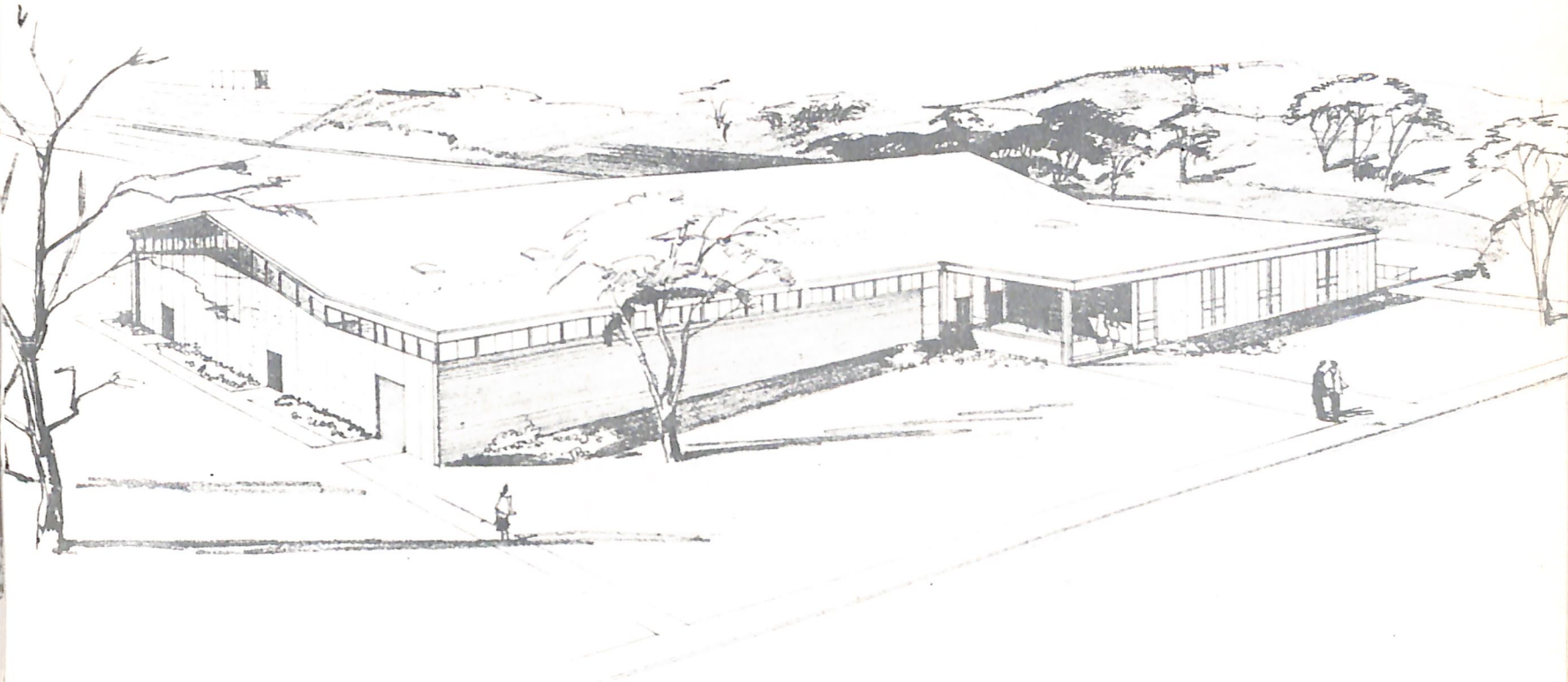

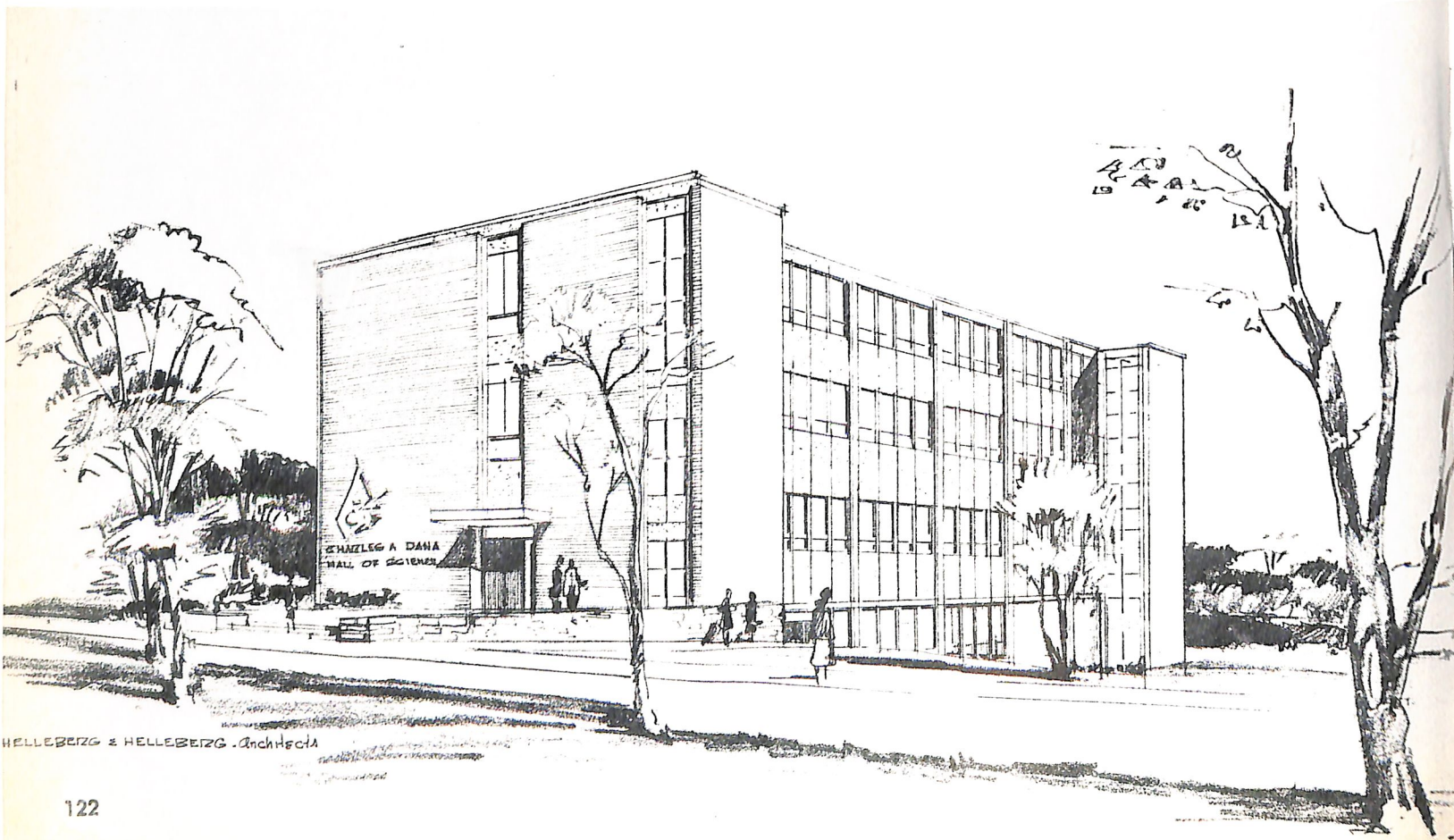
Groundbreaking ceremonies were held for the Charles A. Dana Hall of Science on November 8, 1961.
