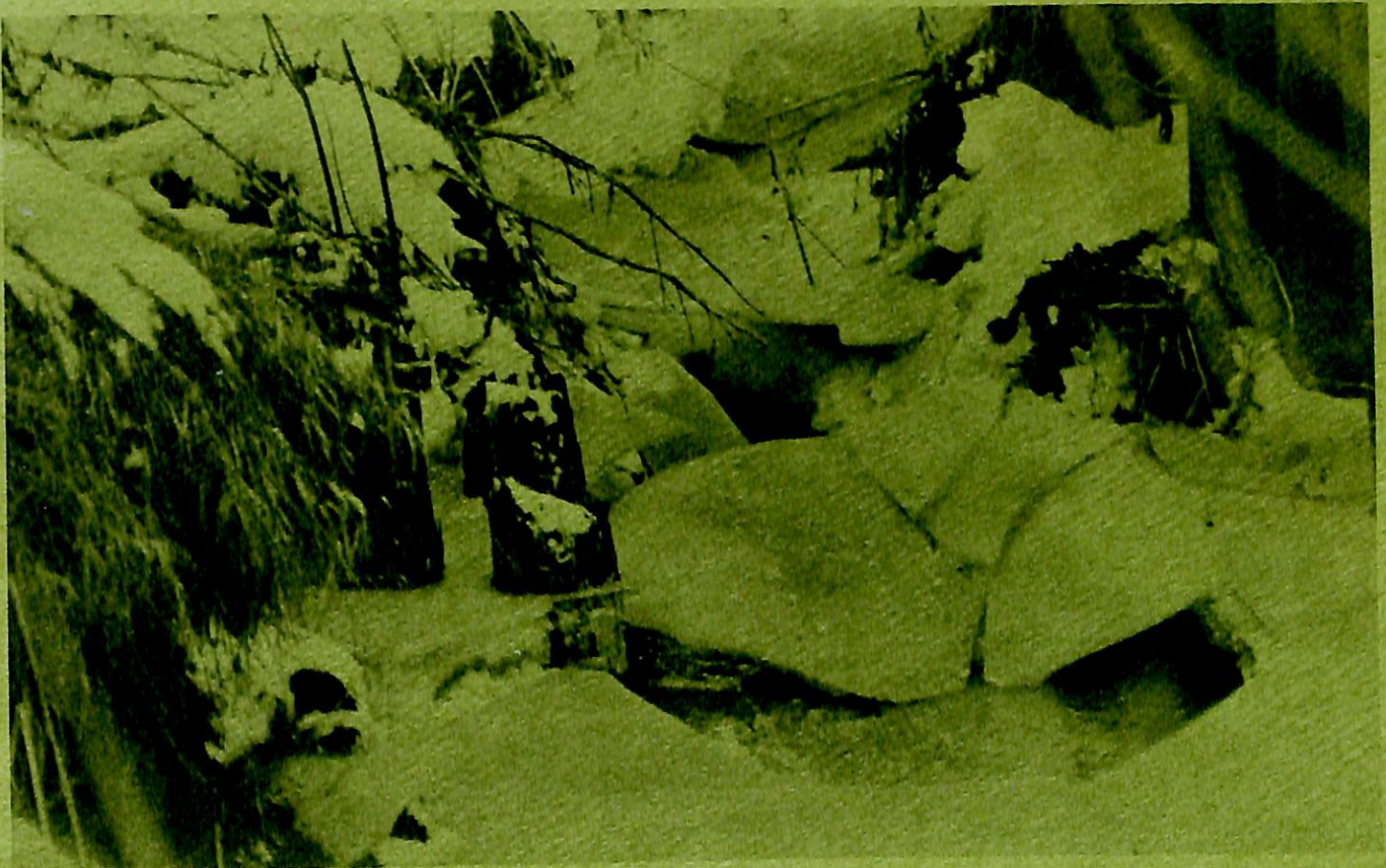

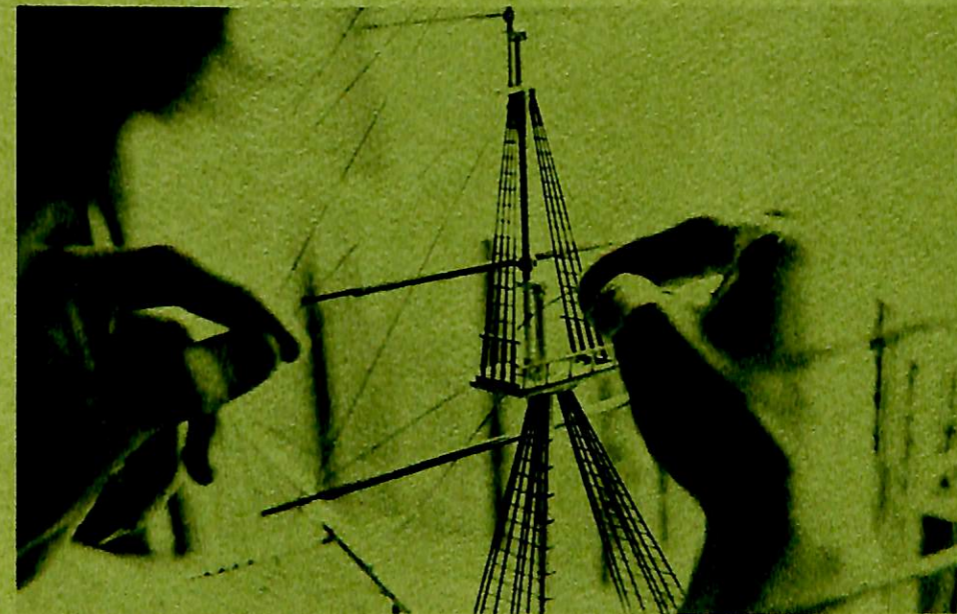

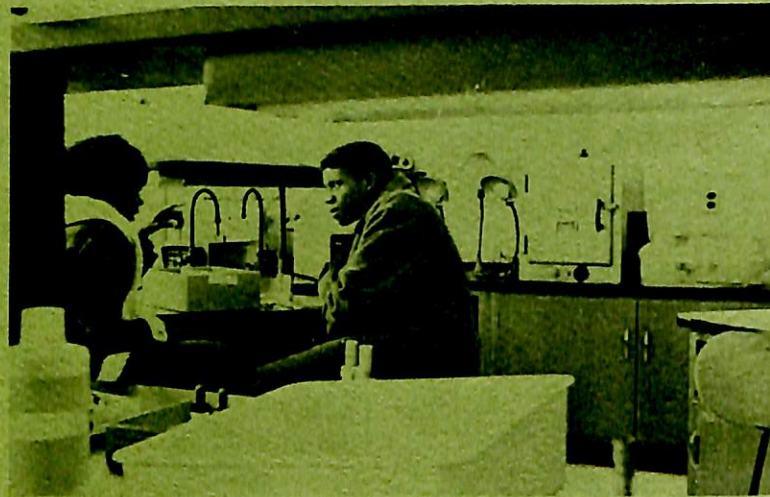
A Time to Share

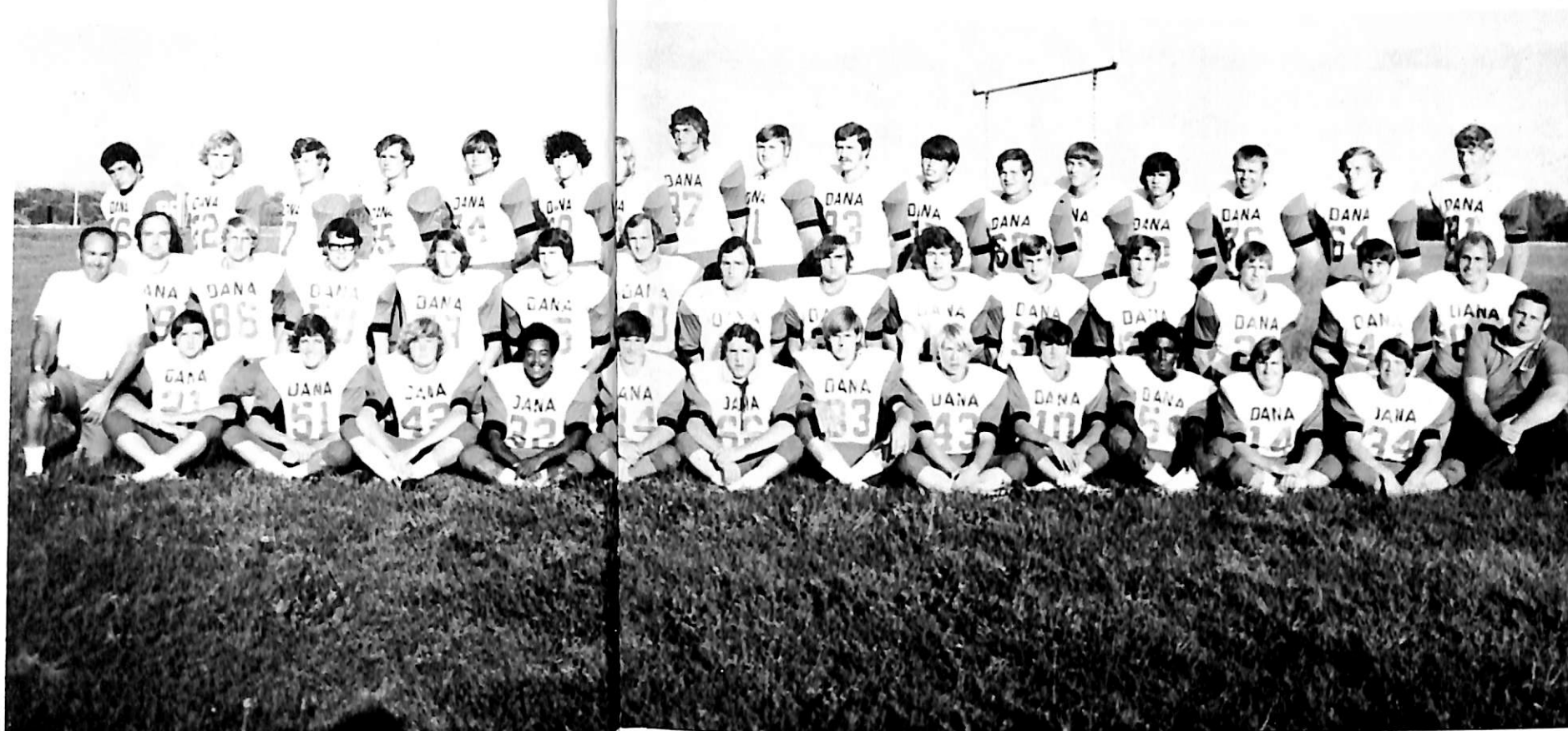


Viking Football

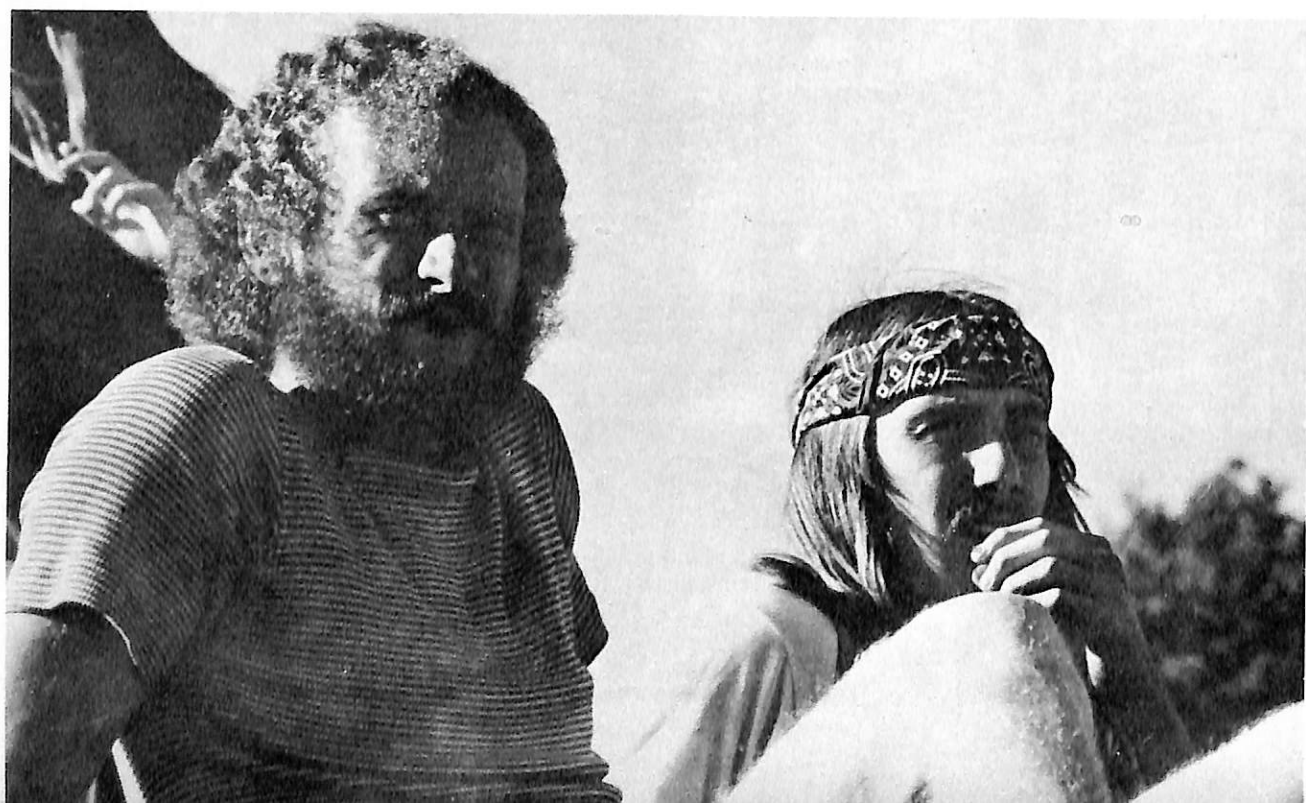

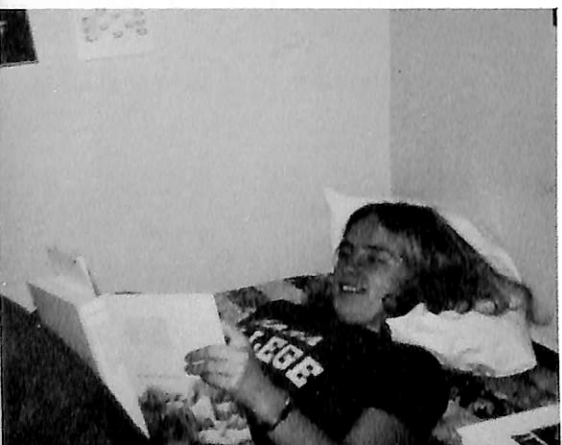
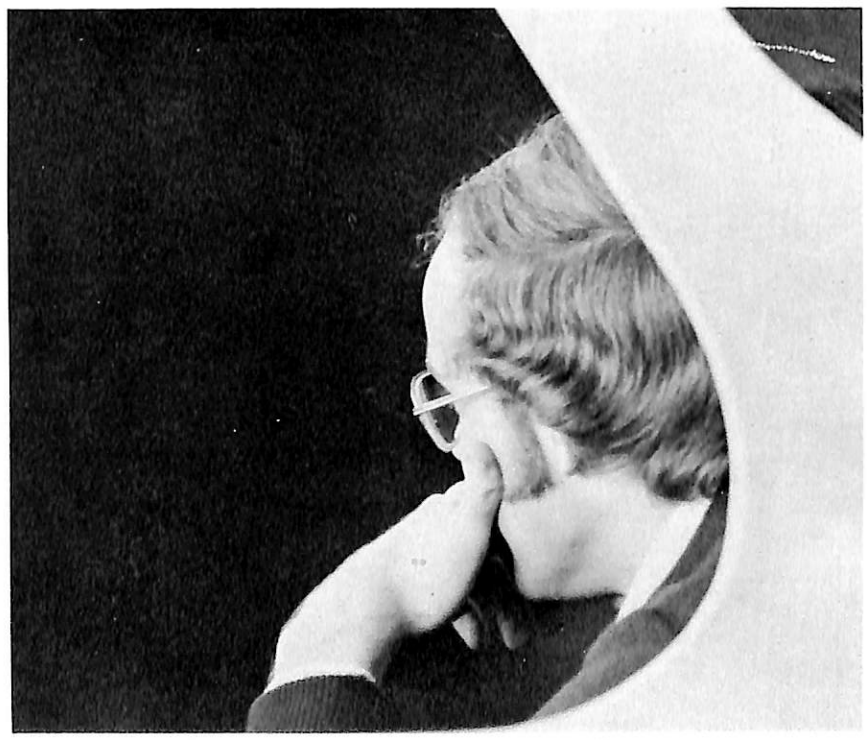
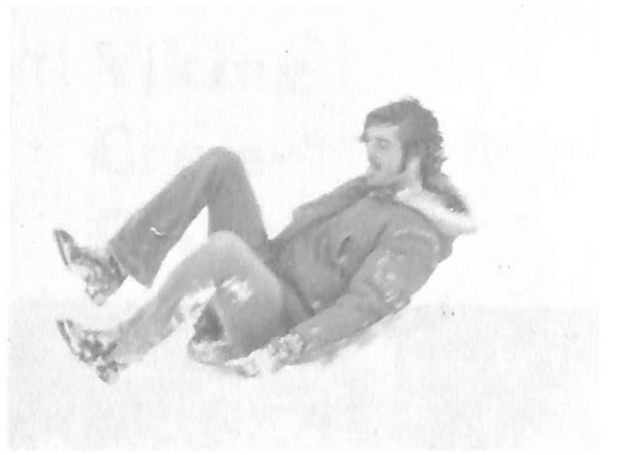
Viking Wrestling

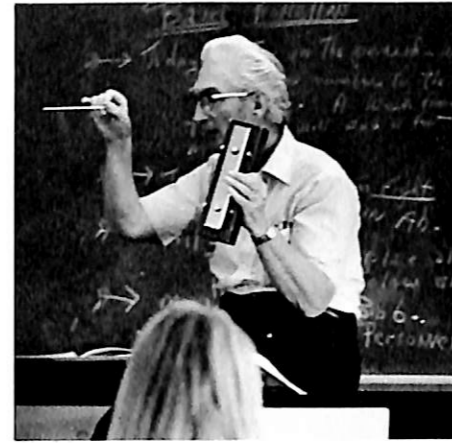


Dana College Band

Out of your own European background, out of the wisdom of the American Indians you know so well, out of your love for the land and for the great river that flows just below our hills at Blair you have taught us through many years.

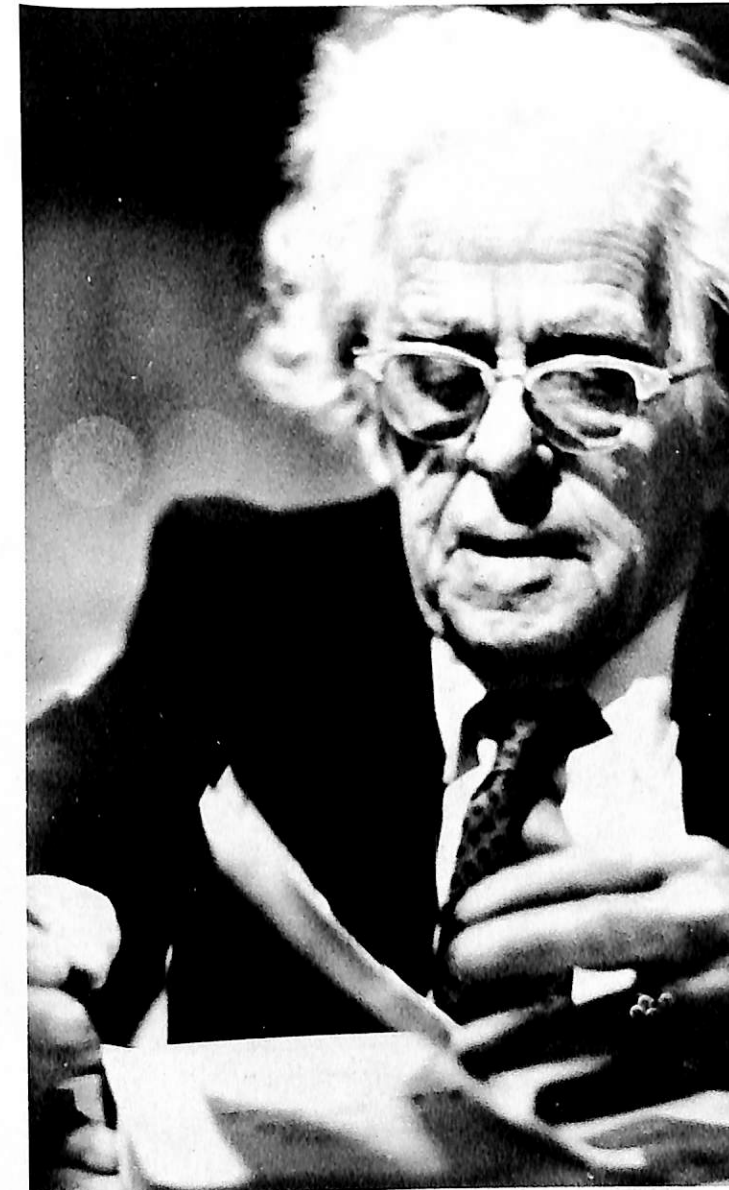
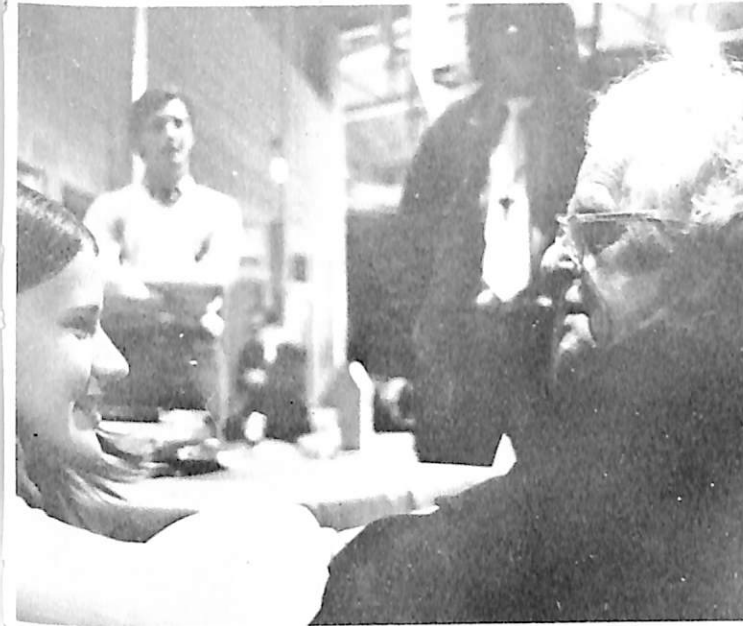

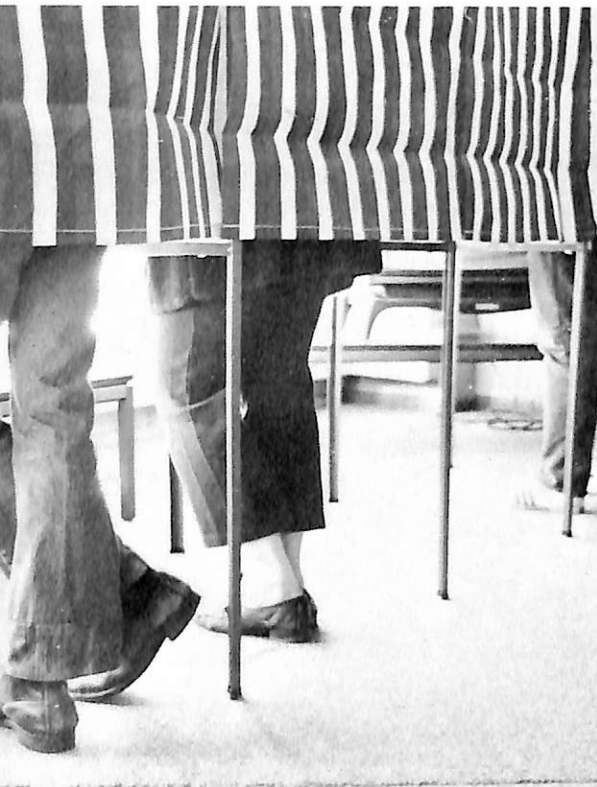

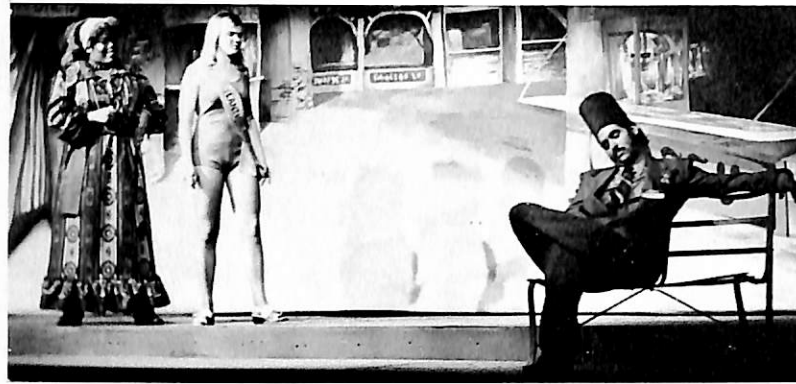
Interim '73

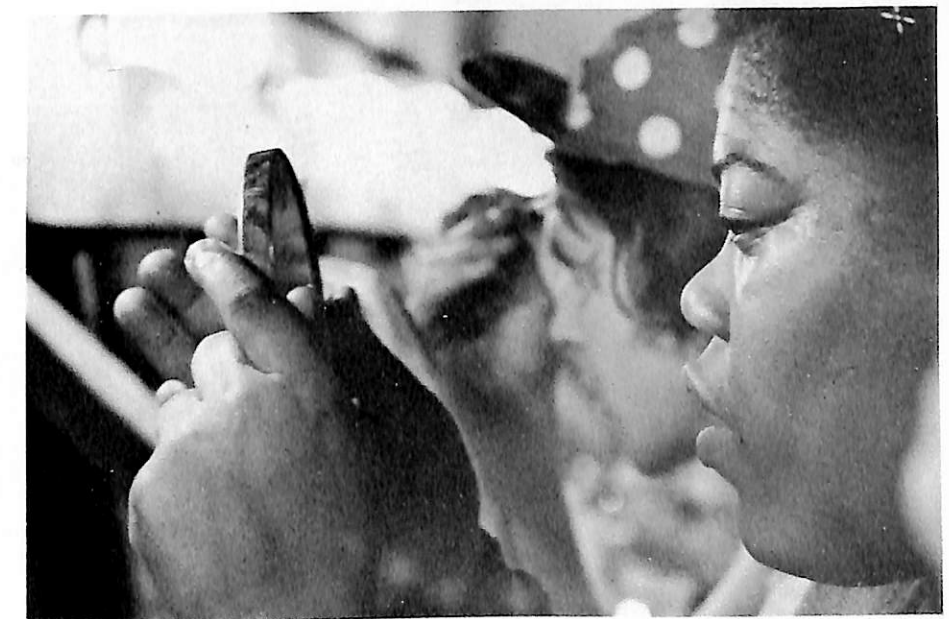
The Skin of Our Teeth
