Viking Football




Viking Basketball






























Gymnastics

None more in the world than a bird and none less than the sun;



















A Streetcar Named Desire

THE SKIN OF OUR TEETH and A STREETCAR NAMED DESIRE, performed during the first week of February, were the result of a special theatre interim.

Thornton Wilder's THE SKIN OF OUR TEETH was a production involving man's progress in the last 5,000 years—frmo the ice age, through the Flood, and through war. His message of unfailing faith in humanity prevails. Utilizing a highly complex dramatic structure and breaking theatrical traditions at will, this play brings all creation into its compass while it takes as its points of departure a small town in New Jersey.

A STREETCAR NAMED DESIRE, written by Tennessee Williams was an intense character drama set in the squalid, heat-oppressed tenement in New Orleans. The play vividly portrays brutally naturalistic characters stripped raw in theatrical psychoanalysis.


