The Sights And Sounds Of Christmas





The happy faces of graduation

On Sunday, May 18 the 1979-80 Academic Year came to a close with the Commencement Ceremonies.

Sunday morning the festive Baccalaureate Service was held in Borup Coliseum for the graduates and their families, and in the afternoon the beautifully decorated Borup Coliseum was filled to overflowing for Commencement. President James Kallas extended his greetings to all visitors, and expressed his appreciation to the graduates for having spent four important years of their lives at Dana. Dr. Kallas then presented the Valedictorian, or rather the *three* Valedictorians.

After four years of college JoAnne Roberts, Carol Weckmuller, and Jerry Schmidt were so close in their cumulative averages that it was impossible to name one Valedictorian. In her address JoAnne Roberts said that graduation was both a beginning and an end. She said it was time for the graduates to "launch our own little barks," but also that Dana would follow her wherever she goes in life. Jerry Schmidt stressed that at Dana students learn to think for themselves. Facts are part of the education, but they do not hang suspended in the air without relation to real life. Carol Weckmuller stressed the diversity of a Dana education. We are not specialists, but learn about both Buddhism and the energy of the cell.

After the Valedictorian address the 1980 College Community Award was presented to Ralph Steier for his long time work to make Blair a green and pleasant town.



Two honorary degrees were conferred at the Commencement. One was given to Marshall Fredericks, internationally known sculptor, who is also known for his work for disabled and blind people. Fredericks has been honored in twentyone nations around the world, but Dana is the first educational institution to honor Fredericks with an honorary degree.

The other honorary degree was given to Robert S. Jacobsen of Luther College for his many years of service to Christian Higher Education.

The Commencement Address was presented by Dr. David Preus, President of the American Lutheran Church. Dr. Preus instructed the graduates to go out in life and make a statement of life. He told them to always look ahead and never settle for the past or the present, but always pursue new goals.

Finally, the Class of 1980 was presented, and 84 seniors were graduated. Eighteen students were graduated with a Bachelor of Arts degree, and sixty-six with a Bachelor of Science degree. Ten students were graduated cum laude, and thirteen won magna cum laude honors. The ceremony closed with "Hail Dana", and the recessional.

Ron Johnson had taken over the responsibility of Head Coach, and for the first game the students rented busses to follow the team to Northwest Missouri State University. The game quickly brought players and fans back to reality, and the Vikings limped away after a sound thrashing with a 44-0 defeat.

After the first game there were several ups and downs in the season. During the homecoming game against Nebraska Wesleyan Dana started well with a record setting 98 yard punt return by Scott Peterson, but eventually the game was lost. Dana was soundly beaten by Doane, Concordia, and Midland, but posted an impressive win over Hastings in a tough game.

In spite of the losses a new spirit was implanted in the players, and it was obvious they were "110 percenters." The players gave all they had, and as soon as the season was over a program was started to make the players stronger for the next season. With strong recruiting Dana could become a football power, because the enthusiasm is certainly there.

























During the 1978-79 wrestling season sophomore Virgil Watson was the first Dana College wrestler ever to achieve All-American honors.





The 1979-80 Viking basketball team was not the most winning team in Dana history, but according to Coach Paul Peterson this year's squad is "the finest ever to play for Dana College." The Vikings finished the season with an 18-10 record and a second place finish in the Nebraska Intercollegiate Athletic Conference. The Vikings NIAC finish was their best ever in the conference's ten year history. They lost out, however, in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics district play-off to Doane College 65-64, to bring the season to a fast close. The Vikings generated much excitement on the Dana campus, and they never let their enthusiastic and ever-growing crowd down. The team finished with an incredible 11-0 home record, and the highlight of the season was a 95-81 win over NIAC champion Hastings before a sell-out crowd in Borup Coliseum

Gary Cissell finished his career at Dana in the best possible way. His shooting average of 63.48% ranked third nationally. Gary was the leading scorer in the NAIA with 609 points to bring his career total to 1798 points. He averaged 21.75 points per game in this season, and 17.5 for career. Gary hit 737 field goals in four years, and had 950 rebounds. Five seniors played a big role in the highly successful season. Gary Cissell, Dick Johnson, Mike Anderson, Steve Laune, and Kevin Rasmussen all made great contributions to the team, and will be remembered for their dedication and leadership on Dana.










Throughout the season the Vikings played tough defense, and often quick steals turned Dana into a run and gun unit.


Coach Of The Year

It was never boring to watch Coach Peterson on the bench, and on these pages we have tried to capture some of the many faces of "The Grand OI' Man" of Dana athletics.




Women's Basketball: "A Successful Season"


Tough Season



Baseball: Dana Wins NAIA And NIAC

Dana College ended the 1980 baseball season with a 24-20 record. This does not sound like the most outstanding record, but at a closer look it contains a very good season. After the April trip to Oklahoma Dana was 1-13, but they won 23 of 30 after that. Dana won a share of the NIAC championship, and won a first-ever district (NAIA) championship. Dana went to Jamestown, North Dakota, for the area (NAIA) play-off, but came out with two losses.


The Vikings started a very young team with ten freshmen and five sophomores on a 21-man squad. However, the young players came through, and the Dana team ended the season with a .292 average for the entire season. Individual batting leaders were Mitch Lane with .415, Dale DeBuhr with .392, and Scott Petersen with .339. DeBuhr ended the regular season with a state leading .418, but he dropped below .400 when going hitless in

two games in North Dakota.

Gary Fauskee led the Dana pitchers with a 7-3 record, and he was selected to the NIAC and NAIA all-star teams. Freshman Tim Johnson finished with the lowest earned run average, a 4.17 in a 4-4 campaign. Jerry Smith was 4-4, and Scott Simms was 6-6.

Randy Rosenthal led the Vikings with 7 home runs, and a second best 25 RBIs. Don Savino had a record 95 putouts, and was an excellent outfielder all year, in addition to hitting .326. Freshman Bob Dudley won the starting job as a catcher, and he set a record with five assists in a single game.

Coach Dale Lemon reached a milestone of 300 wins when Dana swept a pair from Nebraska Wesleyan. The Vikings graduated only three players, so they could be very strong the next couple of years.











Track and Field.
