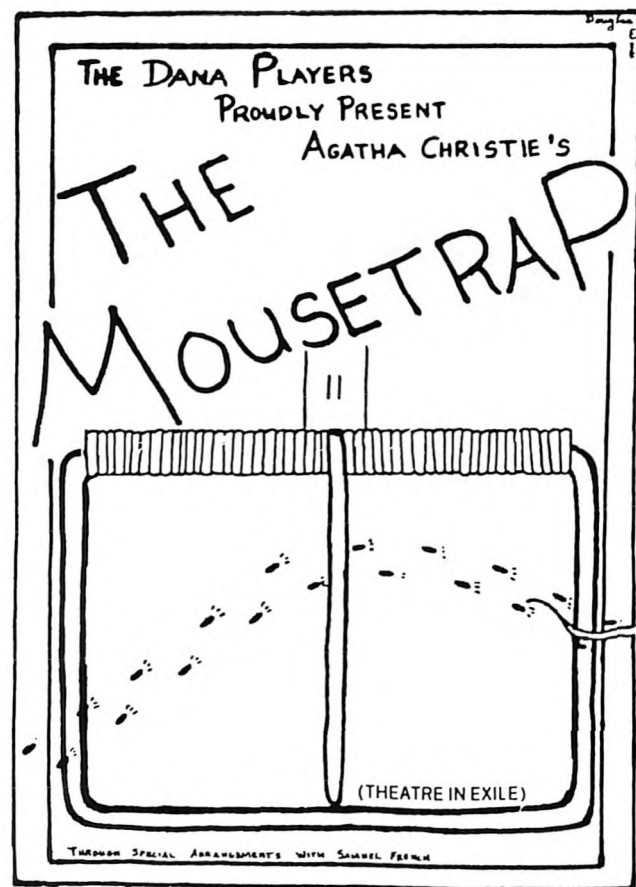

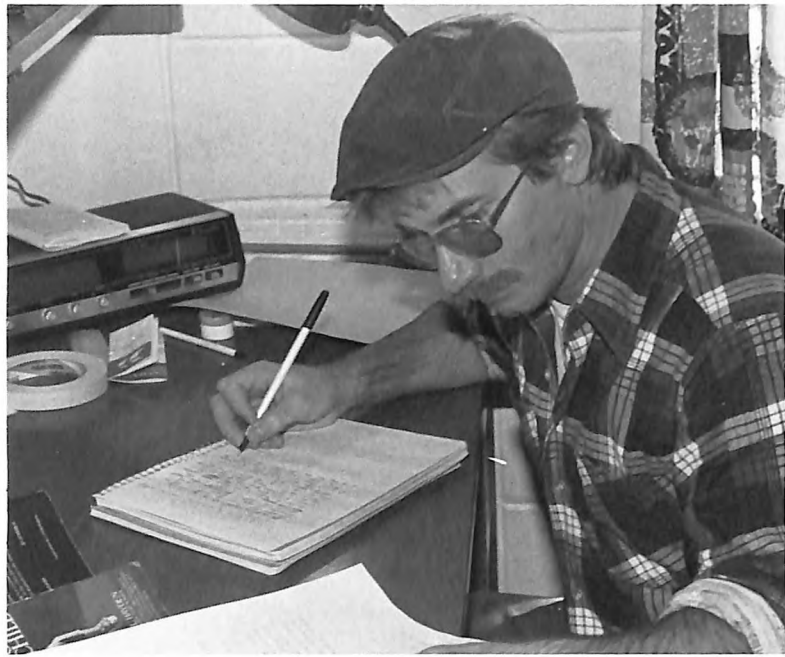

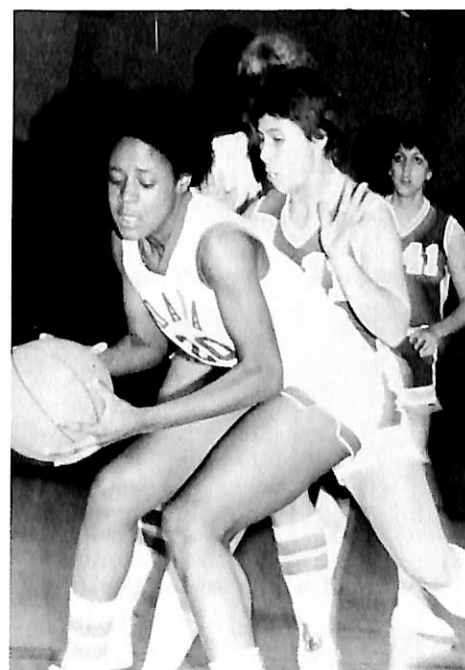


Merri Clements dribbles around her opponent.



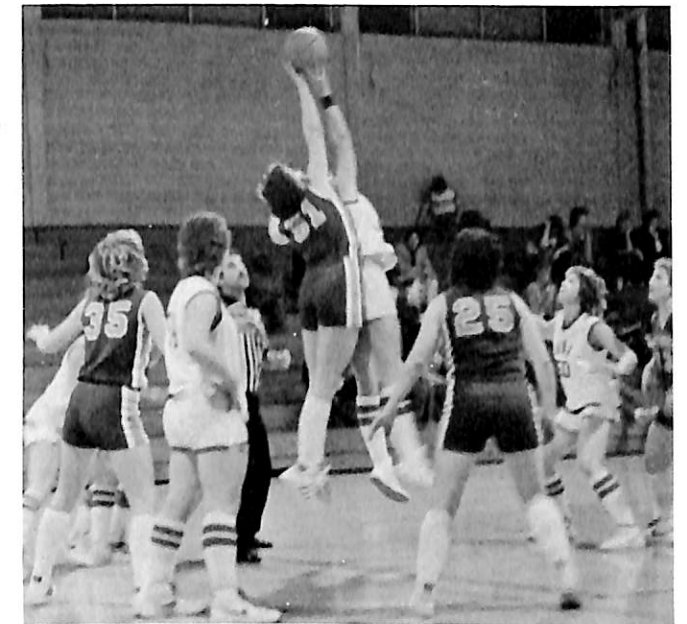
