
A New Beginning Positive Points From The Coach






The 1987-88 women's basketball team faced a big challenge this year as their roster was filled with 10 freshmen and 13 total athletes. The young Viking team competed well throughout the year and showed much promise for the future. The highlight of the year was an upset victory over league leading Midland in February. "In this game our younger players really showed what they will be able to do on a more consistent basis in the future."

The vikings were led in scoring by Freshmen Lori McMullen with 263 points (10.5 per game). Assists with 73 (3.04 per game), Steals with 53 (2.2 per game), and Free Throw percentage with 70.0% (49-70). Heidi Jacobsen led the team in rebounding with 161 (7.0 per game). Shelley Edwards led the team in Field Goal percentage with 41.3% (31-75).

Lori McMullen was named to the 2nd team All-Conference, Honorable Mention All-District, and was selected for the District All-Star Game.






















