Old Main Replacement Building

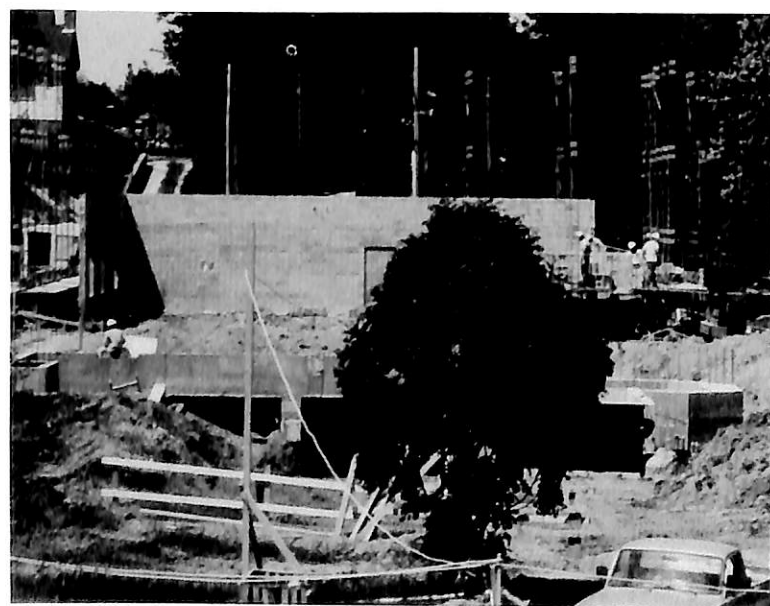
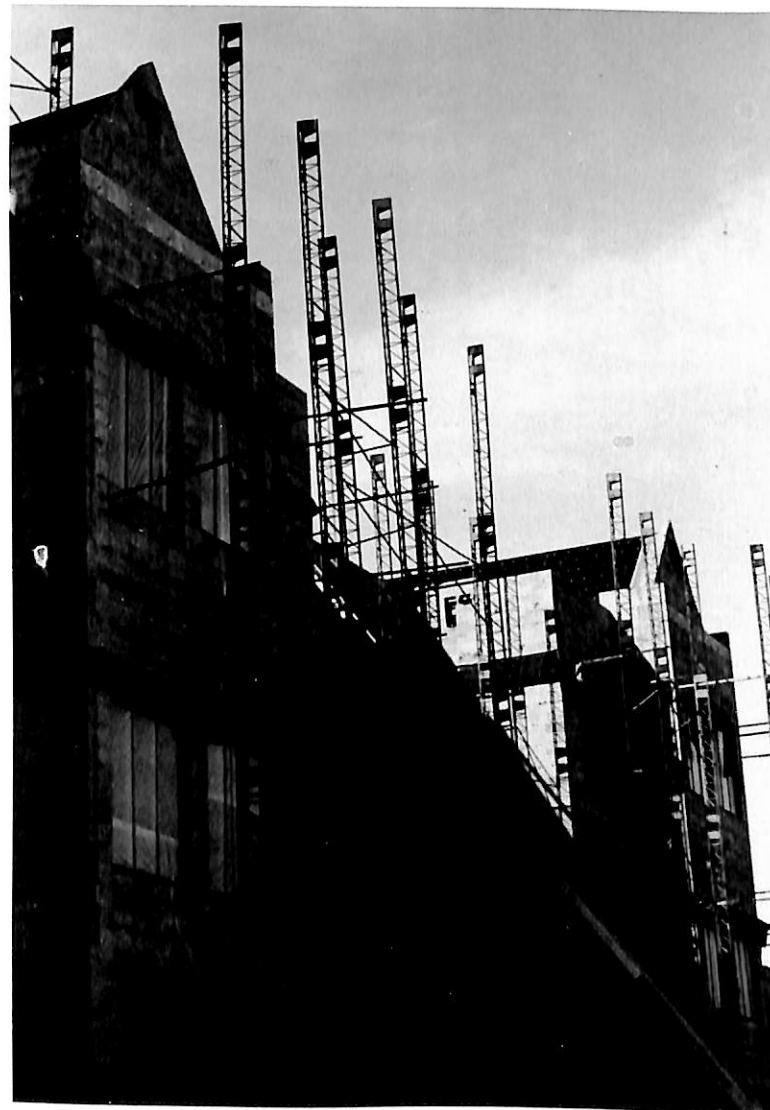
The bare ground in front of Argo hall that most of the upper classmen had become familiar with during the past few years has miraculously transformed into what will soon be the Old Main Replacement building.

The building will contain offices for faculty members, numerous classrooms, new homes for KDCV radio and DTV television, the Forum, and a lecture hall. The building will house as well, computer and foreign language labs and offices for the Hermes, Danian, and Sower. Also located there will be the new chapel complex, to be dedicated as the Trinity Chapel.

While the progress seemed to be slow and tedious during the fall months-- while the ground and foundation were being prepared--the actual structure of the building has seemed to go up in record time throughout the winter and spring. Every time you looked there seemed to be a new addition to be admired and marveled at.

In the front of the new building, and creating an overall atmosphere of progress and hope, is the 89 foot tower, that will, like that of the tower of Old Main, rise from the top of the Dana hill.

The building, which is being funded solely through donations, is scheduled to be finished so that faculty and staff can move into it over the summer, and so classes may begin to meet there at the beginning of the 1993-1994 academic year.

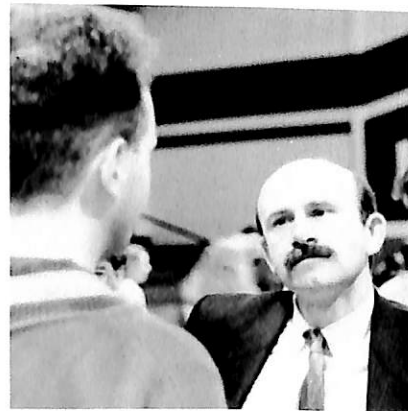
PAVEL PALAZCHENKO

Pavel Palazchenko, former interpreter and advisor to Soviet President Mikail Gorbachev, visited the Dana campus October 18 & 19. He spoke to the Dana community about the former Soviet Union and the reasons and results of its democratization. In Monday's presentation in Borup Coliseum, the floor was opened for questions of Palazchenko.

From 1980 to 1985, Palazchenko served as translator/interpreter for the Soviet delegations to arms control talks. Since, 1985 he has been an interpreter and advisor to Gorbachev and Edward Shevardnadze on relations with the United States and has participated in all U.S.-Soviet summits. Dana was Palazchenko's only stop in the metropolitan Omaha area during his ten day tour of selected colleges in America.

YEAR OF THE ELECTION

Student Senate sponsors the Vote America Program

The Dana Student Senate was busy from October to November preparing students for the 1992 Presidential Election. Working in cooperation with the Vote America Foundation, based in Washington D. C., the Senate worked to inform members of the Dana Community on the importance of voting and to keep them up to date on the issues. In conjunction with the Washington County clerk, the Senate registered over 60 students to vote at the polling place on campus and another 20 to begin the paperwork to

register at home via absentee ballot. On October 26, 1992, the Senate hosted a public forum in which Dana and Blair community members had the opportunity to ask questions of Chuck Siegerson, Douglas County Republican Chairperson, and Mike O'Hara, UNO professor and Democratic Party Representative. During the last few days leading up to the election the Sen-

ate spent many hours hanging posters to encourage and remind everyone to vote. Those who registered to vote in Washington County also received a reminder phone call on the eve of the election. The Senate's work resulted in an election night party, in which students could test their knowledge in political jeopardy.

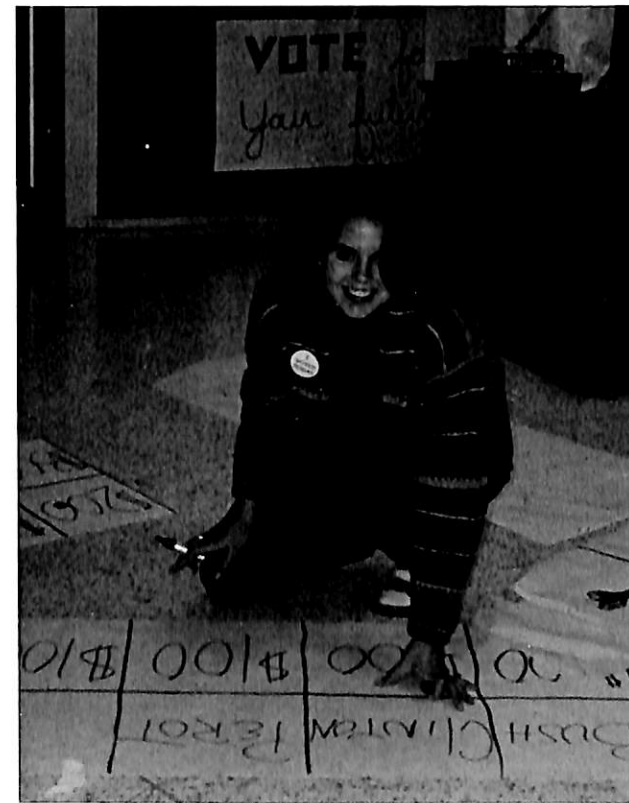
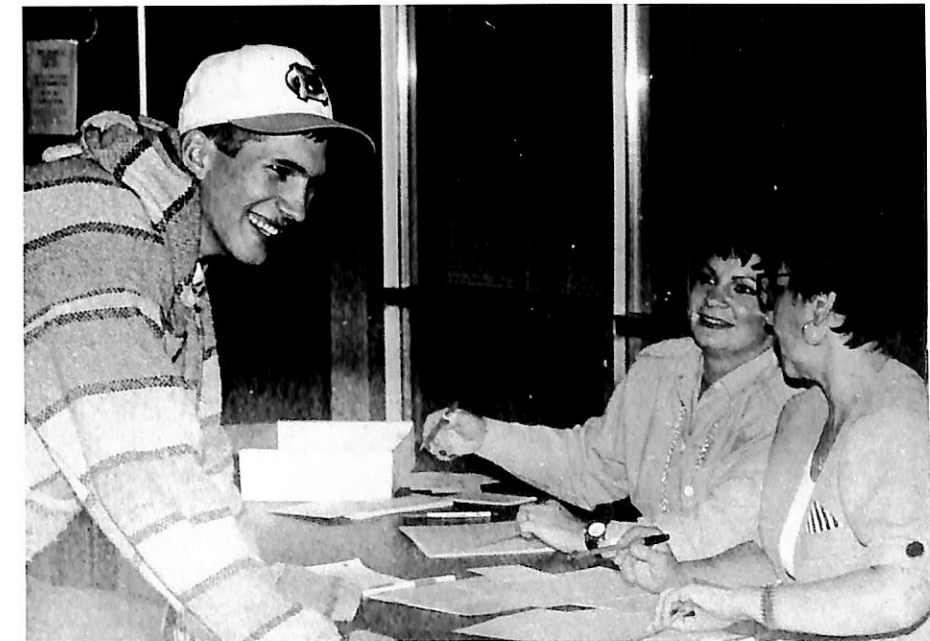

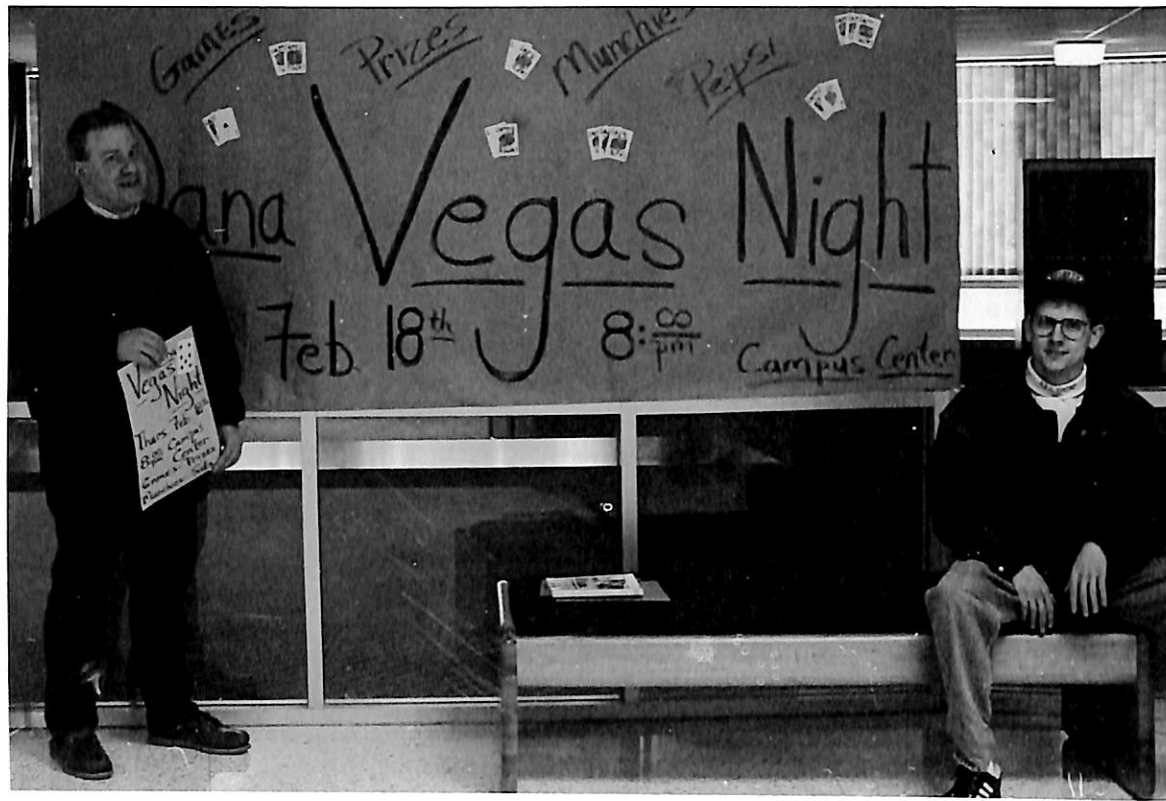

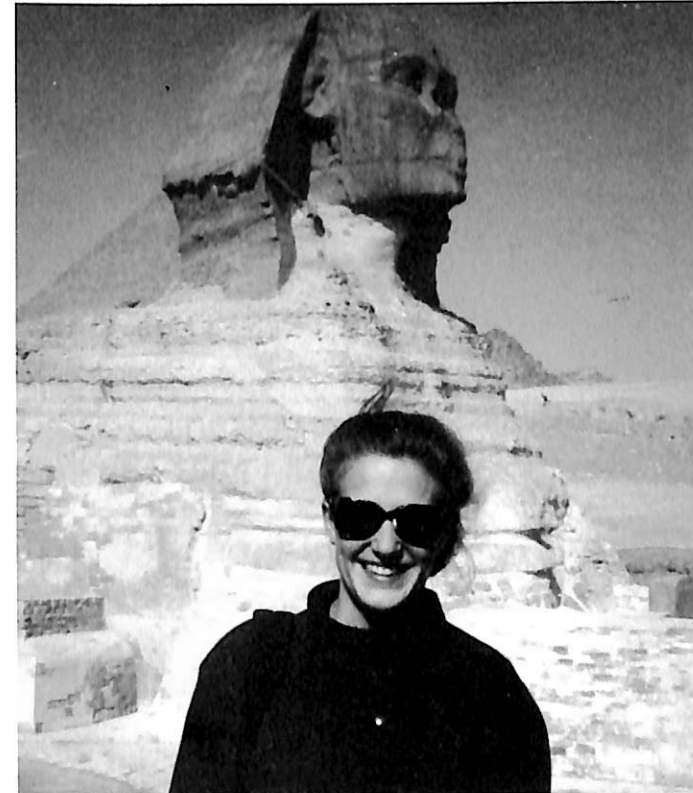

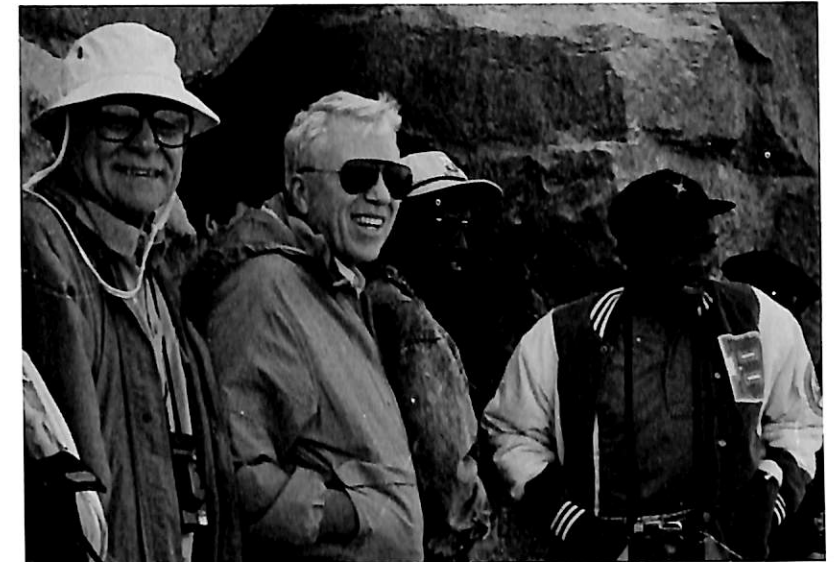

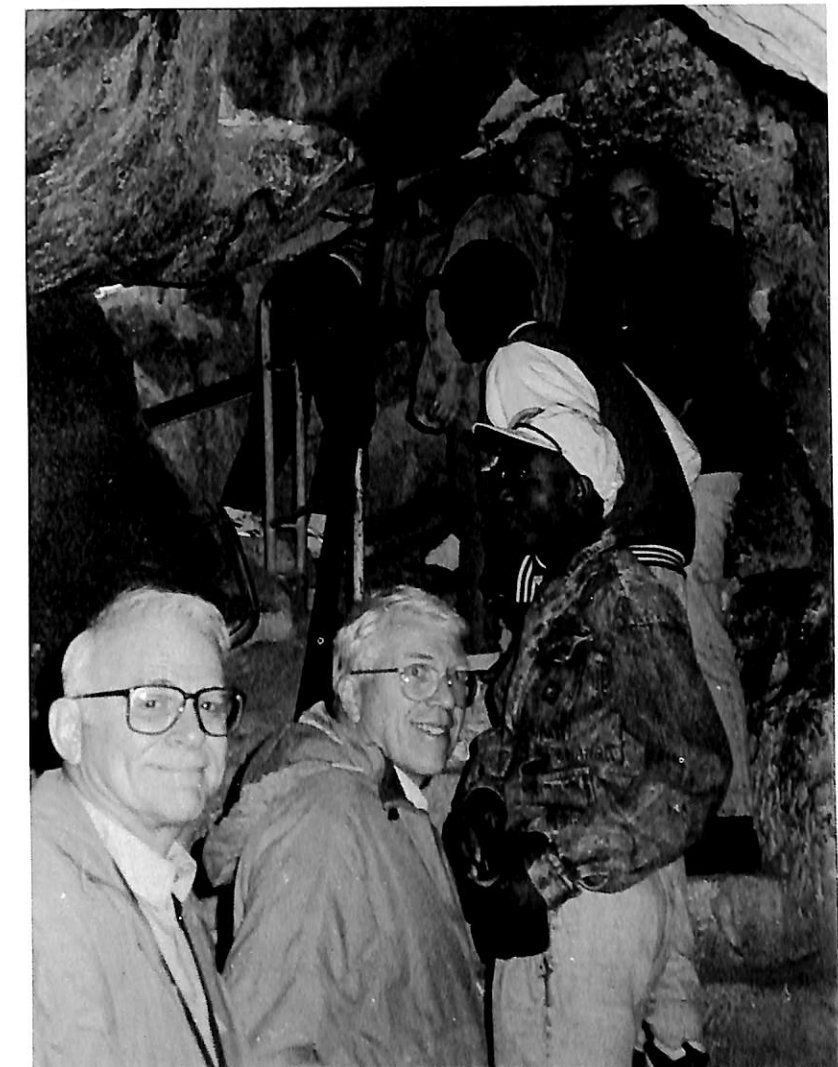

For his 1993 Interim class Professor Jim "Indiana" Olsen led a group of Dana students to Egypt. After beginning in Cairo the group traveled all the way from Alexandria, located on the Mediterranean Sea to Abu Simbel, less than ten miles from the Egyptian border with Sudan. The group visited such famous spots as the pyramids of Giza and the Sphinx, as well as the cities of Luxor, Memhis, Sakkar, Dendara, and Aswan.

Not only did the group have a great time, but the trip proved to be very educational for everyone involved. Learning about the culture of the Egyptian people and the life of a Muslim was fascinating. Through food, drink, conversations with natives, and several trips on various modes of transportation (including the camel), the group gained a greater appreciation for the Egyptian culture.

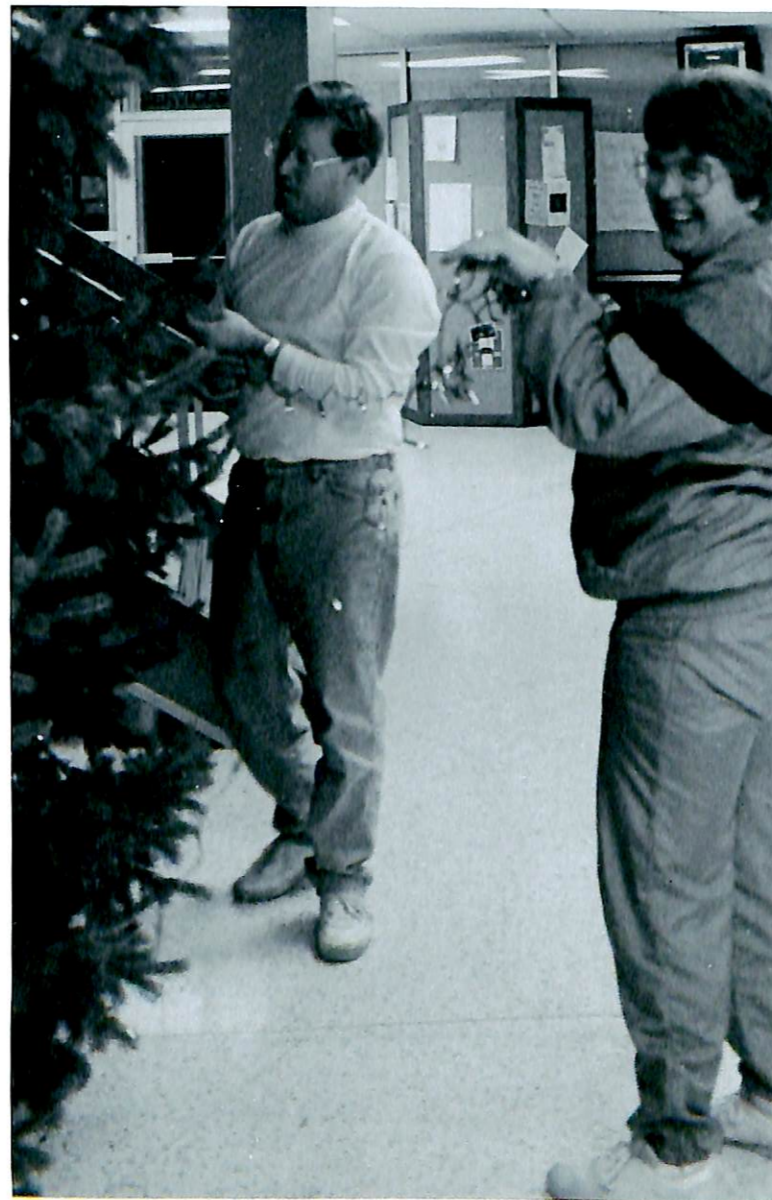

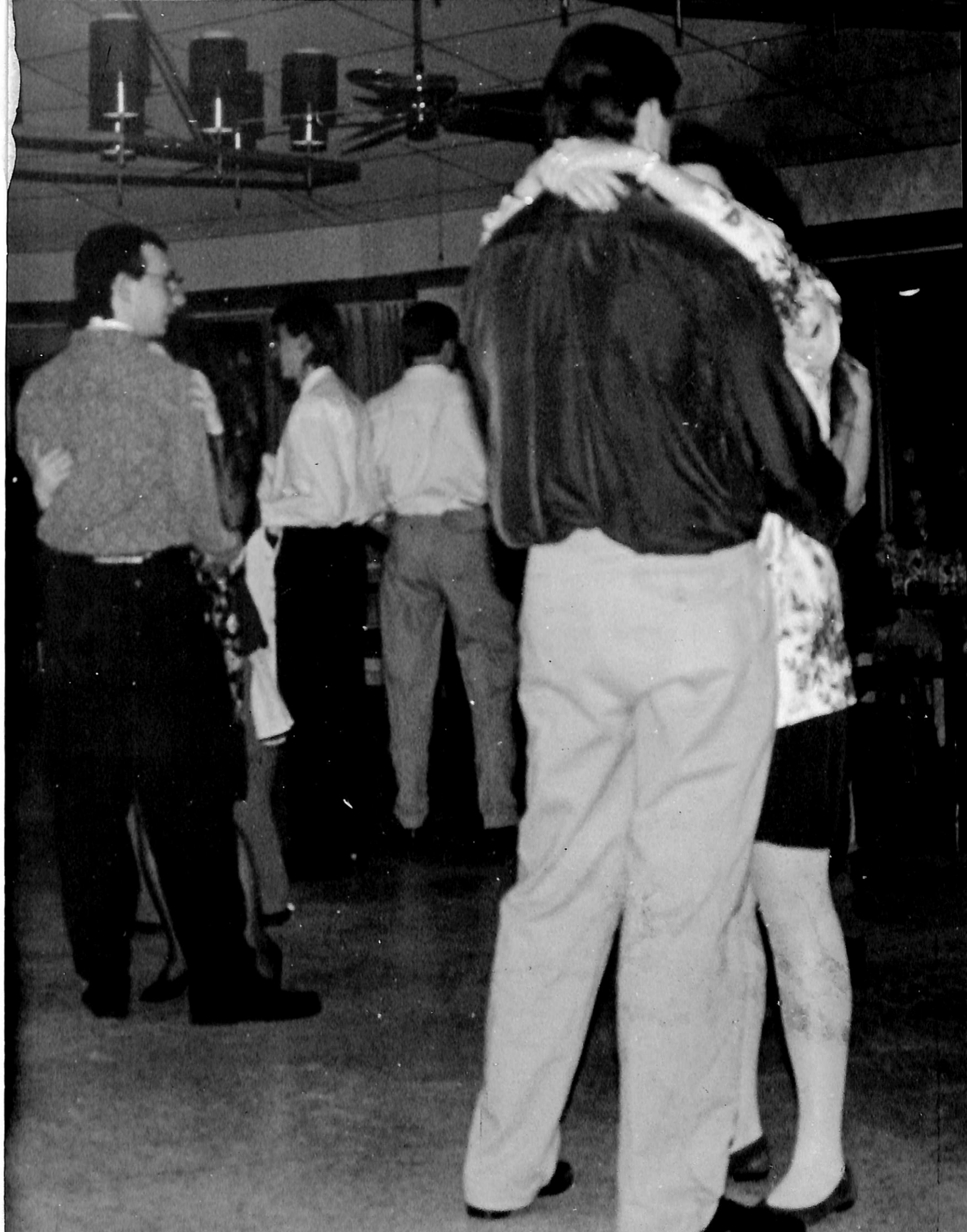

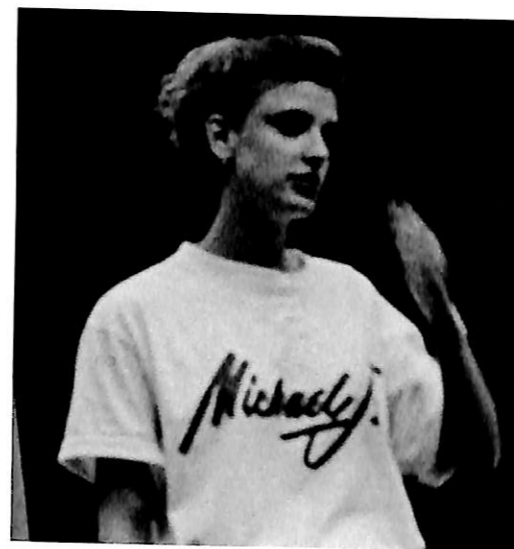

This year, the Dana theatre group outdid themselves. Led by the professional direction of Susan Guthrie, the players performed wonderfully in both the fall and spring plays.



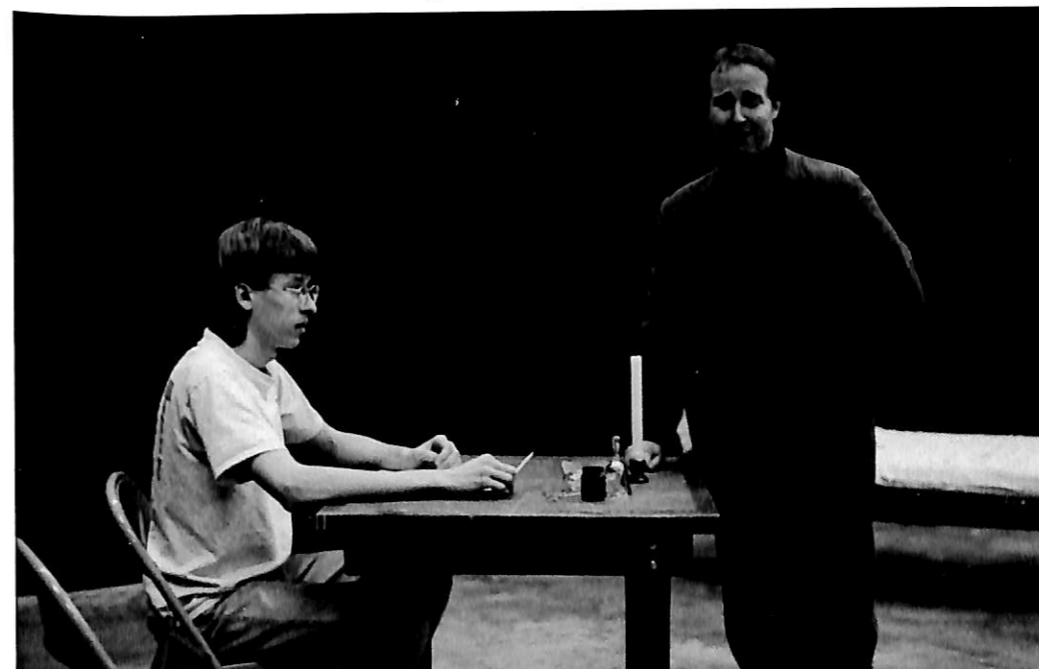

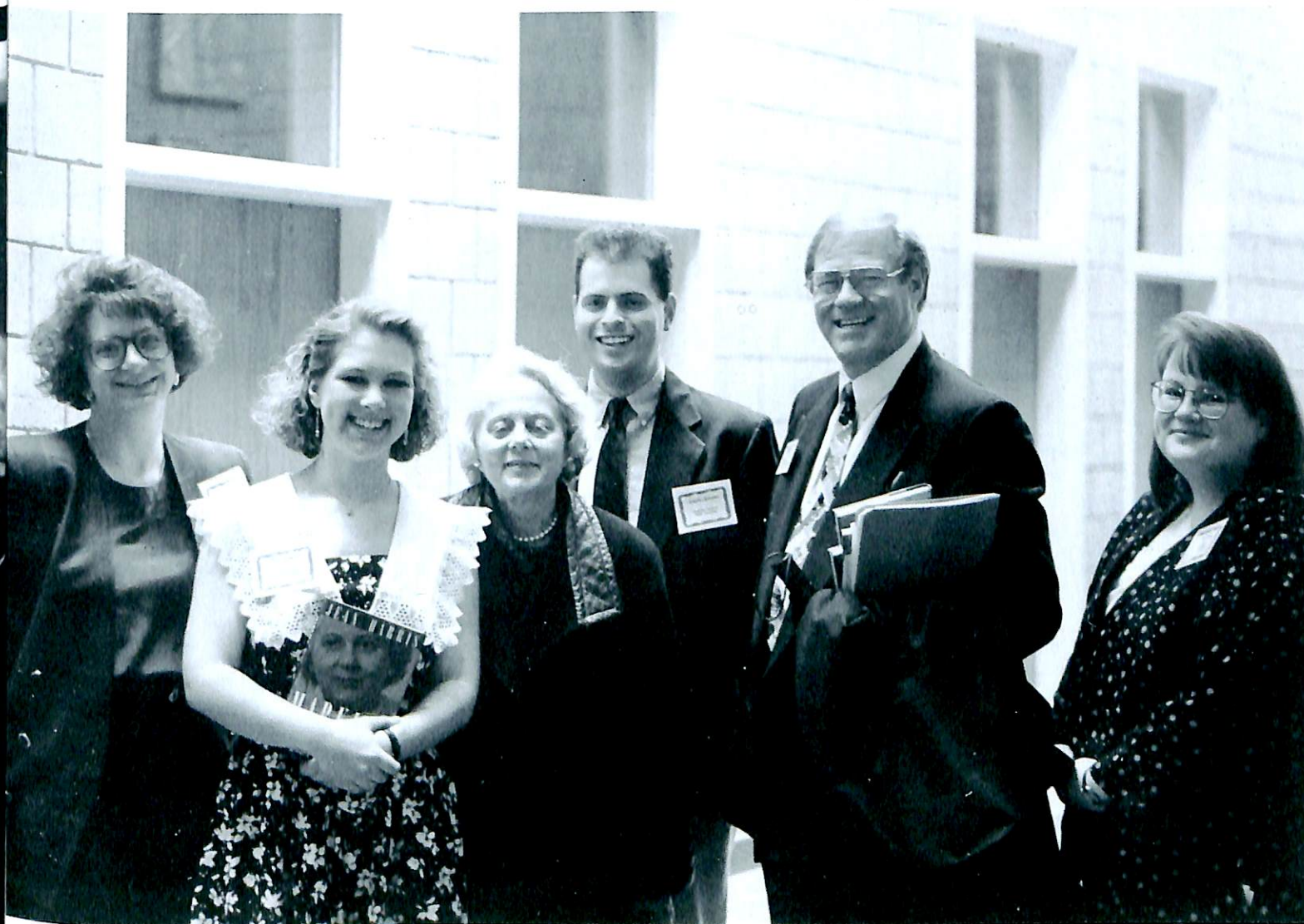

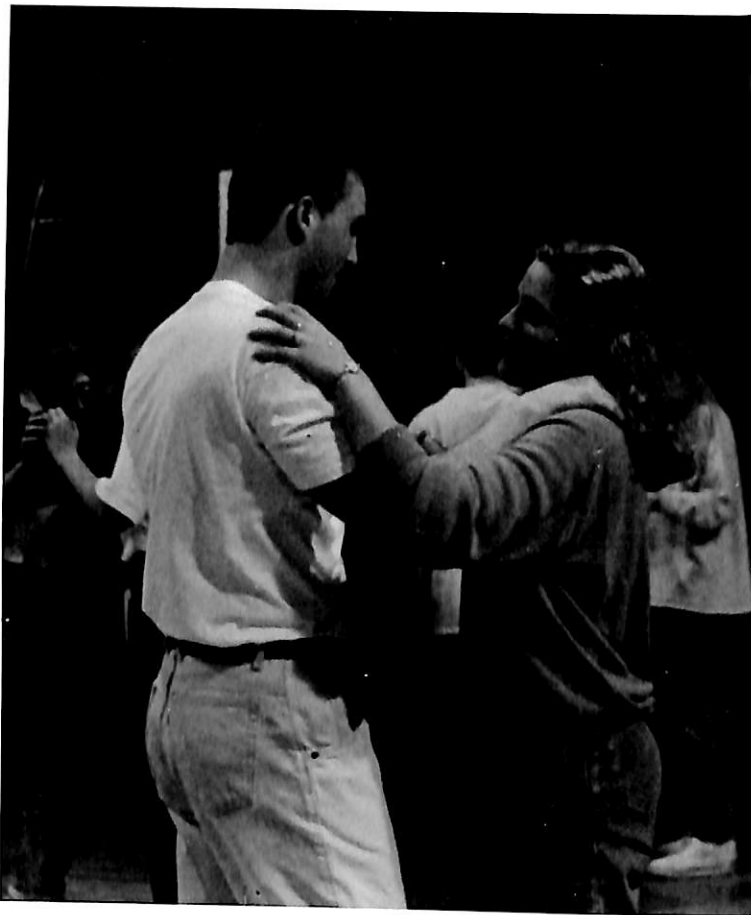

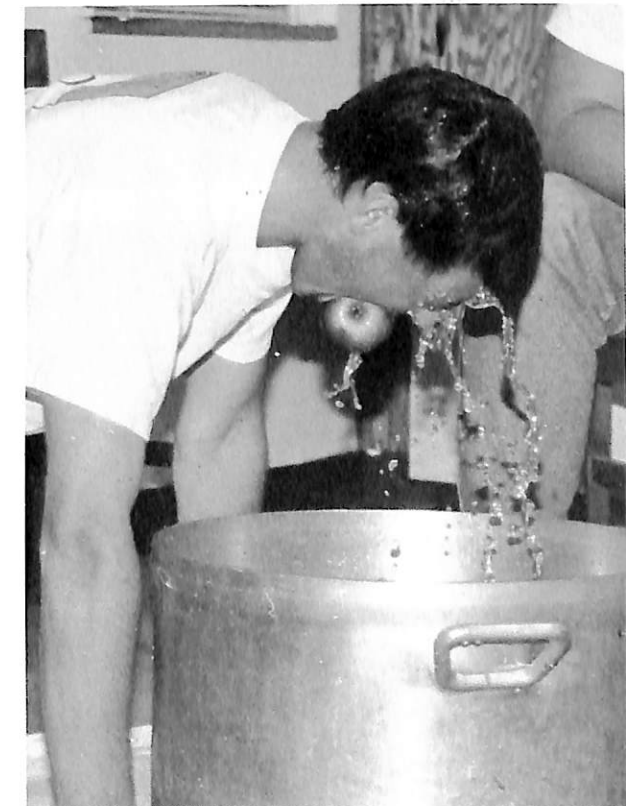

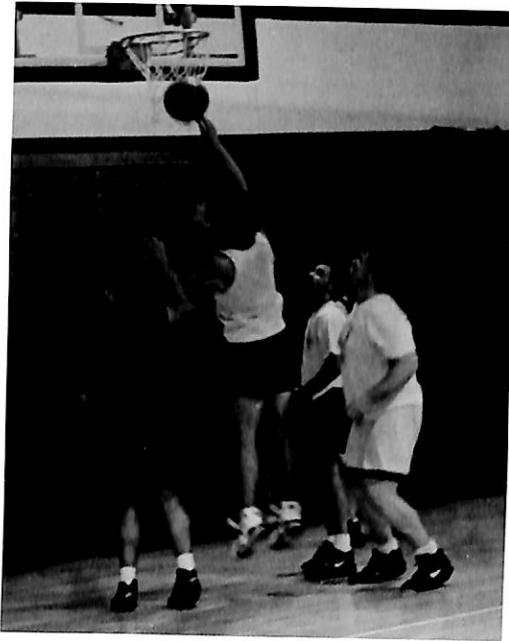

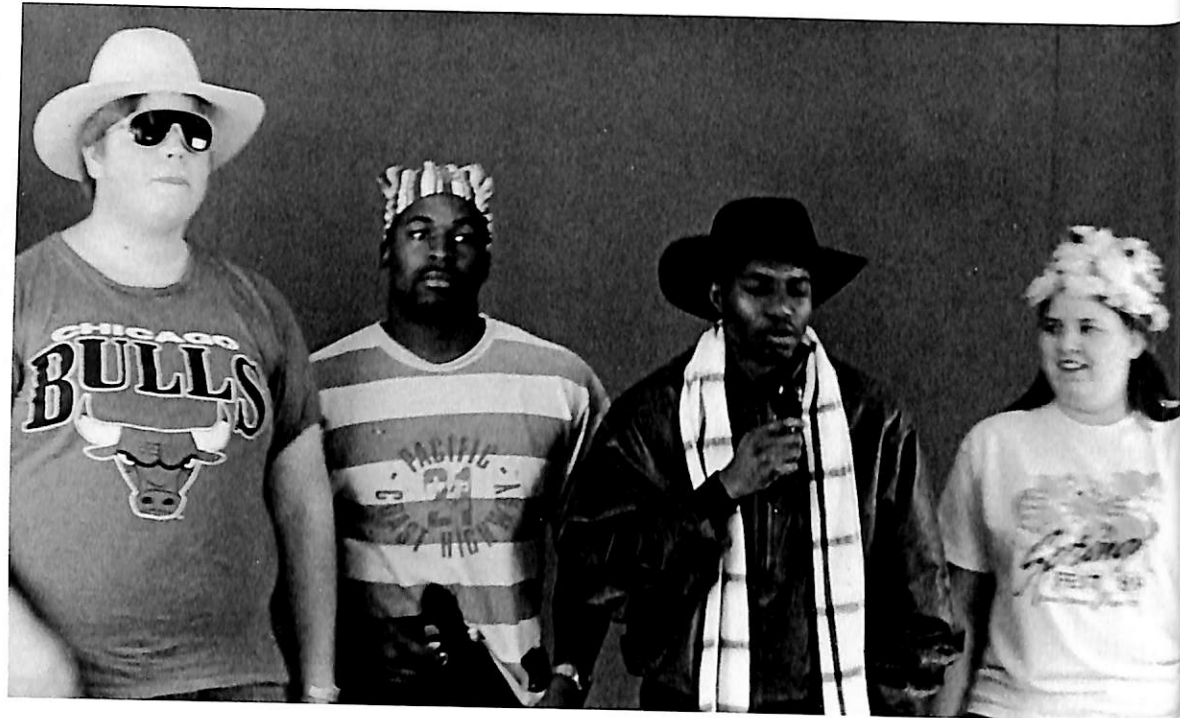

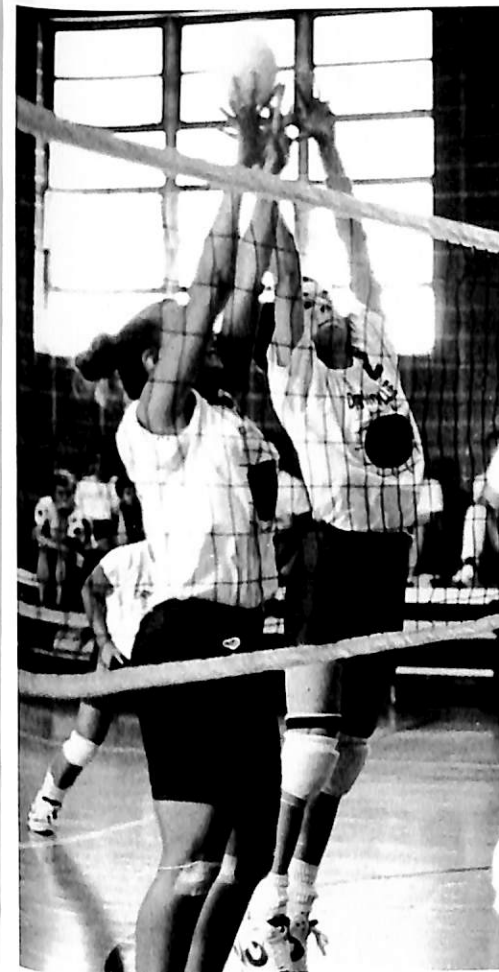

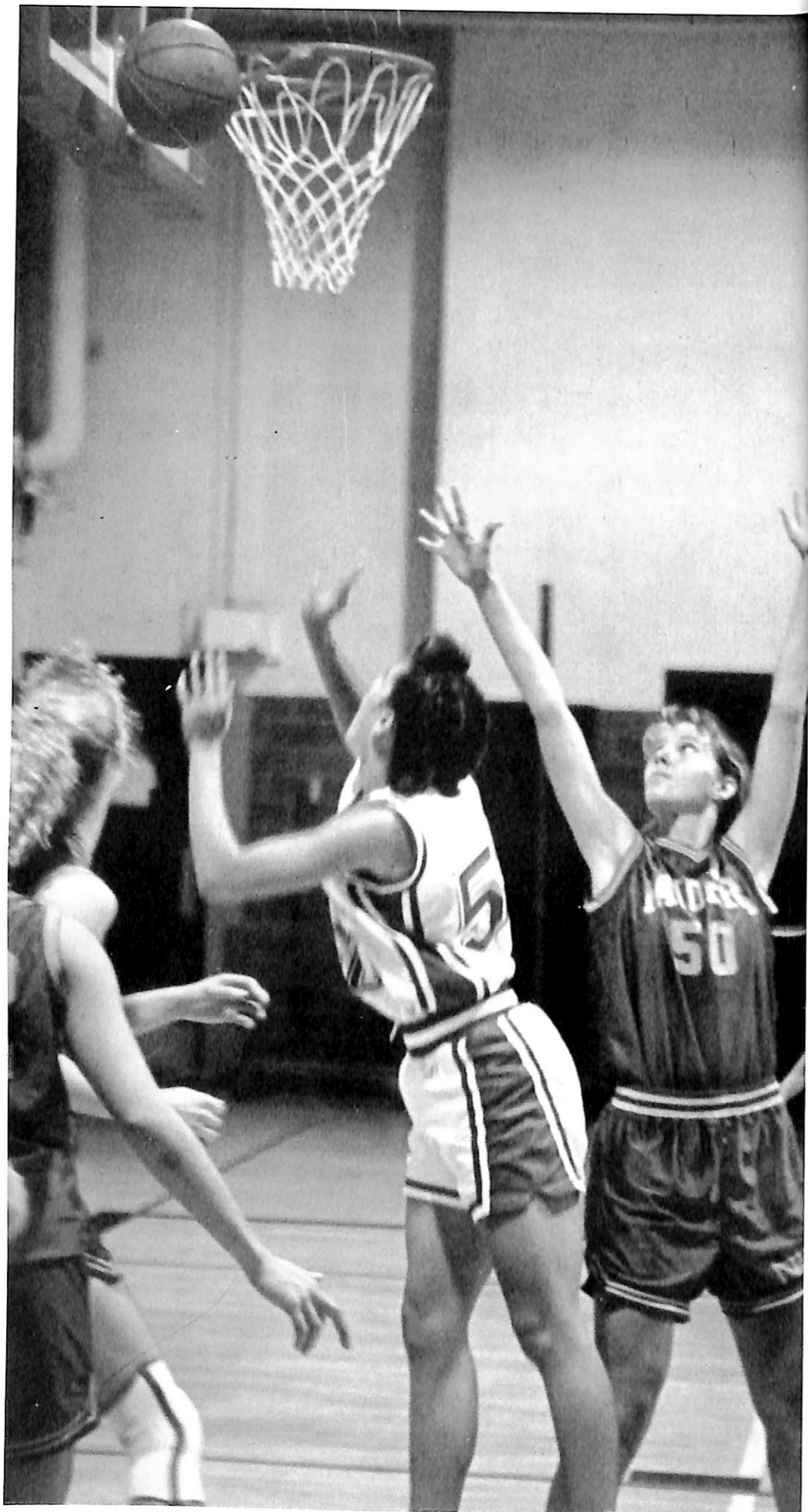

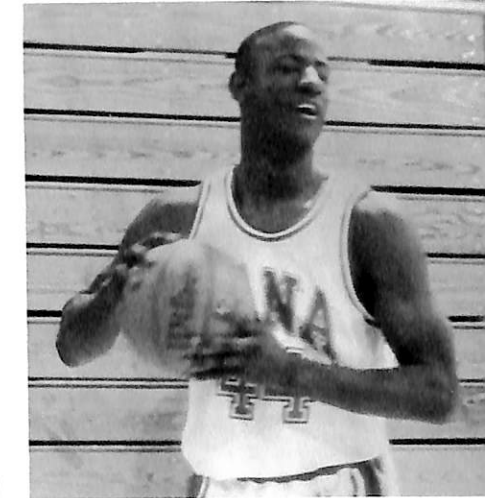

WHAT HAPPENED IN 92-93

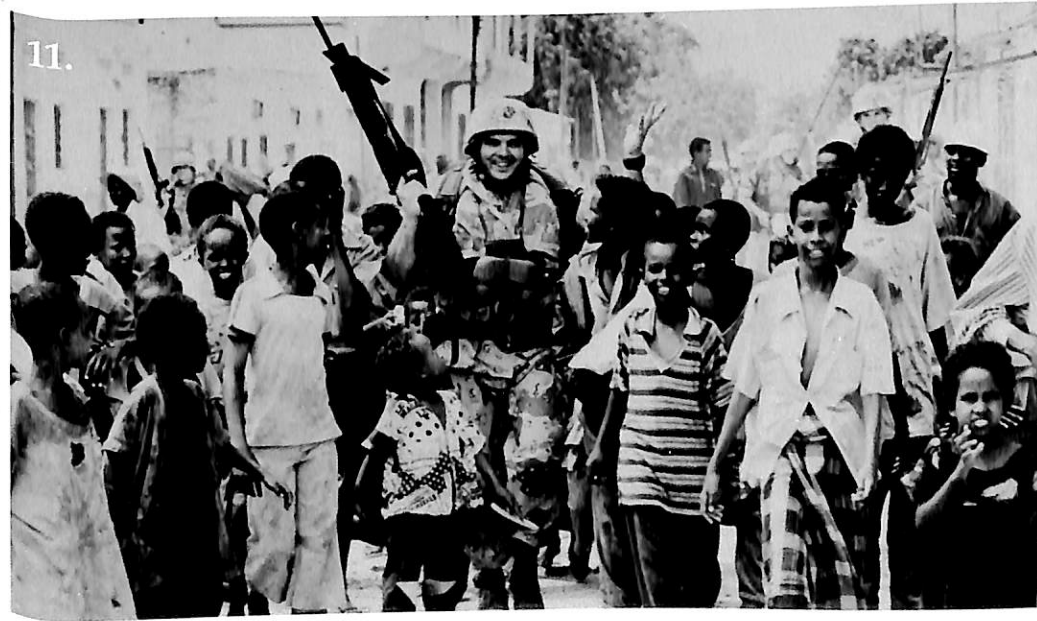
1. At noon on January 20, William Jefferson Clinton took the oath of office and became the 42nd president of the United States. As cannon thundered in salute, George Herbert Walker Bush surrendered power and stepped into history.

2. Ross Perot made his first billion when the computer company he founded began selling stock. His presidential candidacy came to a stop when he abruptly quit the race in July. Then he got back into the race with five weeks to go before election day. He chose James Stockdale as his running mate and along with an army of volunteers his campaign was off and running again.

3. Bush kept Quayle as his running mate in 1992. The two arrived at the GOP Convention in Houston as underdogs to the Clinton/Gore ticket.

4. Basketball great Larry Bird retired from the Boston Celtics after a 13-year career. "When I played, I played as hard as I could. That's what I want to be remembered for." The 35 year old Bird was plagued by back problems for the last two seasons of his career. His brilliant passing and pinpoint shooting made him a team player.

5. When Rodney King was stopped by police on a Los Angeles freeway, police say he resisted them and was therefore beaten. Someone videotaped the melee and released the tape to local television stations. It received national attention, and the four white officers were charged for the beating of the black man. They were found innocent and three days of rioting hit Los Angeles. When it ended 52 were dead, 2,383 were injured, 18,807 were arrested, and the damages were estimated at \$785 million.



6. U.S. and allied aircraft attacked strategic targets in Iraq in early January. The first attack hit a nuclear complex near the capital city of Baghdad, followed by other strategic hits on Iraqi missile sites. Many of the U.S. aircraft that flew raids over Iraq were based on the USS Kitty Hawk.

7. Garth Brooks, whose introspective songs and rousing concerts lifted country music to new heights, was voted top entertainer by his peers for the second year in a row. The 30 year old superstar topped both the country and pop charts with his 9 million selling album "Ropin' the Wind."

8. In 1991 Boris Yeltsin was elected president of the Russian Federation. One of his top priorities was economic reform. Yeltsin's reforms increased prices by as much as 1,500 percent during the first part of 1992. Many Russians felt that the reforms had damaged their living standards significantly. For this reason impeachment attempts were made in March of 1993.

9. Hurricane Andrew carved its way through the Bahamas and hit south Florida with great intensity during a 54 hour rampage, the most expensive natural disaster ever to hit this country. It left over 180,000 homeless in Florida alone.

10. Rapper Ice-T ignited a furor with his song "Cop Killer." Ice-T said the controversial song was a warning to the Los Angeles police, whom he accused of brutality, referring to the beating of King.

11. The U.S. Marines arrived in Somalia on December 9, 1992. The starving African country was ravages by famine and widespread looting of food from international relief agencies. The Marines offered a security force to insure safe food distribution.
