YEAR END REMEMBRANCE: Two weeks ago I received a request from Minden, *Nebraska for the Danish text and a translation of "Klokken Staar," a hymn often sung at the burial of loved ones. It begins:

My translation:

The year also saw the deaths of several generous archive contributors: Edna Bondo Nance, Marie Johnson, Arnold Nielsen, Vita Hansen Jensen and Ingrid Beck Bondo. Our sincere sympathy and our deep gratitude go to the families of all these friends.
