# THE ARCHIVE ENDOWMENT FUND

Dear Friends of the Archive,

There is good news!

At their February meeting, the Dana College Board of Regents approved the Archive Endowment Fund, and we are now ready to begin our work to greatly increase that fund which can assure the continued magement, development and use of the Danish Immigrant Archive at Dana.

We thank the President and the Board of Regents for this support and encouragement. The rest is up to those of us who are truly friends of the Archive and who can make the dream a reality.

Most of us who know the work here understand the urgency...we know why this needs to happen.

Dr. John W. Nielsen and many volunteers have freely given of their time and treasure to build the Danish Immigrant Archive at Dana College into the primary source of information concerning the UELC, its congregations, and its antecedent bodies, Trinity Theological Seminary and alumni, Dana College and alumni, and many individual Danish-American. More recently the Archive has expanded to include all DAnish immigrants and their descendants and institutions. Ten related books have been researched, written and published,

The work must continue even though Dr. Nielsen cannot continue his volunteer work indefinitely. That is what the endowment addresses. Thirty-five years ago the "archives" here at Dana were stored in cardboard boxes in the attic of Pioneer Memorial. That must not happen again.

Those of us who really care will help to reach the minimal goal of \$500,000 in cash and deferred gifts. Few or none of us will be able to write a check for \$25,000 or \$50,000 to help. But most of us can leave a substantial bequest in our estates to the Archive Endowment.

Many of you, like us, already have Dana in your estate plans. Ginny and I are adding an amount for the Archive Endowment. Both Dana and Trinity have
