ANOTHER PRODUCTIVE AND MEMORABLE VOLUNTEER WEEK: Thirty-five volunteers from California, Iowa, Minnesota, Nebraska, Texas and Denmark spent the week of April 22nd in the archive in work and fellowship. Great progress was made with The Danish Brotherhood material and the Clifford and Florence Hanson and the Chicago Golgotha collections. Translators, computer keyboardists, and document menders were kept busy. Clipping collections were filed, and still there was time for coffee breaks! Special events were presentations by Torben Christensen, the Bodtker Grant recipient, on his research in the archive; Ron Vig on discovering interesting aspects of his parents, Clarence and Mary Vig, in the archive; John Beck on the Archive Endowment project; and John Mark Nielsen on the forthcoming October conference. We missed members who were unable to be with us, but we valiantly carried on!

ENDOWMENT PROJECT: As John Beck informed you in the last JOTTINGS, we have launched a drive to raise a short-term goal of \$600,000.00 to assure the perpetuation of the Danish Immigrant Archive. Of this amount we hope to receive \$100,000.00 in cash and \$500,000.00 in deferred gifts. There are, of course, two interpretations of this goal. The first is that it is a seemingly staggering amount for our archive constituency. That means that we who believe in preserving our Danish heritage must either dig deeply or actively recruit others to the cause. Actually, both are probably required. The second interpretation is that the interest from \$600,000.00 is not nearly enough to sustain the total operation of an archive. That also is true, so this can only be the initial phase of an ongoing effort. Facing these realities, however, we are pleased to announce that we have made a tremendous start as the accompanying thermometer graph indicates. Cash received is indicated in solid black; deferred gifts, in crosshatch. Note this thermometer has the \$600,000.00 goal, not merely the earlier \$100,000.00 one. Thank you to those of you who have gotten us off to this impressive start, and an advance thank you to those of you who will be responding in the coming months. The specific amounts of individual deferred gifts will not be reported in the JOTTINGS.

Danes in America: Kansas and Nebraska: Lur Publications has just released its eleventh book. It is the second volume in our translation of Danske i Amerika. It consists of the material on early settlements in Kansas and Nebraska. Ninna Engskow is the translator and John W. Nielsen, the editor. "From John Nielsen, the gold miner, to Jacob Nielsen, the cowboy, an array of Danish settlers in Kansas and Nebraska appears in this book. Their occupations range from pastor and banker to saloon keeper and ice cream vendor, but collectively their activities provide an insight into early Danish settlements in these states. Women, unfortunately, are rather shadowy figures and children, even though families often numbered eight to ten, are virtually nonexistant because these are accounts by men, and by men of the first years of the twentieth century. This results in both limitation and insight. Here one reads of blizzards, droughts, prairie fires, grasshopper plagues and much more in a people's attempt to establish new lives. Gradually the open prairie becomes transformed into something far more familiar." (From the back cover.) The book sells for \$16.50.
