SUCCESSFUL VOLUNTEER WEEK: October 7-10 saw another successful volunteer week occur with 39 workers from California, Iowa, Minnesota, Nebtaska, Oregon, Texas and Wisconsin converging on the archives. Although the week was shortened by a day because of the DAHS conference, there was no decrease in work accomplished. Besides normal tasks the volunteers assisted in assembling over 400 complimentary bags for the conference containing twenty some different articles. The Conference Committee has expressed a special thanks to the people who performed this service. Volunteers experienced several extras during the week. On Monday night they saw the film, "Tak for Alt," which is the story of Judith Meisell, a Lithuanian Jew who survived the Holocaust in which most of her family were killed. Having been in camps in Lithuania, Poland and Germany, she escaped to Denmark where she was sheltered until the liberation of Denmark. Tuesday morning the group had an opportunity to meet Mrs. Meisel and hear her speak. The third extra of the week was the Tuesday noon luncheon in the home of Phil and Florence Larsen. The Larsens have several times in the past invited the group to their home for a delicious luncheon - or should I say, dinner - and fellowship. To Phil and Florence we all say, "Mange tak."

DAHS CONFERENCE: By now many of you have heard firsthand reports of the conference - in fact, 70 regular recipients of Jottings were in attendance. That's an impressive record! The conference on "Danish-North American Relations since World War II" drew over 400 partici= pants from 28 states, Washington D.C., Canada and Denmark. Former ambassadors, current Danish consuls, scholars, business people, celebrities and the rest of us attended sessions, exchanged ideas, fellow-shipped and made new and renewed old acquaintances. The Danish Immigrant Archive and Dana College in Blair and The Danish Immigrant Museum and The Danish Windmill in Elk Horn had good exposure when the conference participants spent a half-day in each town on Saturday. A publication of conference papers will be published in the spring. It will sell for \$25.00. If you are interested, contact me.

PHENOMENAL GROWTH: When in 1988 the first small group of archive volunteers gave new life to the Danish Immigrant Archive, it consisted of 31 collections of letters and documents besides an impressive array of books and a number of unexamined boxes of items. In the intervening years the corp of volunteers has expanded to the numbers indicated in the first paragraph and the number of collections has expanded to 279! In addition to these added collections there has been a significant increase in the book holdings. Besides all this, the archive has become the official repository for The Danish Brotherhood in America, The Danish Sisterhood in America, and The Danish American Heritage Society. During the past year the archive has received the periodical holdings of Danebod Folk High School in Tyler, Minnesota. This collection has filled in great gaps of material generated by The Danish Evangelical Lutheran Church which we did not have. A further indication of growth and interest is the quarterly publication of these Jottings. Currently about 360 people are on our mailing list. To remain active recipients

As a branch of the archive Lur Publications was launche in 1995. Since then eleven books have been published with a twelfth, <u>Attractory</u> America, appearing the end of November.

Nielsen is the editor, and he was instrumental in collecting the stories and arranging for family photographs that enhance the work. As I write in my introduction, "Because the accounts were written by individuals representing a wide range of ages, training and professions they vary in literary quality, but the contents of each exhibits its own special insight into the life and attitude of both subject and author...A1though literary critics may rightly criticize the work for lacking a central theme, the fact of immigration being too broad and a Tucson Danish Club connection, too vague, the book possesses its own peculiar validity. The individual accounta are like the pieces of a mosaic, each legitimatly selfcontained, yet grouped together forming a picture of the Danish immigrant experience."
