ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL WEEK: Although Maynard and Marion Hansen, Inga Larsen, Marion Svendsen, and Roger and Marilyn Hanson had to cancel, the spring volunteer week was a success with 34 volunteers participating. The week began with a Sunday evening aebleskiver event hosted by Amy Barlow, Nathan Krammer, and Ted and Margie Bansen in memory of Norman Bansen. On Wednesday evening there was a memorial service for Bansen in Trinity Chapel with Dr. Christopherson, Richard Jorgensen, Karen Bansen Maguire, Paul Neve, and John W. Nielsen participating. Lloyd and Ann Bansen, Dora Bansen, other family members, friends, colleagues, and former students gathered for the service and the reception hosted by Myrvin and Anne Christopherson. On Thursday afternoon many of the volunteers attended the Dana College Arbor Day event. Work, however, was also done, and LOTS OF IT! 757 hours was tallied. Major projects were making a bibliograpical list of duplicate books - 710 all told - to be shared with the archive at Grand View College and compiling a more detailed record of Danish Brotherhood members in conjunction with The Family History Center of The Danish Immigrant Museum in Elk Horn. Other significant work was accomplished, and I express my gratitude to everyone who worked. Now plan for the autumn event - October 4-8, 2004.

2003 IN REVIEW: 2003 marked a year of significant growth for The Archive. Fifty-one new collections were opened to what already was the largest concentration of Danish-American material in the Western Hemisphere. In addition to this 105 boxes of material were added to existing collections. One-hundred eighteen new individual or family files were opened, 583 obituaries added, and over a thousand books catalogued. Of special significance was the establishing of a three-month archival residency program. We were fortunate to have Birgit Flemming Larsen formerly from The Danish Immigration Archives in Aalborg be our resident archivist. She not only shared her expertise in 2003 but was also here in 2004 and promises to come again in 2005. Researchers, genealogists and visitors continue to come to The Archive. This year there were researchers from Canada, Denmark, and several American universities. Again in 2003 the Bodtker Grant recipient did research here. She was Tine Pallisgaard.

STUDENT RESEARCHERS; Dr. Iain Anderson of Dana's history department has introduced a research course to the curriculum. Currently seven students from California, Colorado, Nebraska and Illinois are enrolled. They are developing research techniques in a recognized archive which is something that most college students do not have opportunity to do. Topics include the role of Danish-Americans in World Wars I and II, the Oaks Indian Mission, Danish Lutherans in Utah, Danish immigration patterns, the Danish settlement in Dannebrog, Nebraska, and early Danish Lutheranism as exemplified in the life of A.M. Andersen. At the completion of the course the student papers will be added to the archive collection.

COOPERATION: As was indicated in the first paragraph there is a gratifying cooperation with both the Grand View College archive in Des Moines and The Danish Immigrant Museum in Elk Horn. Sheri Kleinwort, the Grand View archivist, was here this winter. She prepared a list of duplicate book holdings at Grand View from which we selected about 200 titles. We are now sending her a list of 710 books of which we have multiple copies.

Undoubtedly they will add to their collection from our list. The project with the museum's Family History Center involves getting more of the Danish Brotherhood material entered in the computer so that it will be more readily available. This is a tedious but important task.

DANISH BROTHERHOOD-SISTERHOOD CONVENTION: Just prior to the archive week the Colorado-Nebraska Brotherhoods and Sisterhoods held their district convention on the Dana campus. There was a fine exchange of ideas, a good financial gift to the Archive, and the promise on the part of many to send materials - personal as well as organization - to us. This is an exciting new contact.
