EXPLANATION: Because even under the best of circumstances these JOT-TINGS are going to reach you a month late, I am going to forego the pleasure of writing a personal note to each of you. I am sorry to succumb to this exigency because somehow writing those almost 500 notes offered me a personal contact, but I guess I had better not press things... October found me so exhausted that I had to call off the autumn volunteer session which I hated to do both for the archival work that would not be accomplished and for the esprit de corps that I would spe, cpo deprive myself of. The month also found my only brother being diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. After his hospitalization I flew to Chicago (he lived in Hammond, Indiana) to be with him. The night before he died we prayed our boyhood prayer: "Now I lay me down to sleep .. If I should die before I wake, I pray the Lord my soul to take. " He was still breathing when I went into the bathroom the next morning, but when I came out, my nephew informed me that James had just died. His was a blessed death, and I was grateful that I was there. James' wife who was just 57 died last November, so their four children lost both parents within a year. I do want to thank all of you who have sent memorials and notes of sympathy.

DEATHS: Besides James' death the Archive has experienced the loss of several other long-time supporters. They are Cyrus (Andy) Anderson or Swananoa, NC, who regularly supplied funds for treats during volunteer week; Ellen Hansen Schooley of the Hansen-Mengers clan who faithfully clipped obituaries and other Danish related items from the Chicago newspapers; and Verner Carlsen of Solvang, CA, who regularly supplied material (N.C. Carlsen and other) and offered encouragement. We will miss each of them.

ACQUISITIONS: Although every acquisition is significant, there are some that seem to deserve special mention. Severin Sorensen of Nebraska City and his daughter Charlotte Travis of San Antonio recently delivered an impressive addition to the collection of Jorgensen-Sorensen material that Lil and Sev had given the Archive before Lil's death last November. The most recent contribution consists of over 10,000 additional letters besides reminiscences and other items. This places the Jorgensen Collection on a par with the Hansen-Mengers, each containing approximately 15,000 letters besides other materials. Anker Jensen of Castro Valley, CA, has given the Archive eleven huge boxes of his and Vita's materials including letters, diaries, an autobiographical account, sermons, bulletins, and other items. This collection has not yet been processed. Elna Nielsen Bellows of Edina, MN, has added to her extensive collection of the Nielsen family involving Nysted, Grand View, and Tyler. This collection is similar, although not quite as extensive, as that of Lois Christensen Eagleton of Umpqua, OR, which covers her extended family in Nebraska and the West coast. It is all very exciting.

CONFERENCES: Two important conferences will be held in 2005. The Federation of Danish Associations of Canada will hold their annual conference at Dana College from May 26 to June 1 on the theme: "Danish Immigration

in the United States." Time will be spent at both The Danish Immigrant Museum in Elk Horn and the Danish Immigrant Archive at Blair. The Danish American Heritage Society's 2005 conference will be held in Des Moines from October 13th to 16th under the theme: "Danish Culture - Past and Present, the Last 200 Years." An exciting and informative program is being prepared. Watch for details about both of these conferences and plan to attend.

BODTKER GRANT RECIPIENT: Pia Viscor, one of the two 2003-2004 Bodtker Grant recipients, spent a week in the Archive in November. She is tracing the descendants of a group of slightly over 400 immigrants who left an area in central Sjaeland in the first half of the nineteenth century. The group went initially to Racine, Wisconsin, and from there many moved elsewhere. About a quarter of the original immigrants were Danish Baptists.

GENEROUS GESTURE: If you have not already received a letter from Thomas Hansen of the Dana College Development Staff, you will soon. Thomas is one of a very limited number of individuals who, because he believes in the importance of the Archive, gives a monthly financial gift to the Archive Endowment Fund. As a further indication of his support he proposed the aforementioned letter which has been prepared at his own expense. The Dana College Development Office has generously agreed to pay for the postage. To Thomas, to Mike Jones, and to all involved I want to express my gratitude. Now, of course, I await the response to the letter.

FINALLY: I hope that you had a most blessed Thanksgiving, and with Christ-mas approaching, I wish you a jouous and meaningful observance. To our Jewish recipients, substitute, Hanukkah.
