Then I realized that I was facing the orchestrated efforts of two wonderful pipers: Bee Krantz and Dody Johnson. My embarrassment changed to gratitude, and the birthday cards with their kind notes and enclosed checks for The Archive continued to arrive amounting to an impressive total. My intention to write individual thank you notes was an impossibility unless I were cloned or unless I stopped accessioning the new material arriving almost daily at the archive. So I resort to this less than satisfying but no less sincere method of saying, "Thank you, all of you, and a special thanks to Bee and Dody." My life is more pleasant and the Archive is richer because of you.

EXPANSION AND CONSOLIDATION: Hopes sometimes have to be deferred. So it is with the plans to expand and consolidate the archive area. What we had hoped would occur this summer has to be postponed. Perhaps next summer. In the meantime we continue to collect and catalog in the hopes that our plight will become overwhelmingly evident.

RESIDENCY PROGRAM: Again in 2005 as in the two preceding years Birgit Flemming Larsen of Aalborg, Denmark, will spend three months: September, October and November, assisting in getting more of the archive collections ready for computer entry. Birgit pays for her own airfare, but The Archive through an Einer and Else Solevad memorial provides a stipend and works with Dana in providing housing.

VIG REUNION: Archive volunteer Ron Vig was instrumental in gathering a large group of Vig family members for a reunion on the Dana Campus (much of which is situated on the site of P.S. Vig's home place) from July 21-24, 2005. Most of the individuals coming from Denmark and all parts of the United States had never met, but after days at Dana, Elk Horn, and the Archive, they decided to assemble again in two years. In my talk to them I tried to extricate P.S. Vig the man from myth and percepttions. The Archive received many important Vig items with the promise of more to come. Tim Pallesen, son of Rev. George and Irene Pallesen, assisted in hosting the event.

DAHS CONFERENCE: The three-day international conference celebrating "Danish Culture, Past and Present: The Last Two Hundred Years" opens on October 13, 2005, at the Embassy Suites Hotel in Des Moines, Iowa. A varied and impressive program will commemorate the lives of Hans Christian Andersen, Kristian Østergaard and Søren Kierkegaard as well as revealing significant Danish contributions in the areas of art, music and cinema. WELCOME: It is a pleasure to welcome Dr. Janet Philipp as President of Dana College. We look forward to her leadership and anticipate the same archival support from her as we received from Dr. Christopherson.

IMPORTANT ACQUISITIONS: We continue to be the recipients of a constant stream of significant contributions. Sometimes they arrive as single items in envelopes; sometimes in large boxes containing hundreds of books or documents. Whatever the size, each contribution becomes an important addition our holdings. Two unusual acquisitions are currently on their way to The Archive. The one consists of all the records and materials of the American Society of Danish Engineers that is dissolving after seventy-five years which comes to us from Thorbjorn Storm. The other is a complete set of Danmarks Posten which is a gift of Niels Alsted, a former editor. All but the recent copies are bound.

CANADIAN CONFERENCE: The late May-early June meeting of The Federation of Danish Associations of Canada at Dana College and The Danish Immigrant Museum was a great success. The sessions were informative and stimulating; the excursions, interesting. It was good to nenew acquaintances, make new friends, and meet many who knew the same people that I knew.

DEPARTURE: By the time that these JOTTINGS reach you, Thomas Hansen will have left Dana to assume a new position at The Danish Immigrant Museum in Elk Horn. We will miss him very much because he was a tremendous advocate for Dana College, The Archive, and all things Danish. His departure means that we and all of you will have to put forth even greater effort to promote our work. Although we will miss him, we wish him and The Museum every success.

NIELSEN REUNION: The last weekend in July our Nielsen family had a reunion in Elk Horn, Iowa, with a traditional UELC worship service on Saturday night at St. Paul's Lutheran (Boomer Twp.). We used the old, blue Hymnal for Church and Home. It was good to introduce the younger generations to this simple but meaningful liturgy, the Danish hymns, the deacon's prayers, and the singing of "Let not the world lead us astray...," after the confessing of the Apostles' Creed. A cemetery walk revived a host of memories of friends and history. (Gary and Marion's branch of the family is the only one with direct connections.) Sunday was spent at The Museum in Elk Horn viewing the excellent exhibits as well as engaging in conversation and playing the traditional Nielsen soccer game.
