BELATED GREETINGS: For those of you who normally receive Christmas greetings from us but did not this year, please let this be a substitute. When the evening of December 22nd arrived and I was still writing notes, I realized that I could either continue and be a nervous grump or cease and enjoy the wonderful days as they were intended. I did the latter.. On the 23rd after a risengrød supper as many of the family as had assembled went out for our traditional carolling. On the 24th while the family attended Christmas vespers, Elizabeth and I finished prepartions for the traditional Christmas dinner culminating with ris a la mande and a marzipan pig prize. After dishes there was the gathering around the Christmas tree with each member of the family , beginning with the youngest, choosing a carol that was sung in its entirety before the opening of gifts. The gift opening ended with the family "surprise project" - this year artists' berets, palettes, brushes and sketch pads. Elizabeth made berets and palettes for everyone. On Christmas morning we went to the cemetery, as we do every year, to carol in Danish over the graves of Grandpa and Grandma Solevad, Paul Jeppesen, the Harold Jorgensens, and the Mike Brondums. We switch to "O Tannenbaum" for Herta Engelman and her mother. Interspersed with all this there was much coffee, Danish cookies, grandpa's glog and fruitcake and many games of Rook involving three generations. The fourth is not yet old enough to play! That was how I spent my freed time so now I send you all a belated Christmas greeting and wishes for a good 2006. As our card this year we used the watercolor card that Elizabeth painted for The Danish Immigrant Museum. I added the following verse:

Flames shiver in the wintry night, grow numb and die.

The passerby laments the death

but fails to comprehend the apparition bright.

The watercolor and poem are based on Hans Christian Andersen's "The Little Match Girl."

ARCHIVE WEEK: Remember that the spring volunteer week is April 17-21, immediately following Easter. Because Dana will be closed on Easter Monday, please come directly to The Archive (the outside Southeast door of the library) for your room assignments and keys if you are staying on campus. We will also plan to launch work as soon as you arrive on Monday. I understand that there will be several new volunteers this spring. I want to welcome them to our ranks.

RESIDENCY PROGRAM: Again in 2005 for the third year Birgit Flemming Larsen spent three months assisting me in the Archive. She completed her stint the day before Thanksgiving so she missed out on a traditional American Thanksgiving dinner. No outsider can fully appreciate the valuable assistance that Birgit provides. Her expertise as the former director of the archive in Aalborg is invaluable. I sincerely hope that her schedule and resources will enable her to make it four.

ACADEMIC INVOLVELENT: During his January interim course on "Research for School and Life," Library Director Tom Nielsen introduced his students to primary sources and archival holdings by having me make a presentation to them in The Archive on the variety of materials available including letters, diaries, journals, manuscripts, obituaries, newspaper clippings, oral history tapes, and pictures. With

the spring semester Dr. Iain Anderson is again offering a research course in immigration required of all history majors. Although the course focuses on immigration in general, each of the eight students will produce a research paper properly documented growing out out of material held in The Danish Immigrant Archive. Dana students are extremely fortunate in attending a college where they have such ready access to a recognized archive. Few colleges, not to mention universities, have such a facility available to them. Again I will be heavily involved in the research aspect of this project.

PRESENTATIONS: In January I spoke to the Omaha Book Club on unpublished books in The Archive. Some of these books are completed manuscripts such as Sophus Keith Winther's The Horse Pasture and Enok Mortensen's Plough to the Setting Sun, but others are still unwritten accounts, fictional and factual hidden away in the host of letters, reminiscences and materials housed in The Archive. Someday an aspiring author will find inspiration and fame in the trove of material waiting to be tapped. Later this month when the spouses of state legislators gather on campus, I will introduce them to The Archive and its unique holdings. In this presentation I will focus on materials significant to Nebraska's history.

<u>DOUBLE GIFT</u>: Although the generous gift of all the records of The American Society of Danish Engineers was acknowledged in the last JOTTINGS, I want to mention it again because as the financial report in this JOTTINGS indicates, The Society has followed its extensive material donation with a gift of over \$2500.00 to The Archive in the recognition that it costs us money to accession, store, and subsequently access such materials. These professionals have caught a significant dimension of what archiving entails. Our thanks to them.

REMEMBRANCE: As the numerous memorial gifts indicate many of you have lost dear friends and loved ones during the past months. My sympathy is extended to all of you. Perhaps it is not fair, but I do want to mention two long-time archive supporters who have died. They are Elizabeth's 97 year-old uncle, Egil Povelsen, of Santa Rosa, California, and Decorah, Iowa, and Clara Quist, a 100 year plus resident of Blair, Nebraska. Egil and his wife Lisbeth gave The Archive 18 boxes of material in addition to a large collection of books. Clara Quist who was a cousin of Ron Vig's mother, Mary Anderson Vig was an Archive visitor and attended events. Her roots go back to "The Old Dane Church" near Red Cloud, Nebraska, that Willa Cather mentions in My Antonia. We will miss both of these friends.

DANISH PORCELAIN: Several years before her death Ruth Herman Nielsen presented The Danish Immigrant Archive/Dana College a complete set of her "Falling Leaves" Bing and Grondahl porcelain, service for twelve with accompanying pieces with the proviso that the dishes be used, not merely exhibited. Ruth's set is kept in The Heritage Room at Dana and is used for special events. Inspired by Ruth's example, alumnus Nathan Kramer of Blair, has browsed the web and over the past few years has given The Archive luncheon settings for more than twenty-four additional people. Like Ruth, Nathan wants his gift to be used. In this spirit The Archive recently loaned The Danish Immigrant Museum in Elk Horn, Iowa, the twenty-four piece coffee set when it entertained members of the Iowa Tourist Board. The Archive would welcome further expansion of this collection so if you would like to contribute pieces, it would be appreciated.

DENMARK IN THE NEWS: Usually as Danish-Americans we are proud when Denmark is in the news. Her record of world aid, her support of underprivileged people and nations, her advocacy of the arts all make us proud, but such is not the case of the recent anti-Muslim cartoon printed in a Danish newspaper. One can argue that freedom of speech and creative expression have wide bounds, but one does wish that editorial responsibility and cultural sensitivity would have stopped short of publishing and circulating the offending work. We must all learn that the wonderful gift of freedom is only truly functional when it is accompanied by consideration and restraint.

Some of you are already doing this, and it is greatly appreciated.

CHURCH MATERIAL: As former Danish congregations are losing their ethnic identity, we are sorely in need of building up our files on these congregations, especially in the years prior to 1960. This is true not only of former UELC congregations but also of AELC, Baptist, Methodist, Seventh Day Adventist and Mormon ones. If you have contact with or access to any of these churches, please help us. It is interesting, or probably more accurately sad, that of the 182 UELC congregations existing at the time of the 1960 merger we have significant collections of material on only 41. We also have sizeable collections for 11 congregations that disbanded before that date and for four AELC ones: St. Ansgar, Parlier, California; Trinity, Chicago, Illinois; Bethlehem, Cedar Falls, Iowa; and St. Ansgar, Rosenborg, Nebraska.
