

YOUR ASSISTANCE: I know that quite a few of you read The Jottings because I have received a lot of obituaries and some good material on various former Danish churches. Please continue to clip out obituaries of any Danish-American individual (or ones married to Danish-Americans or having such relatives). On the margin jot down the date and name of the paper. Send the obituaries even if you do not have the publication information. Please also send The Archive records, programs, bulletins, certificates, clippings, etc. on any Danish churches, individuals, or social and/or professional organizations.

EXCITING ADDITIONS: Although every addition is significant including the individual obituary, some collections are especially exciting. One of these was that brought by Elisabeth Green and her husband. Elisabeth is the granddaughter of N.S. Nielsen who was one of A.M. Andersen's first four students when Trinity Seminary opened in his home in Blair in 1884. Nielsen was a nephew of A.M. Andersen. Included in the collection are many photographs and N.S. Nielsen's pastoral record books between 1891 and 1928. Another rich collection was that from Lois Sullivan that included many photographs, postcards and documents much of it concerning Danish Baptists. I found this collection especially interesting because so much of it concerned Clarks Grove and Albert Lea, Minnesota. I grew up between these two towns that were ten miles apart. The collection of union material belonging to Agnes Loveland adds an important new dimension to our holdings. The fact that I knew Tiny makes it also interesting. Jonna Kvist from Dronninglund, Denmark, found material in the Danish Brotherhood books and in the Anton Kvist collection, and she in turn is transmitting to us many copies of family letters from Denmark. In this connection Carol Opal of Council Bluffs has given us 66 letters written to Beryl Prai from Helen Nyegaard in Denmark. Harold Wright has given us a letter written by Sophus Keith Winther shortly before his death. For all of this and everything else I am exceedingly grateful.
