600.000 VOLUNTEER WEEK: When forty volunteers from ten states and Denmark descend upon The Archive, many projects move forward. That is what happened the week of October 9-13. The joint registry of Danish Brotherhood members being compiled in conjunction with The Fanish Immigrant Museum's Family History Center occupied many of the volunteers. Others worked at sorting, coding and cataloging various collections. A few did valuable translating and still others devoted themselves to the tedious but necessary tasks of inventorying collections and dusting the extensive book and periodical holdings. In connection with the latter task Marilyn Meyer bought The Archive a vacuum cleaner! There were a number of first-time volunteers 500,000 and some who returned after an interim. Among these were Glen and Margret Christophersen, Marilyn Meyer, Jon and Dorothy Petersen, Fern Sembach, Freya Borstang, Maynard and Mari Marion Hansen, Fritz Hansen, and Phyllis Nielsen. The volunteers came from California, Iowa, Kansas, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, South Dakota, Texas, Washington, Wisconsin and Denmark. Some participated for a day or two; others for the entire week. Fellowship and coffee sessions were the compensation for diligent work. Among the volunteers was Freya Borstang, the Bodtker Grant recipient from Denmark, who was winding-up her project of interviewing descendants of Danish immigrants. The next Archive Week will be in April. Exact dates will be announced in the 400,000 February Jottings.

MISSING: As we gathered there were those who were missed. Thoughts and notes were directed to Esther Freund and Bob Berthelsen, Archive volunteers, both of whom would have been present but for cancer. Ed and Shirley Hansen returned to Minnesota after one day because Ed was still weak after recent surgery. Our prayers are with all of these. Also missed was Ninna Engskow, a faithful volunteer whose services went back to the beginning of the volunteer effort. She was an especially valuable translator because of her long and deep roots in the Danish community. She died September 11th

having lived over ninety-seven years.

- 2. From the Quick Links drop down box select Library
- 3. From the left side of the Library home page select Resources & Databases or from the bottom of the page select Start Researching.
- 4. From the top left of the Resources & Databases page select Dana Cat.
- the <u>Select a Link</u> drop down box select <u>Dana College</u> and then <u>click</u> on <u>Go to to-WebCat.</u>
- COLLEGE Your Library on the Web. The middle of the screen contains a Quick Search box. Click on the Keyword radio button if it is not already selected. In the leftmost box enter the name of the person or place you want to search. If you are looking for a person, type the last name, then a comma, and then the first name. For example, to look for materials related to A.M. Andersen enter Andersen, A.M. If no first name oo initials are entered, the search engine will look for all holdings in the Dana College Library and in The Archive with the subject of Andersen. In the drop down box labeled words or phrase, select subject. Then click on Search.
- 7. The next screen will list <u>Search Results</u>. If you would like more information for any item on this screen, click on <u>Details</u>. On the following screen click on <u>Catalog Record</u>.
- 8. This search process looks both at the holdings in the Dana College Library and in the Danish Immigrant Archive at Dana College. If an item
- is in The Archive, the <u>Search Results</u> page will display the words <u>in AR-CHIVES</u> next to the item.

NOTE: At this time The Archive entries represent only about one-third of the archive holdings. More are being added almost daily. Currently most archive collections up to "J" have been entered.

GRATITUDE: In this season of Thanksgiving, I want to express my deep gratitude to God and to all of you who have contributed to my work here in The Archive. It is exciting to be a part of an expanding and never-ending operation that not only preserves our distinctive Danish heritage but also an important dimension of Americana.
