Unanimously Adopted or Elected600,000

Articles of Association and Bylaws for the Danish American Archive and Library were unanimously adopted by the general assembly of the DAAL at the Wednesday afternoon, October 8th, meeting at Dana College.

The documents give formal status to The Archive and provide rules for its operation. The Resolution of Intent is an initial statement towards preserving the integrity of The Archive holdings as a permanent and inviolable record of Danish American historical and cultural material.

The assembly also elected a six member board. Edward Hansen (Edina, MN) and Sandra Wigdahl (Blair, NE) for one year, Tim Jensen (Blair, NE) and Pete Petersen (Canyon, TX) for two years, and Fritz Hansen (Wichita, KS) and Joan Jensen (Ankeny, IA) for three years. These terms were in accordance with the newly adopted Articles. In subsequent elections members will be elected for three-year terms. Tim Jensen served as secretary for the meeting, and John W. Nielsen presented the director's report.

Assistant Jill Hennick Assumes Duties the End of September

Jill Jorgensen Hennick became an assistant to Archive director John W. Nielsen on September 29th. Jill is a 1986 Dana graduate who comes to The Archive with wide business experience and the highest recommendations. Her position was made possible by the generosity of many of you who gave designated gifts to the support of an assistant. The Archive board trusts that that support will be renewed in the current year and that others will join in the venture so that her present three-hour a day schedule can be expanded, ultimately becoming a full-time paid position.

Jill originally came to Dana as a student from Poy Sippi, Wisconsin. She is married to Michael Hennick. Michael is also a 1986 Dana graduate. The Hennicks have moved to Blair from Oshkosh, Wisconsin.

No Major Financial Drive Planned for 2008-2009

The Board of the DAAL decided that in light of the current national economic situation no special financial drive would be launched this year. This is a venture of trust in you its constituency because expenses, of course, not only continue but increase.

Currently the DAAL operates with two separate accounts: the Endowment Fund which provides support for the future and the General Fund which covers current operating costs. These costs include printing, postage, shelving, acid-free boxes and envelopes, computers and other supplies and equipment. Also included in the General Fund is the salary of The Archive assistant. To make sure that these assistant funds are kept distinct from general operating funds, a special account column has been created for them in the General Fund account.

There was discussion of establishing Archive dues, but it was decided to continue the current procedure of considering anyone who has contributed money, archival material, or voluntary service during the current and preceding year a voting member. Again this expresses confidence that those who give material or service to The Archive will also contribute money to insure its operation and future.

Official Reminder of Director's Discretionary Authority Over Undesignated Contributions

Rules require that at least once a year The Archive constituency be reminded that the director has authority to deposit all undesignated financial gifts in the fund where they are most needed. Designated gifts, of course, will be deposited according to the donor's stated intention.

During much of the past decade most undesignated gifts of \$100.00 or more were assigned to The Endowment Fund. That policy has changed more recently as operating costs have increased because of the marked expansion of The Archive holdings and operation.

Nebraska State Library Association Panel Presented by Dana/Archive

DAAL Director John W. Nielsen joined Eric Petersen, Dana College Reference Librarian, and Dana senior Jon Brown in making a presentation at the State Library Conference in Lincoln on research opportunities for undergraduate students provided by special collections such as the DAAL.

Eric Petersen introduced the value of special holdings in libraries as well as Dr. Iain Andersen's research course at Dana. Jon Brown, a student in Dr. Andersen's last year class, described his use of the Danish Brotherhood records to determine the effect of the Great Depression upon American Danes. Besides his particular use of those records, he indicated several other ways in which the Brotherhood records could be used for research. Dr. Nielsen described how DAAL material was organized and background on the Danish Brotherhood.

Work Begins On Processing Large Music Collection

Work is just beginning on organizing and cataloging the large music collection that is held by the DAAL. This is made possible because Claire Bushong, a member of the Dana College music department, has volunteered time each week to begin this enormous undertaking. If her plans develop according to schedule, she will devote more time during the summer.

The collection which began originally with hymnals and Dana College Choir recordings has expanded to include all kinds of music belonging to members of the Danish Community in America. This means there is not only sheet music, songbooks, musical scores, records, tapes and disks but also in most cases the necessary equipment to reproduce that music. It is hoped as part of this project to eventually digitize the music. The collection has rapidly expanded because The Danish Immigrant Museum and The Family History and Genealogical Center both in Elk Horn, Iowa, and the Danish Immigrant Archive at Grand View College in Des Moines have made the DAAL the official repository for such music donations.

Archive Contributions Provide Interesting Insight Into Past

Every gift received by The Archive carries with it its own particular significance, but recently two provided special insight into the past. In the last Walker-Johnson box to be opened such an item appeared. It is a man's tie adorned with a host of political pins. Ordinarily this tie would be turned over to The Danish Immigrant Museum as an artifact, but because it casts light on a host of political clippings, cartoons, and campaign literature in the collection, it is being retained by the DAAL. Included are pins stating: "Repeal the 19th Amendment", "No 3rd Term", "Forward with Stevenson", and "Kennedy for President".

A second revealing gift is a collection of essays that Chris Larsen of Fresno wrote while a student at Dana in 1914. These themes are on Dana subjects - one providing a student's assessment of such faculty members as P.S. Vig, Nellie Falk, Viggo Mengers and Charlie Gaydou. One of special interest describes how Charlie Gaydou got students to enlist in the National Guard. It refers to early days before they had been issued arms for drilling. Suddenly a photograph in possession of The Archive assumed significance. It pictures a rag-tag group of fellows outside Old Main standing at rigid attention holding broom sticks. Undoubtedly these are the Dana volunteers! Unfortunately like many recent members of the Nebraska National Guard who unexpectedly found themselves in Iraq, several of these 1914 volunteers were sent to the Southwest and Mexico in an attempt to capture Pancho Villa.

These delightful essays written by her father were a gift of Liz Larsen of Fresno.

It is interesting how I have come to feel that I know so many of you whom I have never met.

As you peruse the financial report you will find memorials to many friends who have died. Our sincere sympathy is extended to the respective families and in most cases a host of meaningful memories arise. I must, however, mention the death of one friend, Oscar Johnson. Not only was Oscar the husband of our Volunteer Week's Organizer and Director, Dody Johnson, but he was a special friend to Elizabeth and me through the years. He was a seminarian when we were in college. Then he married Dody Jensen, a childhood friend from Albert Lea. We cherish the memory of Oscar' quiet and reflective manner, and missed his presence and service during Archive Week.

By the time that these Jottings reach you, Elizabeth and I will have returned from a weekend in Northfield, Minnesota, where we have been invited to celebrate the founding and expansion of The Northfield Retirement Center. The project was launched in March 1962 when I was pastor at St. Peter's. Since that date two other graduates of Trinity Seminary from the class of 1953 played roles in its development. Bob Hansen succeeded me at St. Peter's, and Gerhard Nygaard served many years as pastor at the Retirement Center. We anticipate seeing not only them but a host of other Northfield friends.

As I close these Jottings I am keenly aware of how much there is to be thankful for even in a time of serious economic recession. Life still offers hope and disappointment, illness and health, joy and sorrow, but it offers them to us in a nation of remarkable freedom and amazing opportunity. Still there is love and friendship and the chance to think more of others than of self. So I wish you a truly happy and meaningful Thanksgiving, and may that be the prelude for an Advent Season of hope and a Christmas of joy and fulfillment with the candles of Advent culminating in a wondrous light for the entire world.
