

Forthcoming Lur Book Launches Important New Direction

With the release of *Gustaf Munch-Petersen:* Selected Poems in June, Lur Publications launches a new publishing venture in which it will introduce American readers to significant works that have appeared in Denmark. This work of Danish poetry has been translated by Brian Young of Port Townsend, Washington.

Gustaf Munch-Petersen was an early 20th century Danish poet who lost his life when only 26 as a volunteer in the Spanish Civil War opposing Francisco Franco. His poetry was not accepted by Danish critics during his lifetime because it was too *avant garde*. Subsequently it became highly valued and Martine Cardel Gertsen, the leading Danish authority on Munch-Petersen has written an introduction to the bilingual Lur edition. Assisting with the layout and design has been Dana senior art student, Mandy Hemphill.

As the projected followup to the Munch-Petersen work, Lur is planning a translation of Søren Daugberg's Kaj Munk og Tyskland – teater og politik (Kaj Munk and Germany – Theater and Politics.) This is a study of the Danish resistance martyr, Kaj Munk, but instead of focusing on Munk's wartime resistance and martyrdom which are well known to American readers, it concentrates on Munk's life in the 20s and 30s when he was absorbed in German theater and social efforts. As with the Munch-Petersen book this will be the first time this work has appeared in English.

The Munch-Petersen book is scheduled to appear the second week of June and will be available from Lur Publication, DAAL, Dana College, Blair, Nebraska 68008 for \$12.50 plus \$3.00 shipping. Add \$1.00 for each additional book ordered.

Dane Spends Two Months Researching at DAAL

Bendt Jensen of Hjoerring, Denmark, spent the months of March and April at DAAL working on a tourism project in connection with his studies at University College Nordjylland. The project involves establishing tourist routes for both Danish and American travelers to follow as they retrace the routes of their ancestors.

Bendt's American experience was enriched by the generosity of Thorkild Pedersen, a long-time Blair resident and recent Archive volunteer, who took him to The Danish Immigrant Museum in Elk Horn, Iowa; the Mormon Cemetery and Museum in Omaha; the Western Heritage Museum in Omaha; the Bertrand Museum and Desoto Wildlife Center; Fort Atkinson; the Interstate 80 Arch and Museum near Kearney, and to Dannebrog. They also spent time on the Missouri River.

Added Shelving Provides Space for New Collections

The addition of a new range of shelves consisting of four sections of double-faced shelves has recently been installed in the Nielsen Room. This necessitated moving all holdings in order to place new collections into their proper location and make additions to existing collections. Bob Krogh who handled the moving and reshelving of all the boxes concluded that the UELC pastors preached some "mighty weighty sermons!"

Bob has also affixed the stamps on the 800 plus envelopes of previous mailings. The stamps used are acquired at a discount from Boys' Town through the efforts of John Beck. The Archive is indebted to both men.

Nielsen and the impressive work of The Archive by the sculptor Mogens Kiehn. This wooden base replaces a skirted table. Larsen donated not only his time and labor but also paid for all materials.

Hennicks Attends Solvang Farstrup-Mortensen Lectures

Jill Hennick and her husband Michael represented the DAAL at the Farstrup-Mortensen Lecture in Solvang the weekend of February 26-28. Not only did they attend the lectures but they were able to meet many other Danes and experience some of the spirit of the Danish folk movement.

Initial Organization of Music Collection Takes Place

The DAAL through the years has acquired an impressive collection of Danish music – secular and religious. Much of it is in Danish; other works consist of performances by Danish artists. The collection comprises both books and recordings. The collection was significantly expanded when The Danish Immigrant Museum, The Archive at Grandview University, and The Danish American Heritage Society made DAAL the official repository of all music received.

To meet the needs of housing these extensive holdings, The DAAL was fortunate to have a room assigned to it for that purpose. Now Sandra Wigdahl and Tim Jensen have begun the initial sorting and organizing of this music. Efforts are underway to locate someone with a knowledge of Danish as well as musicology to assist with this important task.

New DAAL Brochure To Be Released

Plans to release a new DAAL brochure this summer are underway. This new brochure will be more visual than verbal. It has been designed by one of DAAL's workstudy students, Belinda Wolverton from Pilger, Nebraska. Belinda is a sophomore graphic arts major at Dana. It is hoped that many DAAL supporters will request five or more brochures to distribute to friends and family thereby introducing The Archive to more people.

Norwegian Royal Consul and Brother Visit Archives

Jens Olesen, the current Norwegian Royal Consul General in Sao Paula, Brazil, did family research in The Danish American Archive and Library in Blair, Nebraska, in early February. He was accompanied by his brother, Lars, who lives in Copenhagen. Both men are Danish and visited DAAL on their way to the Winter Olympics.

These men are grandsons of Roger Nielsen who edited *Den Danske Pioneer* early in the twentieth century when the paper was published in Omaha. Their mother Rita Nielsen was born in Omaha. Later the family returned to Denmark. They were especially interested in the complete collection of *Den Danske Pioneer* from their grandfather's era.

Researcher Spends Several Days Using Archive's UELC Material

Maria Erling, a professor from Gettysburg Seminary in Pennsylvania, spent several days researching the Archive's UELC material pertaining to the founding and development of the Oaks Indian Mission in Oaks, Oklahoma. This mission was started by the Moravians, but when they abandoned it in the late nineteenth century, the work was resumed by N.S. Nielsen and subsequently taken over by the United Danish Evangelical Lutheran Church.

Maria, the daughter of Dr. Bernhard Erling of Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter, Minnesota, is the granddaughter of former Dana College President Lawrence Siersbeck. Maria's mother, Marilyn Siersbeck as a girl and her twin sister Mildred presented flowers to Queen Ingrid when as Crown Princess she visited Dana in the 1930s with her husband, the future King Frederick IX of Denmark.

Professor Erling expects to do further research at the DAAL sometime in the future.

Collection Now Accessible By Either Subject or Donor

As a result of the efforts of John W. Nielsen and Jill Hennick all of the various Archive collections are now accessible to users by either the name of the subject or that of the donor. The subject listing is not limited to the name of a person but includes such topics as Danish Baptists and the Rescue of the Danish Jews.
