MASTER OF ARTS PRACTICUM + DAAL'S PRIMARY MATERIALS + THE INTERNET = ONLINE EXHIBIT

Researchers and scholars are always on the hunt for primary materials—original documents that contain first-hand information about a topic. This is exactly the type of information available at the DAAL, and that fact resulted in a wonderful and interesting online exhibit about a 1942 tour by a troupe of student actors from Dana College who performed selected scenes from the drama *Ordet (The Word)* by Kaj Munk in the original Danish.

Danish-born Catrine Kyster Giery was originally planning to come to Blair to work at the DAAL for the practicum part of her Master of Arts Program at American Public University. But as with so many other plans in 2020, the COVID-19 pandemic made it impossible. That's when she began her practicum remotely with help from Executive Director Jill Hennick.

"Having access to the material online enabled me to do my practicum, which was the final class of my master's degree in public history," Catrine explained. "What was required for the class was 160 hours of on-site work. That requirement was waived due to the pandemic, but we were still required to work closely with an institution in the field and work on a hands-on project. The primary source material that I was able to access from the DAAL functioned in two ways – it provided information that helped me understand and put into context the 1942 Dana theater troupe tour and it also provided pictures and documents to put online that would help make the story and website/exhibit interesting for the viewers. We were able to promote the online exhibit in both the U.S. and Denmark, and to date, the website/exhibit has had 584 visitors."

The experience was a positive one for the DAAL as well, according to Jill Hennick, who described Catrine as a self-starter and very focused. "She came up with the dates, proposal, and responsibilities that she had already worked through with Tim Jensen (her internship supervisor). I played a more active part in this internship, because I was the one physically located at the archive, while Catrine and Tim were at their homes."

Jill went on to say that because of Catrine's interest in WWII and the fact that Tim and Sharon Jensen had recently immersed themselves in processing the Paul Nyholm collection*, they suggested the tour as a subject. Catrine immediately thought it would work well as an online exhibit.

To facilitate the research, the DAAL gave Catrine a link and password to access our internal scanned document database. Therefore, she was able to work in her own section of the computer program and copy documents that she wanted to work with.

"By checking our library catalog, Tim and Sharon were able to point me to folders in the Nyholm and other collections that would supplement the story," Jill said. "I did scans of the entire folders, so Catrine could page through a large volume of material. Then, when she found a photo she wanted to use in the website, it was scanned individually at a higher resolution that gave more detail.

"After the first draft of her online exhibit was complete, Tim, Sharon and I were able to review it, ask questions and make suggestions remotely. The final version exceeded our expectations. We were delighted to see the history the DAAL works so hard to preserve come alive!"

About her overall experience working with the DAAL remotely and the primary materials she was able to access, Catrine had this to say:

"In general, I LOVE the fact that so much historical material has been digitized, by the DAAL and other archives and museums, so that no matter where I am in the world, I can access primary source material that I'm interested in. On a regular basis, I use material from both U.S. and Danish archives. I have used such primary source material for the DAAL online exhibition as well as for student research papers and online projects and for research and inspiration for historical fiction stories. Primary source material is unique in the way that it provides insight into how things were – what people thought at the time – and I also find it very inspirational to see old photos and read old newspapers, letters, diaries, leaflets, etc. I hope the DAAL as well as other archives will continue to digitize lots of their material."

FROM THE DANA ROOM

The Story of *Hail Dana* by Ann (Harms) George

This article is based on one in the Fall 2005 Dana Review, the college's alumni magazine, by the same writer. "A need has long been felt by the students and friends of Dana for a college song, one in which is embodied the ideals of our college and which could be used at all of our activities. . . ." Hermes, Feb. 1926

With this introduction the campus newspaper announced a competition for an official school song. The prize, awarded by the student government, was \$10. The following April (the deadline was April 15), the Hermes announced that Max [Magnus] Christensen had written the winning entry.

Christensen, a student from Moorhead, Iowa, wrote his three stanzas to be sung to the melody of "America the Beautiful." Then approximately a year later, in March 1927, the *Hermes* reported that Prof. Waldo B. Nielsen – who directed the Dana Choir and was a member of the music faculty – "had written a splendid melody" for Christensen's "expressive stanzas."

Alumni were introduced to the words and music with a handout at Homecoming that spring (Homecomings at the time were held during the second semester), and an article summarizing Homecoming weekend activities, in the same March 1927 issue of the Hermes, reported that "All joined enthusiastically in singing the school song." This is what they sang:

While yet our land was wilderness And sturdy pilgrim reared With brawny arm his lowly home, A flower divine appeared: O hail, fair Dana, hail to thee! Our song to thee we sing; May always we thy name revere While truth to us be dear. To all who would thy truths embrace, Thy message true impart;
Be thou their guiding star throughout,
To manhood mold each heart.
O hail, fair Dana, hail to thee!
Thy children guide aright;
May they in faith and hope and love
Praise Him who dwells above.

And when we launch our little barks
On Destiny's deep sea,
As ivies to thy walls do cling,
Our hearts will cling to thee!
O hail, fair Dana, hail to thee!
Though time thy walls may claim,
Thy spirit live, another throng
Rise up and sing our song.

But there's more to the story of Hail Dana.

Campus visitors have admired it. William Christensen (not related to Magnus) records the comments of one of them in his *Saga of the Tower*, the 75-year history of Dana and Trinity Seminary. He notes that in 1947 a visiting lecturer, Henry Goddard Leach, former editor of *Forum* and *Century* magazines and president emeritus of The American-Scandinavian Foundation, "commented on the beauty of the Dana song." Summarizing the visitor's remarks, Christensen writes that Leach considered *Hail Dana* "one of the finest college songs he had heard and that it captured the very spirit of Dana."

In 1948, the alumni news section in *The Alumni Quarterly*, a predecessor of the *Dana Review*, acquired a new name, one that was used in all future *Reviews*: "Destiny's Deep Sea," from the second line of the last stanza.

The college recognized Christensen and Nielsen in 1963 for their *Hail Dana* and gave them Distinguished Service Awards. (Christensen lived in Denver, Colorado, and Nielsen in Denmark.)

In 1982, when Alumni Memorial Auditorium, which was built in 1928, was razed to make way for the Madsen Fine Arts Center, a copy of the 1927 Homecoming song sheet handout was found in the

cornerstone. The Dana Review, which reported the find, included Magnus Christensen's recollection of the competition.



EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT



Executive Director Jill Hennick

Because of the pandemic, we attempted to have our annual meeting solely by ballot of voting members (those who had given time, money or materials since January 2019). However, we did not receive the required 80% back. Therefore, we held a small meeting with only 9 members who had been named as proxies. When we added our proxies, the attendance rose from 9 to 76...which not only met our quorum, but was probably the largest attendance for an annual meeting yet! We've increased our use of technology for meetings, education and research.

While the Catrine Giery's online exhibit was viewable at the end of her practicum, other products of research or internships sometimes take longer. We were pleased to see two articles in the current issue of *The Bridge* resulting from time spent at the Archive. In August 2019, Ryan Gesme, a PhD candidate from the University of Tennessee –Knoxville, researched here. He was a recipient of a Bodtker Grant given by the Danish American Heritage Society to help cover some of his research expenses. His article is entitled, "From the Eider River to the Great Plains: The Danish American Community and the 1920 Slesvig Plebisites." An article by Chantal Powell, a spring 2019 UNO intern, is entitled "My Life as a Danish American Archive

and Library Intern."

Since we closed to the public in March 2020. Library Director Michael Hennick and I have continued to work in person. Some of our projects include:

- Working on the family files. Those are collections that have a limited amount of information and don't require an entire archive box. We evaluate the contents for duplicates and proper location; we enter information about them in both our online catalog and in our internal database; and finally digitize the contents.
- Rearranging books and boxes. We shifted all of the books on the library side to make room for more books. We have begun shifting all of the archive boxes to integrate new boxes alphabetically.
- Creating the vintage postcard exhibit in our display cases.
- Working on research requests (which have not slowed down).
- Processing materials and donations.
- **Helping volunteers working from home**. For example, we have produced two newsletters (well, three, including this one) with editor Sandra Wigdahl and correspondent Ann George working from home.
- Mailing books: the COVID-19 sale advertised in the spring *Jottings* and the pre-Christmas sale advertised in the fall Jottings reduced our book inventory by nearly 200 books!

Happy 10th Anniversary to the Archive! October 2010 we held our first volunteer week in this building. At that time it was so empty that people brought their own card tables and worked on the floor. How things have changed! New developments include:

- New electronic records search tool (library catalog) independent and available directly from our own website. We hope to create a joint cataloguing system with the Danish Immigrant Archives At Grand View University and the Museum of Danish America sometime in the future.
- New branding with and updated website, logo, and a fun new tagline, "We never met a document we didn't like." We have made it to our 10th anniversary financially strong.

The best news is our endowment topped \$300,000 in July,



which means we rebuilt all the money we lost when Dana College closed more than 10 years ago!

Our endowment fund has remained stable throughout the pandemic. In addition, we own our own building, so we are in an even better fiscal position than ten years ago. We have made a point of keeping enough funds liquid, so if a crisis like the closing of Dana College should occur in the future, we have a cushion of time to deal with it.

Thank you for your generous response to our year-end fundraising letter which enabled us to receive all the pledged matching funds. If you ever want to set up a challenge match, please let me know. We can publicize it or keep it anonymous according to your wishes.

We never know what the future will bring. We have lost a number of our special volunteers and donors this year. But because we are in a strong financial position, the board will always have time to adapt and change spending if necessary - there is no danger of closing overnight! Thanks to all who support the DAAL through donations and volunteer time. We are stronger than ever and well positioned to face the future because of all of you.

IN THE STACKS

Christian Tranberg and the Battle for a Long Life


On February 22, 1934, Christian C. Tranberg died at the age of one hundred. He had endured a life full of hardships that would have caused most others to die young, and yet Tranberg believed that had his life been easier he would not have reached one hundred.

He was born in a small village near Ribe, Denmark, to a poor farm family in 1833. The three years of schooling he would receive required a four-mile walk each way three times a week. This would be the only formal education he ever received. By thirteen he was essentially on his own. He got a job as a swineherd which required the watching of some one hundred pigs at all hours, in all weathers, out in the woods and fields of North Slesvig. With no proper coat or shoes Christian recalled suffering mightily during the winters. Later he would work as a hired hand for various other farmers, and somehow find time to study for his confirmation in the church.

In 1856 he was called to do his military service in the Danish infantry. Later he would be called back into the military, but this time in the Navy where he served as a marine aboard the frigate "Jylland."

It was on board this vessel that he participated in the Battle of Heligoland on May 9, 1864. This was a fierce four-hour sea fight pitting the Danes against the Prussians and Austrians who were forced to withdraw. The cannon at which Tranberg was stationed lost three of its twelve man crew, though he himself was uninjured. He later admitted that his chances of reaching the age of one hundred were not bright that day. He left military service later that year with a medal for gallantry and a small pension. A tall ship model of the "Jylland," once held by Dana College, is now displayed at the DAAL.

Christian married Helena Lund in 1868 and settled down to farming and the raising of five children. Three of these children

immigrated to America and the rest of the family followed them in 1893. Tranberg was sixty. They settled on a farm near Kennard, Nebraska. Sadly, he was destined to outlive two wives; Helena died in 1914 and Hansine, whom he had married two years after Helena's death, died in 1920.

On Sunday, February 10, 1929 at First Lutheran Church in Blair, Nebraska, Trandberg was part of a ceremony in which the ninety-six year old veteran received the Danish Cross from King Christian X. He was now a "Dannebrogsmand." This "Man of Dannebrog" (the Danish flag) went to live with one of his daughters in Iowa for his final days where he lived to celebrate his centenary party with the extended family. He had survived toil, exposure, and battle; he had endured the challenges of farming, family and immigration. He is buried in the Blair Cemetery. Christian Tranberg is just one of the many examples in the DAAL Family Files of the strength and courage of our ancestors.

He said he'd been influenced by the lyrics of an earlier school song that Prof. Nellie Falk – a member of the English department – had written, titled "Hail Dana," [sung to "Auld Lang Syne] and that her first line, "Hail, hail to thee, fair Dana, hail!" had "greatly appealed" to him, and she gave him permission to use it

Then in early 1985 Christensen wrote a letter to Dana. The 90-year-old said that after he'd again looked over the photocopy of the cornerstone song sheet Dana had sent him, "I discovered the words to which I object and wish to have eliminated. . . ." The words

that disturbed him were "To manhood mold each heart," the fourth line of the second stanza. He explained, "This was a grave error for which I take full responsibility. . . . I tell you truly when I inform you that the passage. . . has caused me a great deal of discomfort and also loss of sleep."

Christensen suggested that the line be changed to "To virtue lead each heart." His suggestion was adopted and the change announced in the *Dana Review*. (It took several years, however, before alumni no longer stumbled over the line.)

That completes the story of *Hail Dana*. But here's a challenge to Dana alumni who are reading this: Before Waldo B. Nielsen composed the music to Magnus Christensen's lyrics, for almost a year *Hail Dana* was sung to America the Beautiful. Try singing it to that tune. . . . Did you get beyond the third or fourth line without reverting to Nielsen's melody? Hard, isn't it? ■
