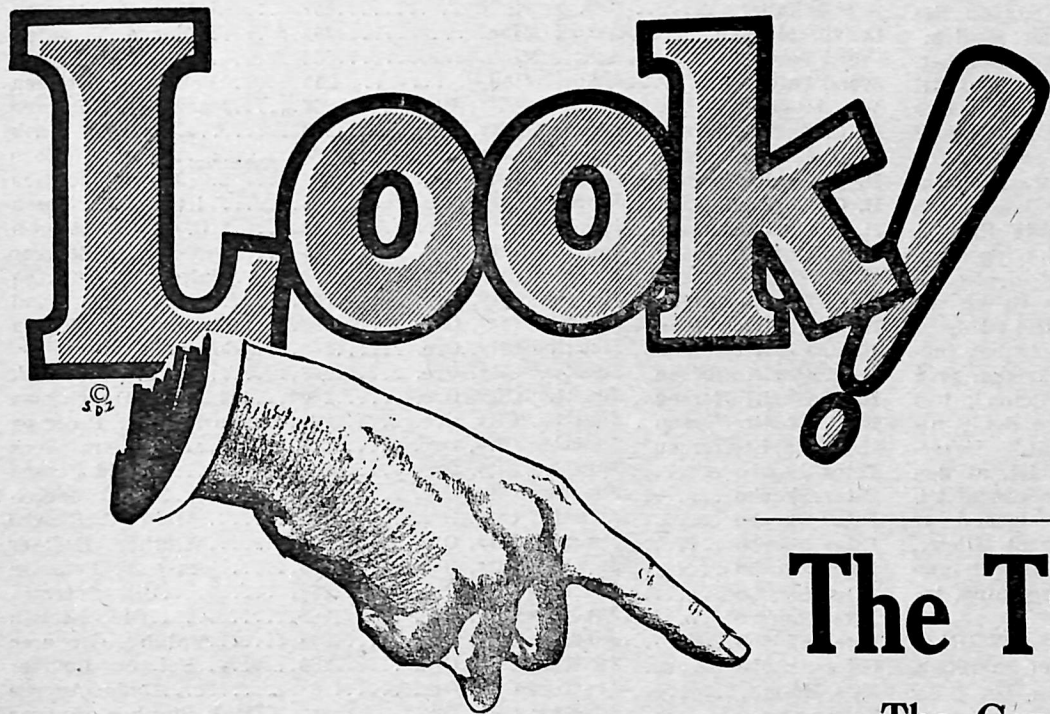

# 1936.

Et kendt Medlem indenfor Samfundet udtalte sig efter Konventionen med, at det forundrede ham, at ikke Delegerterne eller Overbestyrelsen havde taget nogen Bestemmelse i Spørgsmaalet om at faa nye Medlemmer, og henstillede at noget burde gøres i den Retning. Det burde ikke være nogen Hemmelighed, at det er umuligt for nogen enkelt at løse dette Spørgsmaal, og kun hvis vi alle giver en Haandsrækning, vil vi opnaa et Resultat.

Hvad kan der gøres for at faa nye Medlemmer, og hvad kan vi byde dem, naar de bliver optaget i Samfundet? Disse Spørgsmaal bliver ofte bragt paa Tale, og som Svar vil jeg kun henpege til, at omend vi kun havde Assurance, Sygehjælp og Extra Hjælp, saa er disse Ting i sig selv nok at byde vordende Medlemmer. Jeg ved ikke noget Tilfælde, hvor en Mand har tilhørt en Forening som Brodersamfundet, er afgaaet ved Døden og er begravet i Fattigjord, men jeg kender ikke saa faa Tilfælde, hvor en Landsmand er afgaaet ved Døden, og Forholdet har tvunget Familien, Venner eller Bekendte til at lade Hatten gaa rundt og sammentigge nok til at undgaa, at vedkommende blev begravet paa Kommunens Bekostning.

Der siges, det er for dyrt at tilhøre en Forening som Brodersamfundet, men hvor mange af vore Medlemmer, som kun har \$250.00 Assurance, tænker i Grunden over dette Spørgsmaal. Af Erfaring kan jeg oplyse, at vi har mange Medlemmer, som ikke har anden Assurance og Sygehjælp end netop den de har i Brodersamfundet, og en Mand burde slet ikke benævne det som Assurance for Familien, da det ofte ikke engang betaler for Omkostningerne under Sygdommen og Begravelsen. Hvis Manden ikke har noget Begreb om Ordet Assurance for Familien, burde Hustruen drage Omsorg for, at der bliver sat lidt tilside hver Maaned for Beskyttelse af hende og de mindreaarige Børn, istedet for til Gasolin eller andre Ting, som er mindre nødvendige.

Paa Konventionen var Logerne repræsenteret ved Delegaten, og man maa gaa ud fra, at han var den Mand i Logen, som Medlemmerne saa op til som en Leder og derfor blev bærer med dette Tillidshverv. Jeg vil henstille til Broder Svend Petersen, som af Overbestyrelsen er udnævnt til at

lede Medlems Kontesten i Vinter, at han paalægger Delegaten at lede Kontesten indenfor Logen, og paalægger ham at skaffe saa mange nye Medlemmer, som et saadant Kvota vilde udvise, og holder ham ansvarlig for samme. Æren og Arbejdet burde følges ad, og nu de har været en Tur i Denver, burde de ogsaa være villige til at gøre Arbejde for Pengene, det kostede at sende dem dertil.

En lokal Loge er levende eller død (hvis man kan bruge en saadan Benævnelse) akkurat ligesom Medlemmerne af Logen selv bestemmer det. Medlemmet som aldrig kommer til Møde, burde tage deres Del af Arbejdet i de Aar, de er i Stand dertil, og vi burde ikke vente med at høre fra dem, indtil de naar 64 Aars Alderen. Gaa til Møde en Gang imellem og sig eders Mening om de forskellige Spørgsmaal, som bliver behandlet, og overlad ikke alt Arbejdet til nogle faa Medlemmer i Logen eller til Logens Bestyrelse. Jeg vil henstille til de af vore Medlemmer, som aldrig har indgivet en ny Ansøgning i Logen, prøv at interessere en udenforstaaende i at blive Medlem, og tag ikke det Synspunkt, at „let George do it.“ De senere Aar har tydeligt bevist, at den Beskyttelse, man erhoder ved at tilhøre Det danske Brodersamfund, er vel værd, hvad det koster at tilhøre, og man ved aldrig, hvor haardt man kan trænge til en Haandsrækning, inden man dør.

Efter Præsident Otto Hassert havde aabnet Mødet og Logen gaaet over til Logens Bedste, bad Præsident Hassert, Br. Fører at inklade Br. Ex-præsident H. M. Marker og Følge fra Boston Loge Nr. 87, Boston, Mass. Efter de besøgende Brødre var bleven budt Velkommen og fremstillet for de tilstedeværende Brødre, præsenterede Fører Br. H. M. Da jeg for fire Aar siden var Delegat til Konventionen i Detroit, var jeg med til at vedtage eller modarbejde adskillige Ting i D. B. S. Adskillige af disse Ting har jeg ofte undret mig over siden, om de har haft den mente Virkning for D. B. S. Der er især een Ting, som jeg ofte tænker over, det er med Hensyn til Aldersgrænsen for Optagelse i Samfundet. Den blev der forandret til 16 Aar i Stedet for 18; det var jeg imod derude, og det skulde være mig kært at kunne faa en Smule Oplysning om, hvor mange af disse unge Medlemmer vi har faaet, og om disse samme unge Mænd er en Asset til os.

Hvorfor jeg undrer mig er, at der var Brødre i Detroit, som gav saadanne glimrende Billeder om, hvor stort og godt vort Samfund vilde vokse, dersom vi kunde faa disse unge Mænd ind. Desværre har det modsatte været Tilfældet i de senere Aar, saa vidt jeg kan se paa vort Medlemsantal.

Her er en Anledning for de Loger, som vandt Pokalerne ved den sidste Attendance Contest, til at fortælle os, hvad de gjorde for at faa saadanne vel besøgte Møder, lad os lære fra jer, saaledes at vi ogsaa kan faa en Chance for den næste Contest, for det vilde dog ikke være rigtigt, at I igen skal rende af med Gevindsten.

### DANISH GIRL RECEIVES HIGH DISTINCTION

Honored by Women's Health Federation with 1935 Honor Award.

For the first time in the history of the Women's Health Federation of America, Inc., the Honor Award for 1935 has gone to a Danish young woman. She is Miss Kirsten Thuesen, whose offices are in the Scandinavian American Line building at 27 Whitehall Street, New York City.

Miss Thuesen sometime ago secured the sole importing rights for America and Canada for Ruga Danocrisp, which in itself was an unusual accomplishment. However, it is one thing to become the importer of a food product, and another thing to find a market in the keen and crowded American field of food products. Others had tried and failed. Miss Thuesen was determined to find a place for such an excellent product as Danocrisp, and she was determined likewise, that it would find its place not only among the Danish people in America who knew its goodness, but among American families who would appreciate this excellent rye-crisp.

Countess Cleo de Czerny, Chairman of the Honor Award Committee, in bestowing the Honor Award for 1935 on Miss Thuesen said: "It is women like yourself that America needs. Women who are entering into the business of bringing out good food products which have a health-value".

"Our women at one time were confined to the kitchen where they prepared the meal which made sturdy sons and daughters. Now they have gone out beyond the kitchen and through their help the manufacturer is able to bring genuine food products on the market which serve the health of the entire family. You are one of these women, Miss Thuesen, and we desire to bestow this highest honor upon you for your achievement in successfully introducing this wholesome Danish rye-crisp into American homes."

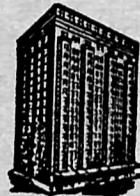
