United States Revenue Tax \$5.00, or Head Tax of Non-Citizens of United States of \$8.00 is not included above.

The above low rates were made possible, by the Supreme Board signing a contract with the Gdynia America Line, on the above mentioned date.

### Railroad Rates

At this early date it is not possible to give the exact cost of round-trip tickets on the railroads in the United States, but such rates together with the cost of sleepers will be available later.

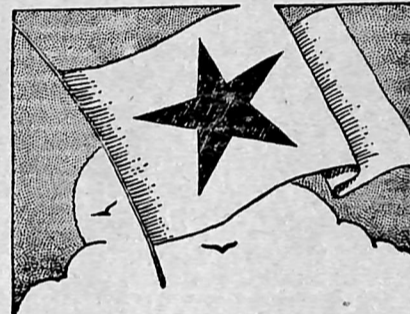

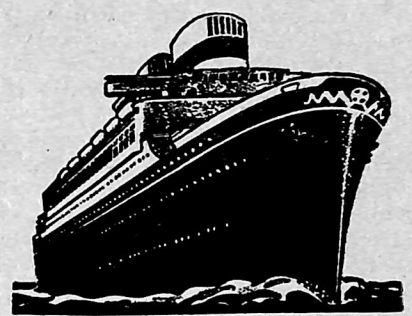

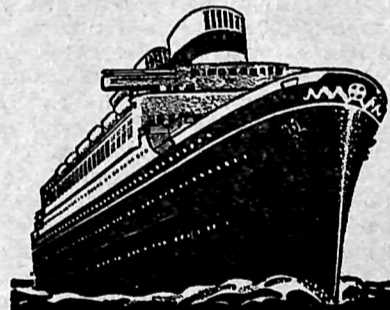

## Supreme Board Decisions

A letter was received from Perth Amboy lodge asking permission to use a certain song for the initiation of candidates in the English language.

**Nelson:** It seems to me it is quite important that our initiation ceremonies be uniform in all the lodges. For that reason I am not in favor of granting this request.

The submitted song gives expression to very fine sentiments, but I do think we might find others better suited to our purpose. For one thing, I feel that our songs should be written in simple words, easy to commit to memory, and the opening and closing songs should consist of only one verse or stanza. The length of the song for initiation should be fitted to the time required to reach the station of the proper officer.

**Hansen, John:** This, in my opinion, is a question that only a convention can settle. As I see it, it involves a change in the constitution.

**Lawson:** According to our ritual we use two songs during initiation and it would therefore be improper to adopt the one submitted. I would suggest we invite our members to participate in a contest and submit four new songs, in English, to be used at our meetings when they are conducted in English, and that \$25 be appropriated as prizes for the best four submitted and adopted. Rules of contest to be formulated by the board and songs submitted to the board not later than March 1, 1937, so we can take action at our spring meeting.

**Rasmussen:** If Lodge No. 46 like to use Brother Enemark's song for initiation of candidates in the English language, I shall gladly give my permission.

**Christensen:** The song that Lodge No. 46 asked permission to use is being used in other lodges at the present time. I'll recommend that we allow them to use the song.

**Petersen:** The proposed song has my approval.

**DECISION:** Inasmuch as there has been made the suggestion that we offer a \$25.00 prize for songs for our ritual, I should like to have the board consider that suggestion before rendering final decision.

I will ask our supreme secretary to submit this question to the board.  
N. B. NELSON, Supreme Pres.

**Note:** I am holding back this matter for our spring meeting.

F. V. L.

Inquiry was received from Lodge No. 35, Chicago, if the lodge would be permitted to accept social members, who would not belong to the insurance or sick benefit and therefore not have any claim on such funds. The lodge was of the opinion that admission of such members would be of benefit to the lodge and the brotherhood.

**Nelson:** This question has been considered by our convention and was voted down so the board could not give its sanction.

**Hansen, John:** This request is against our by-laws. See Sec. 47, Par. 1 which states; that all members between the ages of 16 and 50 years must take out insurance. This same question has been voted down repeatedly by the delegates at conventions.

**Lawson:** I do not believe our present laws permit a local lodge to take in social members in the lodge and consider such members of the lodge only and not members of the Danish Brotherhood generally.

I believe the proper way to handle this matter would be for Lodge No.

35 to prepare the necessary paragraphs covering their proposal and in due course present same for action for our 1939 convention.

**Rasmussen:** We have in our Constitution rules for social members, se Afdeling 5 pg. 66—67—68—69 Danish copi. Therefore I can not give my opinion any different than the rules gives a right to, namely in pg. 66—67.

**Christensen:** If the proposed social members that Lodge No. 35 proposes to take into their lodge have reached the age limit, as called for in our constitution and by-laws, then they do not need any decision from us.

However, if they intend to take in members not covered by the paragraphs in our by-laws, I fail to see how we can give a decision. This must be for our convention to decide.

**Petersen:** The by-laws of our society require that applicants for membership, between the ages of 16 and 50 years inclusive, must subscribe to at least \$125.00 insurance. This can not be deviated from and hence the request of No. 35 can not be granted. Incidentally \$125 can not really be considered as insurance but rather as a financial benefit in case of death.

**Hansen, Viggo C.:** Our constitution does not permit the creation of the proposed form of membership.

**Nelson:** Inasmuch as this would involve a change of our constitution and as such a change has already been voted down by our national convention the board does not have the power to grant permission to accepting such social members.

N. B. NELSON, Supreme Pres.

The question of blanket bond for local lodge officers, which was submitted to the board some time ago by the General Committee of Wisconsin and Upper Michigan Lodges, had been taken up by our supreme secretary with Brothers H. H. Vogt, Davenport, and Christian Nielsen, Chicago. Brother Vogt writes that he is serv-

icing 31 lodges in the amount of \$31,675.00 at a yearly cost of \$239.08. Our supreme officers' bond for \$50,000.00 costs \$247.50, therefore, the total cost for the above amount is \$486.58 or within \$113.42 of the total cost for the \$200,000.00 bond. How much the remaining lodges pay for their bonds, we, of course, don't know, but there is no doubt that it is a great deal more than \$113.42.

Brother Nielsen writes that he has taken the matter up with several companies and he is able to offer a rate of \$3.20 per \$1000.00 with a minimum premium of \$3.20 per lodge.

In order to get this rate, it would require \$200,000.00 of insurance, with the intention of writing the local lodges on a position form of bond and the supreme officers on the present form, but at the new rate of \$3.20.

The present minimum premium for the local lodge is \$7.20 so that a substantial saving would be made on the group plan, and the supreme lodge would also be covered as respects any default on the part of the local officers.

**Nelson:** I should like to see a saving made on bond premiums, but inasmuch as our last effort failed on account of it not meeting with the support of the lodges, I have little hope that we could succeed now. However, we should consider the matter at our spring meeting, which, if any action is taken still would be in time for the 1938 bonds. I feel it is too late for the 1937 bonds.

**Lawson:** No doubt a substantial savings in bond premiums could be made if we could get at least \$200,000.00 insurance on local officers and supreme officers, but in accordance with our laws we have no way of forcing the local lodges to take out a schedule bond.

I am therefore of the opinion that there is nothing special we can do in the matter until the convention passes a law making it obligatory that all bonds of the local lodges as well as the supreme officers bonds shall be issued under one schedule bond.

**Rasmussen:** If we have to get \$200,-

000.00 insurance, so we can receive the benefit of a cheaper rate, I can figure out that it can not be done. Brother Vogt has only 31 lodges, the amount \$31,676.00 together with the supreme officers bonds of \$50,000.00 is only \$81,676.00, we can see that most of the lodges take care of their own bonds.

**Christensen:** I'll recommend that the question of a blanket bond be laid on the table and discussed at our spring meeting as our bonds are taken out for a full year.

**Petersen:** I believe a letter should be addressed to each lodge secretary at the earliest possible date calling attention to the financial advantages of the \$200,000.00 blanket bond wherein the position is bonded rather than the person. If it is made clear to each lodge, then I am quite sure there will be sufficient bonds wanted to warrant taking out the 200,000 policy.

If the individual lodges do not respond to such a letter then it seems there is nothing to do more than to continue as at present.

**Hansen, Viggo:** If there is reason to believe, that a substantial saving can be made, I propose that the information available prepared for presentation to all lodges and mailed to same with request for their opinion and, if interested, the amount wanted.

Question to be resubmitted for decisions based upon returns.

**DECISION:** That final decision be taken on this question at our spring meeting.
