Funeral services will be at 11 a.m. Monday at the N.P. Swanson Mortuary for Eyvind M. Neble, retired publisher of the Danish Pioneer weekly newspaper in Omaha.

Mr. Neble, 74, who lived at 5005 Blondo Street, became ill Wednesday and died Thursday at a local hospital of a blood clot.

Born in Omaha in 1890, he established a livestock farm at Springfield, Neb., in 1912 that was considered a rural showplace. Later he joined his father, Sophus F. Neble, a native of Denmark, in publishing the newspaper in Omaha. He took over as publisher on the death of his father in 1931, continuing in that position until retirement in 1955. The newspaper, now published in Chicago, is the country's oldest and largest Danish-American newspaper.


