

Rev. Marius Jorgensen Died Sunday, Oct. 15

Rev. Marius Jorgensen died Sunday, October 15th at the age of 75.

He was born on June 18, 1892 in Aarhus, Denmark to Mr. and Mrs. Marie Jorgensen and was baptized in the Christian Faith. In 1913 he came to the United States. He attended High School in Kenmare, North Dakota and received his B.A. degree from Augsburg College; B.D. from Northwestern Seminary at Minneapolis and M.S. Th. from Union Seminary at New York City. In 1924 he was ordained in the Ministry of the United Evangelical church. The same year he was united in marriage to Martha Rasmussen in Minneapolis.

He served in the U.S. Army during World War I. Lutheran ved were at Northfield, Minnesota congregations which he has served, Falmouth, Maine, Brooklyn, New York, Brush, Colorado, Alta, Canada, Scranton and Coon Rapids, Iowa. Hampton, Nebraska, Clinton, Wisconsin and also as Canada District President on the Pension Board.

Pastor Jorgensen and his wife retired in Blair in 1963. He continued to serve as an interim pastor until his recent illness.

Survivors besides his wife Martha are two daughters Mrs. John Bohannon (Grace) of Topeka, Kan. Mrs. A. Rasmussen (Audrey) and a son Rev. Philip Jorgensen both of Edmonton, Alberta, Canada. Also nine grandchildren and a brother Thorald of Aarhus, Denmark.
