

## ELDON JONES, 52 DIES AFTER LONG ILLNESS

Mr. Eldon L. Jones died October 23rd at the Blair Memorial Community Hospital where he has been confined since June. He was 52 years old.

Mr. Jones was born to Mr. and Mrs. Clarence Jones at Industry, Kansas on July 4, 1915. He was a driver for the Denver-Chicago Trucking Company for many years but for the past 21 years has been employed as a diesel mechanic at the Navajo Freight Lines in Omaha.
