The deceased was born May 23, 1903 in Washington county. He grew to manhood on a farm and remained to make farming his life's work.

Mr. Roberts is a grandson of W. W. Wilkinson of Blair and Mrs. Roberts is a niece of Marjorie Metzinger, also of Blair.

Mr. Roberts, driving a rented car collided with the rear of a semi-trailer driven by Thomas S. Akins of 720 Park Avenue, Omaha.

Mr. Roberts was a former news director and a reporter for KMTV. He joined Mr. Cunningham's staff in December, 1963. Prior to his associations with KMTV he had been in the United States Air Force.

He is survived by a wife and four children.

He was married to Miss Minnie Jensen on December 26, 1926 and the couple made their home on the farm west of Rose Hill which was still their home when he died. They had lived there more than 40 years.

In addition to being a good and successful farmer, he took an active interest in a number of community affairs. He had served as a member of the Rose Hill school board and was a member of First Methodist Church of Blair.

He is survived by his wife Minnie Marie, and by a son, Robert LeRoy of Omaha and by a daughter Mrs. Allen George (Marlene) of Omaha. A grandchild, Melinda is also among the survivors.

He has three surviving sisters and three brothers. The sisters are Miss Viola Kuhr of Chicago, Illinois, Mrs. Gustav (Amanda) Kahnk, of Kennard and Mrs. Raymond (Opal) Ruwe of Blair. The brothers are Raymond Kuhr, of Kennard, and Lloyd and LeRoy Kuhr, both of Blair.
