Mrs. Dean Sapp Victim Of Heart Attack During Sleep

Mrs. Dean Sapp, wife of a well known Blair business man, died early Thursday morning, an apparent victim of a heart attack. The tragedy was discovered shortly before seven o'clock Thursday morning. The Blair Rescue Squad was called and she was rushed to Memorial Community Hospital but treatment was to no avail.

Mrs. Sapp, the mother of three children, had been a resident of Blair for the past four years since the family moved here to establish the Sapp Bros. Ford Center at the south edge of Blair. She had, reportedly, been in poor health for some time.

Eleanora A. Sapp, was 33 years of age at the time of her death. She was born September 1st, 1934 at Hanover, Kansas, the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. August Wollenberg of Hollenberg. Both parents survive their daughter.

Mrs. Sapp had devoted her energies, since coming to Blair, to being a housewife and mother and she had an active interest in the 4-H Club work and the affairs in which her children were interested.

She was active in the Sunday School of the First Lutheran Church where she was a Sunday School teacher and an assistant in many ways. She also was a member of the Order of Eastern Star and the Auxiliary of the Fraternal Order of Eagles.
