

ELZY C. TRIPLETT BURIED AT HERMAN TUESDAY MORNING

Funeral services for Elzy C. Triplett, of Herman, were held Tuesday morning, August 12th, following his death on Friday, August 8th. *PT 8-12-69*

The deceased was born at Herman, August 31, 1884 and spent his entire life in the Herman area. As a younger man he was a farmer.

At the time of his death he was a resident of the Good Shepherd Home at Blair and his death took place there. He was 84 years, 11 months, 23 days old at the time of his death.

He was preceded in death by his parents and by five brothers and three sisters. He is survived by a sister-in-law, Mary Triplett, of Herman and by a brother-in-law, Wilbur Phypher, of Fontana, California. Several nieces and nephews, some of whom live in the Blair and Herman area, also survive.

Burial services were held at the Herman Baptist Church Tuesday, August 12th with the Rev. Z. A. Kleinsasser conducting the service. Burial, under the direction of the Bendorf Funeral Home of Blair

was made in the Herman Cemetery.

JOHN AUTZEN BURIED IN FT. CALHOUN

Mr. John Autzen of Blair, died August 13th at the Blair Community Hospital after a lingering illness. He was 77 years of age.

He was born April 1, 1892 at Silberstedt, Germany and came to the United States at the age of 16. On February 5, 1919 he was married to Emma Schmidt and they were the parents of two daughters, Mrs. Margaret Van Dusen and Mrs. Mildred Jensen of Omaha. Mrs. Autzen died in 1937.

On June 2, 1942, Mr. Autzen was married to Shirley Deifenbaugh who survives her husband. Other survivors besides his wife and two daughters are five step children: Lois Kieborz of Ventura, California; Fern Krause of Omaha; Margaret Martin of Oakview, California; Dale Deifenbaugh of Ft. Calhoun and Don Deifenbaugh of Lakeside, Oregon; 16 grandchildren, 6 great grandchildren and five brothers and four sisters in Germany. A brother, Thomas Autzen of Omaha died last December.

Mr. Autzen farmed near Ft. Calhoun, and Orum before retiring and moving to Blair in 1960.

Funeral services were held in the Ft. Calhoun Presbyterian Church at 2 P.M. on Saturday, August 16th. The Rev. Keith Sackett officiated. Burial was in the Ft. Calhoun Cemetery with the Sievers Mortuary in charge.

BLAIR MAN, 44, DIED SUDDENLY EARLY THURSDAY

Marion Paul Everhart, well known Blair man, succumbed to a heart attack early Thursday morning, August 7th. The Blair Rescue Squad was called to transport him to the hospital at Blair, but he died before aid could reach him. He was 44 years old.

He was born at Elgin, Nebraska, November 17, 1924. As a young boy he moved with his family to Orchard, Nebraska and came to Blair to make his home about 20 years ago. Since living in Blair he has been employed by the Nebraska State Highway Department, working out of the material and equipment yard at Blair.

He served in the United States Navy during World War II. He was married to Katherine Edwards, of Orchard, who survives him.

Also surviving are three sons, Robert, of Norfolk, Va. and Richard of San Francisco, both serving in the Navy; and John Everhart, who lives at Wahoo, Nebraska.

His parents, Mr. and Mrs. John Everhart, of Blair, also survive, as well as two sisters, Mrs. James Williby, of Blair and Mrs. Charles Rouse, of Wahoo, Nebr. There is one granddaughter.

He was a member of the Blair Chapter of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and also the Eagles.

Funeral services are being held this (Monday) morning at the Campbell Mortuary. Father Patrick Nolan is conducting the service and burial is being made in Holy Cross Catholic Cemetery. Military rites will be conferred at the graveside.
