Mr. Henry Kruse, formerly of Ft. Calhoun, died Sunday morning, January 18th at the Good Shepherd Home, where he had resided for the past two years. He was 88 years of age.

He was born January 12, 1882 to Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Kruse near Ft. Calhoun. He was married to Maggie Ohrt, who preceded him in death. Two children died in infancy.

Mr. Kruse farmed in Douglas County until 1924. At that time he and his wife retired and moved to Ft. Calhoun. He served several years on the City Council of Ft. Calhoun and was always very interested in civic affairs.
