J-16-70 Tina Rae Ladd is victim at Korshoj Lumber Co. yards

Rae Ladd, 4 year old Tina daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Ladd of Herman was accidentally killed Thursday morning about 10:30 A.M.

The Ladds live just west of the Korshoj Lumber Company, at Herman, and the child had apparently been playing between two piles of lumber when she bumped against one of the piles which had been stacked just outside the sheddoor. The pile toppled over and one piece struck the little girl on the head.

The sound of falling lumber was heard by Paul Gray, a carpenter, Jerry Method, a tank wagon operator who happened to be in the office, and Frank Korshoj.

They investigated and found the girl pinned under the fallen boards. The Tekamah Rescue Squad was summoned, but the blow on her head had apparently been fatal. She was taken to the Campbell Mortuary in Blair by the rescue squad.

The father, Charles Ladd, is presently serving in Viet Nam and efforts were immediately made to notify him of the tragedy by M. Stanley Jensen of Blair, Red Cross representative of the Service to Military Families.

Tina Rae is survived by her parents and by a younger brother, Renard and by her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Renard Ladd of Blair and Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Colgan, of Herman.

Her father had not been reached in Vietman as of Saturday morning, according to Stanly Jensen, local Red Cross officer who has been trying to make contact.

Funeral services had not been set as the Pilot-Tribune went to press Saturday noon. Tentative arrangements appeared that they would be held some time Tuesday (tomorrow) with Father Daniel Brick of St. Francis Borgia Catholic Church in Blair, in charge. The Campbell Mortuary in Blair will be in charge of interment.
