# Jacobberger, Ex-County Former County Commissioner

Ernest M. Jacobberger died Friday at St. Vincent's Home, where he had lived for three months. He was 94.

Jacobberger was a county commissioner from 1931 to 1939. He ran unsuccessfully for county assessor in 1939.

Born in Alsace Lorraine, France, he came to Omaha with his parents about 1887. He had been a printer at several Omaha firms, including the Douglas Printing Co. and The World-Herald.

He was owner of the Benson Times newspaper until Benson was annexed by Omaha. Later he was part owner of the Eddy Printing Co. and the Inland Press. He formerly lived at 4857 Military Avenue.

Jacobberger is survived by his widow Calista; daughters, Mrs. Melba Hanson of Cherokee, Ia., and Mrs. Cecilia Wisler of Omaha; brothers, Albert of Phoenix, Ariz., and Charles of Los Angeles, Calif., and sister, Mrs. Anna Dohrse of Omaha.

City Council President H. F. Jacobberger is his nephew.
