

W. HENDRICKSEN DIED AT HOSPITAL EARLY FRIDAY

Wendell Hendricksen, a resident of Blair for many years, died at Memorial Community Hospital early Friday following a lingering illness. He had been a resident of Parkview Manor in south Blair. He was 53 years old. *6-21-71*

The deceased was born November 11, 1917 at Royal, Iowa, but came to Blair a number of years ago to make his home. He never married. For years he was a shipping clerk for the Sidles Company in Omaha, but had given up the work because of poor health.
